REASON, Viet Nam, Nov. 11 (AP)—Paratrooper battalions overthrew President Ngo Dinh Diem today in a brief but bloody before-dawn uprising. The rebels set up a military regime to strengthen the nation's fight against communist infiltration and the rule of the French. They and 40 persons were killed, and many others were wounded in sharp fighting between the rebel battalions and troops loyal to Diem. But by 3 p.m. calm prevailed in the capital. Army units drifted into the city from the north and south, in answer to a call from the president's loyal forces and to force and said it had formed a temporary government.

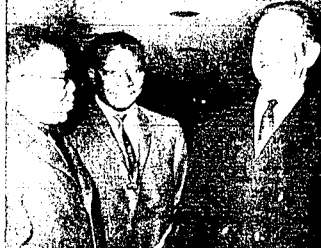

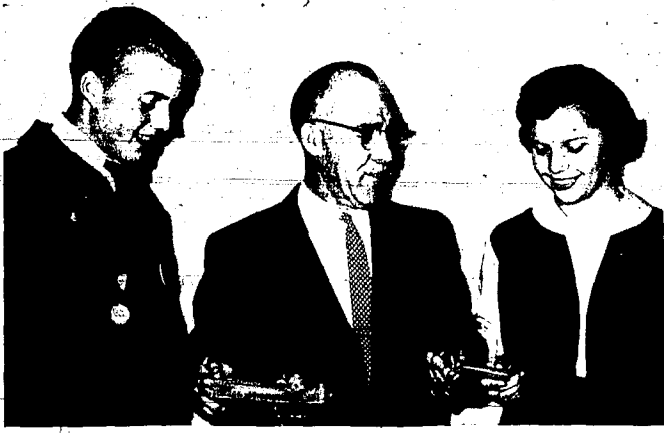
