

Teachers Strike In New York but Schools Operate

NEW YORK, Nov. 7 (UPI)—A teachers' union began a strike against the city's schools today, but the board of education said only about six per cent of the teachers actually did not report for work. A survey by the board indicated 25,500 of the city's 32,000 teachers showed home or parked outside their schools. Student absenteeism was reported at about 11 per cent of the 381,000 enrollment, or only one per cent above normal for a Monday. Although the school year was closed during the morning, a high school in the Bronx with 2,800 students began sending the children home after the lunch hour.

DANGEROUS FRONT MAN

It is an ominous omen that when their internal power seems in danger they raise the specter of aggression from hostile outside forces. Cuba's Fidel Castro has reached the point where he is aware that he has to lean upon us of this country.

With mounting stridency he screams that the United States is about to invade his island country. He has even threatened to launch a nuclear attack against the United States.

In point of truth, Castro appears to be using this violent scare to cloak his real intentions toward the camp of the Soviet Union. 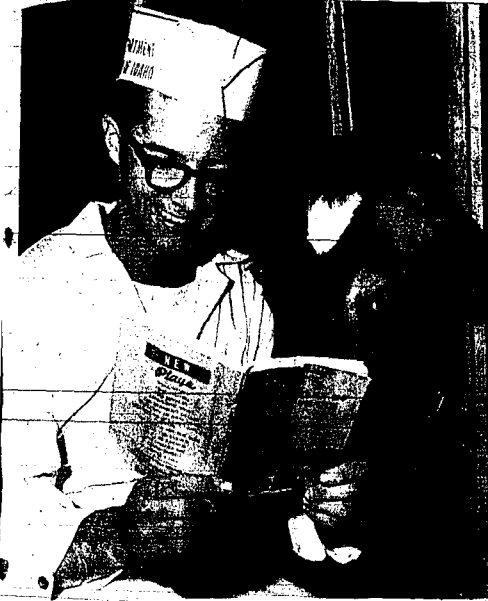
