South School Finances Are In Huge Mess

NEW ORLEANS, Dec. 8 (AP)—The \$3,000-student public school system of New Orleans is in a financial mess. Dr. James P. Redmond, school superintendent, disclosed that 1,200 school system employees are not being paid by the Louisiana legislature, or have had payments on their school board checks stopped because of the legislature. In addition, the school boards owe creditors in New Orleans more than \$600,000 for school supplies. New Orleans banks, wary of the legal complications, will honor no school board checks or will loan the school board no money, waiting to see who wins the struggle for power—the school board or the legislature. The school board has filed a U. S. district court suit to compel banks to release state money and has asked for a ruling that will clear up legal questions sufficiently to permit bank loans of about 12 million dollars.

Chances to Hire Export Available

WASHINGTON, Dec. 8 — Secretary of Commerce Frederick B. Feltz claims there is ample opportunity to increase exports by three billion dollars next year, which he said would come in solving the gold-dollar problem. "There is ample opportunity for this and it is up to the businessmen to seize that opportunity," Feltz said at a news conference following a meeting of the National Export Expansion committee. The committee chief said that while an increase on that scale is quite possible, he would not predict that it would be achieved.

Sinatra Planning Event for Demos

HOLLYWOOD, Dec. 8 (AP)—Frank Sinatra says he's putting together a star-studded show to be staged in Washington during the opening ceremonies of the presidential inauguration of Sen. John F. Kennedy. 

### Minico Lunchroom Is Beehive Of Activity During Noontime

RUPERT, Dec. 8 — Lunch time at Minico high school finds a beehive of activity going on in the modern kitchen, with eight women performing their various tasks under an efficient team, directed by Mrs. Dorothy Walker, kitchen manager.

The kitchen crew were on 200 potato buds with each woman taking a turn at each part of the work during the school year.

Lunches for between 600 and 700 students and teachers are served each day, with nearly 400 served in the main lunch room and more than 200 in the new building, containing the English and speech departments where members of the freshman and sophomore classes eat. Food is transported from the main building in specially designed steam carts, insulated and heated to keep the food hot until served.

In listing the ingredients of an average day's menu, Mrs. Walker said that from 600 to 1,000 rolls are baked each day — and that, on the days baking powder biscuits were served, it took 1,000 pounds of beans and 40 pounds of hamburger are used, and 200 pounds of potatoes are required when they are served.

In making the bread or rolls, it takes 65 pounds of flour and three pounds of yeast each day, and butter is used in cooking and spread amounts to 25 to 30 pounds each day.

And when it comes to the salad course, the cooks start with 24 head of lettuce, 10 to 15 lbs. of bunches of onions, 10 pounds each of celery and carrots and one gallon of salad dressing — three gallons for potato salad.

Three omelets of watermelon vegetables is served as each day. For creamed turkey, Mrs. Walker said that four birds averaging about 20 to 25 pounds were used, and when turkey and dressing was served, 64 birds were required.

This year, a net oven was added to the one already in use. The new one stacks on the top of the old one, and the two new service carts for transporting the food to the smaller building, making for more convenience and efficiency in the kitchen.

The stainless steel carts contain large kettles for vegetables, with trays for rolls and toast, and are equipped for keeping the food hot, with built in electric heating coils.

The cooks said that use of the carts and dressing in the other building added about two hours work each day, but that this arrangement to the two 100 hours necessary last year to serve all the students.
