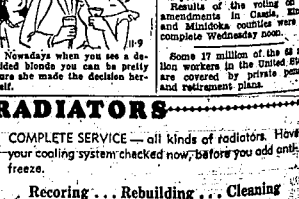

Today Rosellini, who led the polls for the past two weeks, has been projected as the winner of the November 8 election.

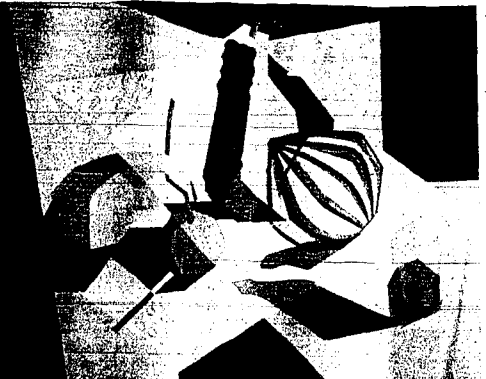



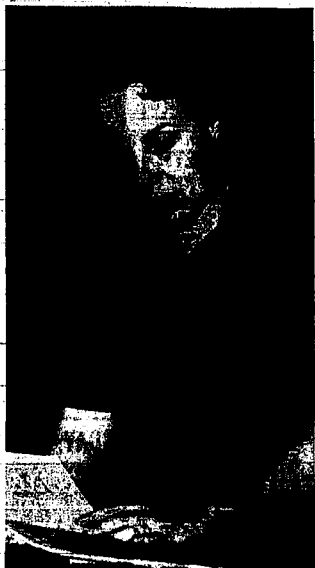

The Democratic candidate amassed a 52,497 vote plurality over Vice President Richard M. Nixon. The Philadelphia vote was nine-tenths enough to give Republican majorities in rural areas and put the state's important 32 electoral votes into Kennedy's column.

The greatest plurality here prior to the election was the 500,000 vote margin by Franklin D. Roosevelt over Alfred M. Landon in 1936.
