Prices are expected to be difficult to determine whether you will pay more or less for your turkey this year than a year ago.

For those who aren't fanatics of turkey meat, many stores are featuring rib roasts and hams.

Shrimp and lobster tails are among fish specialties.

The traditional Thanksgiving cranberry is in abundant supply. A record crop of 131 million pounds has been harvested.

Housewives have a large variety of vegetables for selection to round out holiday menus.

New arrivals on the market include romaine, Boston and romaine lettuce, Florida type peppers, Italian, arise, denticel cabbage and Boston lettuce from California.

Best vegetable buys are broccoli, Brussels sprouts, cabbage, cauliflower, Chinese cabbage, cucumbers, Florida radish and escarole mushrooms, medium yellow onions, turnips, rutabagas, eastern potatoes, radishes, yellow straight-neck squash, curly parsnip, new-gold and orange and yellow Jersey sweet potatoes.

California asparagus, Florida okra, white broiler onions, green peas and tomatoes are expensive.

Best fruit buys are chestnuts, cranberries, emperor grapes, command and McIntosh apples and small pomegranates.

On the expensive side are tangerines and melons.

BURLEY, Nov. 22.—The University of Idaho will be the theme of the first television concert of the season to be given by Leonard Bernstein and the New York Philharmonic orchestra at 8 p.m. Thanksgiving day over CBS, according to word received from Mrs. William Harper, president of the Burley Music Club, an affiliate of the national federation.

The local club studied the life and work of this great composer-conductor at its last meeting.

The program was taped late in September in West Berlin while the orchestra was making two appearances at the Berlin Culture Festival, Mrs. Harper says.

The Ford foundation underwrote the flight to Berlin and provided from the concert's net proceeds "the flight to Berlin." A charitable fund which among other activities, finances summer vacations for children from the "Island City" at West German and other European summer camps, she says.

Bernstein's concert for Piano and Orchestra in C Major is the work around which the program is built. Bernstein plays and conducts the concert. He chose Beethoven to illustrate the universality of music because, he says, "of the special nature of the German mind in a certain period of its history—the Gothic mind and the Beethoven mind. What this mind has contributed is an obvious idea, but a peculiarly German one—the idea of development."

The topic was done in West Berlin's radio-television center, Gendesa Foyes booth, before two audiences of music students from the city's 40 schools.

Just as in New York, or wherever Bernstein conducts, hundreds of the students queued up after the performance to ask for his autograph, Mrs. Harper said.

Plans for U. S. Prime Minister Role Are Killed

WASHINGTON, Nov. 22.—The proposal for a "first secretary" of the government, to act in the role of an American prime minister, has been rejected by a senate subcommittee.

The turnaround came from Sen. Henry M. Jackson, D. Wash., and the staff of his senate subcommittee on national policy-making machinery.

The effect was to four cold water on a plan which President Eisenhower has been expected to recommend.

Gov. Nelson A. Rockefeller, New York, who headed Eisenhower's advisory committee on government organization, advanced the idea of a secretary to execute the delegated presidential authority on all national security affairs at the prime ministerial level.

Jackson in a vote suggested that he spoke for anyone but himself. However, his position, makes it probable that his view coincides with that of President-Elect John F. Kennedy. Senator Kennedy sat in on some of the Jackson committee hearings.
