Pro West Party Is Endorsed in Japan Elections

TOKYO, Nov. 21 (UPI)—The Japanese electorate swept the pro-West Democratic party back into power with a landslide in national elections today, a vote that will give the country's military ties with the United States official recognition.

Prime Minister Hata Goro's Conservatives took 296 of the 467 seats in the lower house of parliament, a gain of 13. The major opposition party won 145, a gain of 4. The Liberal Democratic party won 2 seats from 40 to 42. The Communist party won 1 seat from 1 to 2. The other 46 seats were scattered among minority candidates.

The popular vote of the Liberal Democrats was about 20 million ballots to 10 million for the Socialists.

Hata said he considered the election, held yesterday, as a victory for the Japanese people to continue the free world's free-trade world based on the U. S. - Japanese treaty.

The election also reflected the fact that Japan is riding a wave of prosperity. The Liberal Democrats has chartered an economic course which it said will double national income in the next decade.

Hata also claimed a "moral victory" on the basis of his gains and a party spokesman called on the Japanese people to be aware of the spectacular gains of the "Western" in Japan.

Among the socialists was Masao Kiyoko Asanuma, widow of Hiroo Asanuma, socialist party leader who was killed by a bullet fired from a political rally last month. The leftists' leader later committed suicide in jail.

Hata and his predecessor, former Prime Minister Yoshida, were re-elected easily.

Idaho's '61 Budget Proposed to Require Tax Like

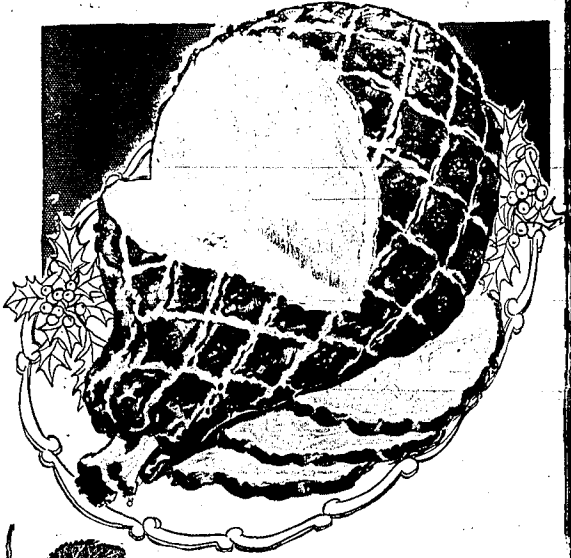

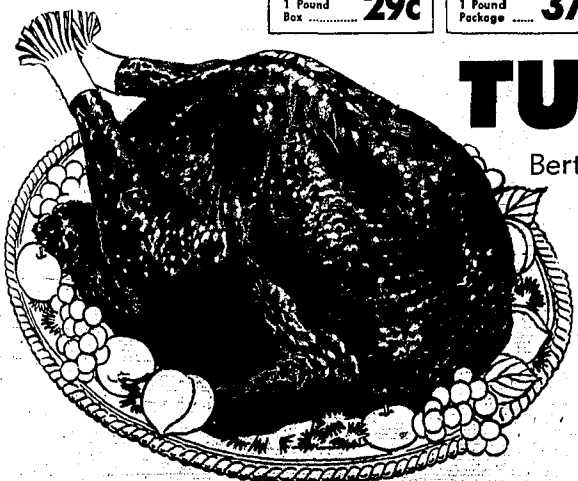

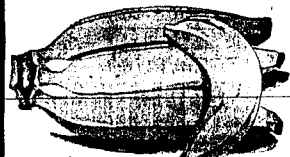

Noisy Italians Are Blamed For All of Rome's Hubbub

By HENRY McEMORE
ROME, Italy.—Rome has the reputation, and deservedly so, of being the noisiest city in the world. When stacked up alongside Rome, even such hubs of hubbub as New York, London, Hong Kong and Calcutta are as hushed as a kindergarten in velvet pants. Many concerned with noise abatement with noise abatement has been studied. Rome's din. It is a continuous process, just as the sound of an engine in Los Angeles.

I believe, for this very simple reason: The extraordinary gift of the Italian people to make noise doing things that other people don't make noise doing. The Italians are tremendously talented this way. No substance is so soft that they can't make a noise handling it. No gesture, no action, is soundless with them. For example, the act of pointing with a finger is a silent one with most people. Not with Italians. To ask directions is to turn an Italian into a noise box for anywhere from ten to 15 minutes. It is impossible for him to raise his arm-point a finger, say the Italian equivalent of "over there," and be so at that. Italians make noise when stirring and turning spaghetti. That sounds hard to do, and I guess it is. But an Italian puts it off quite easily. When one considers that

tons and tons of spaghetti are being stirred and served in Rome all the time, the score of parts of Italy is a large place when the cause of the clean and bang of Rome is broken down. The language in Rome is so beautiful one, but not with several million people speaking it, at the same time, all the time. Even millions of minutes being made would result in a tremendous sound. And Italians never stop talking and they do not use a few words when talking. Watch them sometime when buying a loaf of bread in a store. To purchase a loaf they use more words than are on an average long-playing record. Nothing is simple with the Italian. Everything is complicated, and they have never seen or heard an Italian woman thread a needle, rarely, but I would bet she makes 10,000 stitches of sound doing it.

U. S. Nuclear Power Will Be Big When Plans Carried Out

WASHINGTON, Nov. 21—U. S. ballistic missile launching plans and submarines will be able to fire about a million and a half tons of nuclear fury from world-wide range, missile bases if present building and projected programs are carried out.

This fantastic tonnage would be added from the massive development potential of intercontinental ballistic missiles fired from fixed bases in the United States, intermediate range missiles based abroad, and the tonnage of multi-launcher bombs dropped from planes.

The navy now is well along in the first phase of its program for building an essential fleet of about 45 Polaris submarines. The first such submarines, with 16 missiles each, are under construction. An emergency 1959 equivalent to slightly over 600,000 tons of conventional TNT explosive; the yield is expected to be increased later to about a million tons—one megaton—per missile. By comparison, the first atomic bomb dropped on Hiroshima was of 20,000-ton TNT.

The air force is pushing its program for a mobile missile launching system called the Skybolt. Three rockets are designed to have a range of about 1,500 miles when launched from B52 bombers, with each bomber carrying

two missiles.

Air force experts estimated today that if only half of the B52 bomber force of 470 aircraft is equipped with Skybolt missiles, the volume of firepower will be about that of the 770-nuclear total for the 45 Polaris submarines.

The Skybolt is being developed for the first time by Douglas Aircraft company as prime contractor, with major subcontractors including Aerojet General Corporation, Alphascope company and Northrup corporation.

The air force estimates the Skybolt system will begin to come into operation in 1964. This apparently would mean that the system would be completed about 1960, which coincides with the start date for completion of the last year of the 45 Polaris submarines.

The trade magazine Aviation Week estimates that development cost of the Skybolt eventually will reach about 10 million dollars instead of an originally estimated total of 136 million dollars.

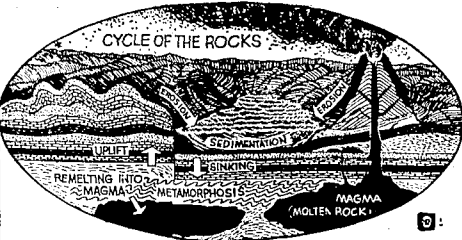
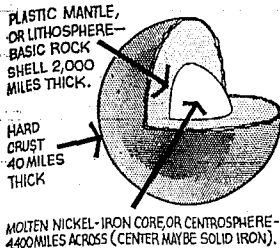

Earth, Stars and Man (5) Shaping of the Earth

by Don Oakley and John Lane



Though men have peered billions of light years into space, they have penetrated only a tiny distance into the planet that is their home. But slowly over the years, chiefly through the use of seismograph and the study of earthquake waves, a reasonably certain picture of the structure of the earth has emerged.

The globe consists of a heavy core of molten rock under tremendous pressure. Around this is a plastic, feather-thin mantle of rock. Finally, an eggshell-thin crust.

It is on this crust, three-fourths covered with water and wrapped with a thin blanket of atmosphere, that man lives and has built his complex modern civilization. And it is from

this crust that he mines the resources that make that civilization possible.

Also, it is on the crust that geologists read the records of the great changes the earth has undergone since it was formed. They see a cycle of erosion and rebuilding that began at the beginning and will continue as long as the world has water and air.

As soon as the first land masses of molten rock (magma) cooled, rain and wind began to break them down, leaching out minerals and concentrating them in deposits. Rivers carried sediments to the sea where their accumulated weight pressed them into stone. More pressure sometimes turned them into a class of rock called metamorphic—for instance, limestone into marble.

Eventually, great areas were lifted from the sea by the restless crust and eroded again. Other times more weight and pressure were added until the stratified rocks were fused into magma again.

The cycle is infinitely slow, and may be halted and reversed many times. But it goes on.

Nineteenth-century geologists knew that the thousands of feet of sediments that have been laid down since the earth's beginning took untold ages. But they could only guess at the age of the earth. It was not until the 20th century that men found a cosmic clock that had been running since earth's time began—a clock they could read in the rocks.
