### OUR COUNTRY'S GOALS

When President Eisenhower set up a commission on national goals, some said this country needs no declaration of national purpose. It is clear in everything we do.

Yet to millions there may be immense value in an effort to distill and restate the things toward which we as a nation are striving.

In the report of the President's commission, eleven eminent Americans have endeavored earnestly to accomplish this and set out in a series of philosophical statements of America's national purpose.

This document should perhaps be judged, however, as the commission's acknowledgment of the need to define the country's goals lies with the American people themselves.

Viewed this way, it comes to us as a renewed plea for a more prolonged discussion among people of all walks, as to where this nation is headed and how it can best get there.

It is especially the young people of our country who are called upon to protect and foster the individual in his freedoms and his opportunities for development to the full capacity. Chairman Eisenhower has set in a commission background study:

"The central goal should be a renewal of faith in the infinite and unlimited possibilities of individual development."

The commission has chosen to stress how much Americans as individuals can do to serve the objectives charted for the country. The report declares:

"In the 1950's every American is summoned to extraordinary personal responsibility, sustained effort, and sacrifice."

"Our goals will be attained only the way of life preserved if enough Americans take the national interest sufficiently into account in day-by-day decisions... the American citizen should be called upon to give directly to the solution of the nation's problems."

### TURNABOUT

Over forty-two billion dollars in the various funds of AFL-CIO unions. Some of it—about two billion dollars—is in strike funds. The rest is in welfare funds—an amount about double the reserve fund of the national social security system.

The AFL-CIO now is holding conferences to consider how all this money should be invested. Currently, most of it is in government bonds. The unions now are taking two positions to regard the investment funds are contrary to what they recommend as national policy.

The first is that the money should be reinvested because government bonds produce too little income. Yet, in their political pronouncements the unions have contended that the government was guilty of paying interest on these "high" bonds.

Interest on government obligations has been inching up generally for some time. The reason is that interest rates must be high enough to attract and hold investments, such as the unions' billions. Any interest rate that won't accomplish this is quite evidently too low.

The second change in stance is a little more subtle. The unions have been foremost among the advocates of the idea that government is responsible for full employment, and that government spending is the way to force employment.

Yet, in determining to pull their money out of government investments and making their own investments in private enterprise, they stress that this influx of capital will make more jobs in private enterprise.

It is to be hoped, that the unions, in re-taking their position on such things as investment, will give equal time to a re-consideration of their political policies.

### THE COYOTE AS AN ALLY

The Idaho agent for the United States Fish and Wildlife Service is bragging about the destruction of 4,422 coyotes in this state last year. And it's set its sights on a bigger take than that. He told the Idaho Woodworker association in Pocatello, Idaho, that he said, he expects coyotes are on the increase.

Or, at any rate, there are more of them that are likely to prey on livestock since an explosion of the rodent and rabbit population in recent years seems to have passed its peak.

It's a recognized fact that the coyote has been an important factor in the reduction of rodents and rabbits numbers. The Wildlife Matter Institute told him with this statement: "The increase in coyotes in Idaho is directly correlated to the peak rodent and rabbit populations." Scientists aver that the coyote eats other rodent pests only when gophers, rats and mice are not available.

These rodent pests cause plenty of trouble for farmers, too. So it is suggested that we be not too eager in our campaign against the coyote. We'll well be advised, though, to leave a few coyotes to help us deal with the problem which has been so long plaguing us here—so we'll not assuredly help, if we help to exterminate the coyote as a potential ally. —Boise Statesman

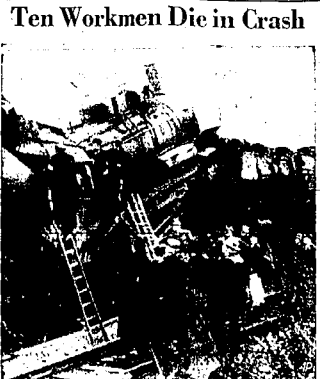
