# Holiday Toll Lower Than Similar Period

# Result Under Changed Vote Plan Studied

WASHINGTON, Nov. 28 (AP)—Here another "if" for Republicans trying to figure out how they could have elected Vice President Richard M. Nixon to the presidency.

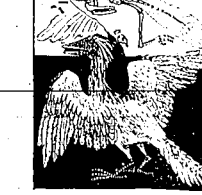

ARCHAEOLOGY—THE PRIMORDIAL BIRD



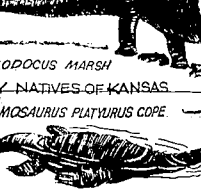
