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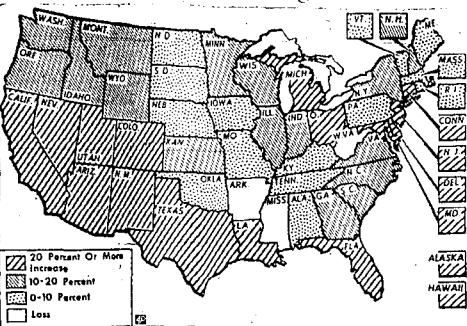
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U.S. Population Changes Shown

Speaker Says Scouting Fights Problem of 'Lack of Purpose'

Boy Scouting combats the "lack of purpose" of the American youth, said a speaker at the annual banquet of the Scout district of the Snake River Boy Scout council Thursday evening at the Lincoln school in Twin Falls.

The speaker was Gen. Philip P. Cavell, director of employee relations for Garrett, Preholland Inc. He played excerpts from a tape-recorded speech given by Dr. Will Mayer, a psychiatrist who studied the behavior of U. S. prisoners in North Korea during the Korean war.

Second, for Christmas gift packages, use one of these wrapping paper, sturdy corrugated cartons, strong cord and paper adhesive tape.

Third, remember you can insure your Christmas cards and letters inside the gift package by adding appropriate "ins" class postage to the package.

Fourth, buy postage stamps now. Don't wait until the last minute when you will be faced with long waiting lines at the stamp window.

The postoffice will supply upon request free leaflets entitled "All for local delivery" and "All for out-of-town delivery." It also will provide a pamphlet which gives full instructions for proper sorting and wrapping of parcels.

Parents, advised to use only first class postage on Christmas cards. Cards sent first class may include personal handwritten messages and also will receive full forwarding and return service.

"Don't fail to put your return address on all Christmas-card envelopes," he warned. "Not only is this socially correct but it helps keep both you and your front porch clean."

He states that cards and gifts for the most distant points should be mailed before Dec. 15. Those for nearby destinations should be sent by Dec. 15 or earlier.

WASHINGTON, Nov. 18 (AP)—The personal income of Americans rose slightly in October to a record rate of \$65 billion dollar.

A decline in the total wages paid factory workers was shown by the Commerce department although record production in the motor industry brought bigger paychecks to auto workers.

This dip was more than offset by small gains in wages and salaries of workers in the retail trade on government payrolls and in the construction industry. As in September, rising unemployment compensation benefits also contributed to the small gain in total income.

The income trend seemed to bear out the expectation of some government economists that the first quarter of the year would bring a leveling-off, or possibly a slight recovery, in the downturn which became evident in September.

Some Washington experts have predicted, however, that any autumn improvement would be only a temporary break in a mild recessionary trend. Others insist they see no clear signs that a recession is in progress or is coming.

BY THE NUMBERS

When a presidential election is as close as this year's, there is a somewhat misleading tendency to judge the results in terms of what the two nominees did not do.

But there are other, more positive ways to look at the 1960 outcome.

During the campaign, for instance, it was widely predicted that Vice President Nixon would fall far short of equalling Mr. Eisenhower's showings.

Still incomplete returns indicate Nixon will indeed miss by possibly two million the Eisenhower total of 25.6 million.

However, canvass of the 1960 figures reveals that Nixon surpassed the Eisenhower totals in 16 of the 48 states.

Nixon's biggest advances over Eisenhower came in Florida, the two Carolinas, Tennessee, Alabama, Missouri, and Louisiana.

As for president-elect Kennedy, who leads Nixon by only a quarter to a third of a million votes overall, he surpassed Adlai Stevenson's 1956 totals in 43 of 48 states.

Only in Oklahoma, where he was down about 18,000, and Mississippi, where he beat Nixon but still lost to an independent sliver, did Kennedy fall short of 1956.

Measured against Nixon, Kennedy gained a whicker's edge, but to do that he had to do more than double his vote in New York, 700,000 in California, 600,000 in Illinois, 540,000 in Massachusetts, 532,000 in Pennsylvania, 523,000 in New Jersey, 323,000 in Michigan, 250,500 in Connecticut, 244,000 in Texas.

And though he lost the following states, he gained 600,000 in Ohio, 250,000 in Florida, 240,000 in Wisconsin, 136,000 in Indiana, 80,000 in Virginia.

These are the specifics by which Kennedy turned a 1956 Eisenhower margin of 8 1/2 million into his own triumph in 1960, winning the vast majority of the country today suffers neither war nor heavy economic distress.

This same canvass shows that Nixon, while no over-all match for Mr. Eisenhower, carried considerable weight in a third of the states actually surpass him.

The fact is that Nixon and Kennedy were two remarkably even battlers.

PLANNING AHEAD

The first question is whether the future of Vice President Nixon. His remarkably strong showing in the popular vote leaves him still a figure of prominence in his party.

What new face they might accept is the other great question.

IRS said it is looking into allegations that churches, other religious organizations, and individual clergymen who reportedly received and distributed money to pressure the election of House Speaker W. W. Wherry.

The agency declined to name those under investigation. Neither would it disclose the source of the complaints.

Asked how many complaints had been filed, an official said "the number was normal under the existing conditions." He declined to elaborate.

IRS said the complaints have been confined to the agency's field offices for checking the agency's field manager. Field officers will determine whether the churches are involved in tax-exempt organizations and whether these groups jeopardize the status of the churches in political activity.

WASHINGTON, Nov. 18 (AP) — The representative of house seats gives 11 states power to elect a president in 1944, no matter how the other 39 vote.

The next election will be the first since 1880 which could be won by carrying fewer than a dozen states. A minimum of 10 states was needed to put together the winning majority of electoral votes in last week's election.

House seats have been reallocated among the states to reflect population changes since the last census was taken 10 years ago. Nine states gained and 10 lost in the reallocation.
