Dean Rusk Named Secretary Of State, Stevenson Accepts U. S. Job; Bowles Is Assistant

PAUL BEACH, Fla., Dec. 12 (UPI)—President-Elect John F. Kennedy today announced the appointment of Dean Rusk as secretary of state. Kennedy also announced that Adlai E. Stevenson had accepted Kennedy's offer of appointment as U. S. ambassador to the United Nations. The president-elect announced the selection of Rep. Chester Bowles, D., Conn., as undersecretary of state. Rusk, 51-year-old member of the Republican party, is now president of the Republican Commission and served with the Truman administration as assistant secretary for international affairs. Stevenson, former governor of Illinois, was the Democratic presidential candidate in 1952 and 1956. Bowles is a former ambassador to India. Kennedy announced his long-awaited selection of a secretary of state in a tropical jumbo jet from Honolulu, Hawaii. Rusk was at his side when he arrived here last night.

Unemployment Hits Total of Four Million

WASHINGTON, Dec. 12 (UPI)—Unemployment rose by 452,000 last month beyond the four million mark, the labor department today announced.

Unemployment for November was described as normal for the month, as a however predicted that the total might climb to at least 4,200,000 next month.

The total for November was listed at 4,000,000 unemployed, more persons with jobs declined by 300,000 to 67,100,000. The unemployment rate for November was 5.95 percent, down from 6.05 percent in October. Rusk Serves In Statesman, Soldier Roles

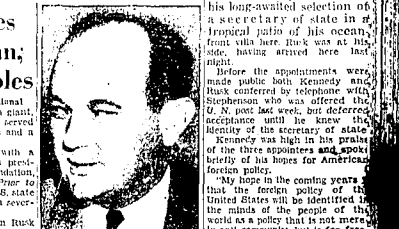

Dean Rusk, a soft-spoken giant, is a noted scholar who has served his country as a statesman and a soldier.

A hard-driving worker with a sense of duty, Rusk is the president of the Rockefeller foundation, in New York, since 1952. Prior to this he served with the War Department for six years in several positions.

He was born Dean Rusk on Feb. 9, 1909, in Cherokee county, Ga., one of five children of Robert H. and Frances (Coffey) Rusk.

Rusk dropped the name David during the early years of his life in Cherokee county, Ga., because of the name's association with the Civil War. He graduated in 1932 from the boys' high school in Atlanta, Ga., and in 1934 from the junior ROTC. Rusk enrolled in the University of Georgia. (Continued on Page 2, Column 1)

None Scared In Test Done With 'Ghost'

LONDON, Dec. 12 (AP)—A scientist donned a white sheet and fixed some of the conductors of a gray wire in an experiment intended to answer the question: "What does an ordinary man do when he sees a ghost?"

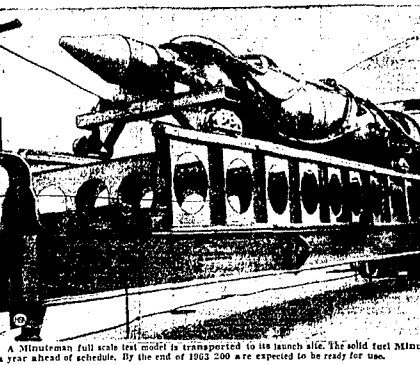

Breakthrough in Making Minuteman ICBM May End Threat of Missile Gap

WASHINGTON (NEA) — A breakthrough in development of the Minuteman ICBM may mean there will be a "missile gap" after all.

The solid fuel Minuteman is a year ahead of schedule. Six months ago the Pentagon thought it would have three of them on site, ready to fire, by mid-1965.

This is the main reason why some of the Pentagon's critics believe that in the crucial "missile gap" years—mid-1962 to mid-1965—the U. S. may have more ICBMs in place than the Soviet Union.

Best guess now is that the U. S. will have 328 ICBMs and 16 Polaris submarines at the end of 1962, and 400 ICBMs and 16 Polaris subs by the end of 1965.

By mid-1965, the U. S. should have almost 600 intercontinental missiles aimed and ready. It now appears the Soviets will have a shade less.

The Pentagon counts Polaris missiles as being of ICBM range when aboard long-range submarines. It counts the superior homing force that U. S. flights have indicated could be used.

Two developments in addition to the Minuteman breakthrough are responsible for the pleasantly startling outlook.

A step-up in Polaris submarine building. The fleet presently consists of 16. It is expected to reach 24 by the end of 1962.

The Pentagon's pushing ahead as fast with their missile building as it looked as though the Russians had grandiose plans for ICBMs.

There is increasing evidence that their missile output and ICBM base building program is well behind our earlier calculations.

There is one dark spot in all this, and it has some U. S. planners worried. It is this: The supposed Russian decision not to go all out on ICBMs may mean that Nikita Khrushchev has other weapons up his sleeve.

It could be a radically improved type of ICBM that makes today's ICBMs obsolete, or chemical or biological weapons of superior quality.

Until they find out for sure, the men in the Pentagon are taking comfort in the fact that most of the new U. S. missiles will be extremely difficult for the Soviets to detect and destroy in a great attack.

Educator Finds That Junior High School Is Here To Stay

NEW YORK (NEA) — The junior high school, as we know it, is here to stay. It is here to stay.

Dr. James B. Conant believes he has proved at least that much in 36 pages on "Recommendations for Education in the Junior High School Years: A Memorandum to School Boards."

Based on a study of 237 schools in 23 states, the report has been released to school superintendents. If Dr. Conant finds any serious fault in junior high schools, it is in a part where they are caught in a squeeze.

Educators, primarily in elementary schools, are more concerned with children than subject matter. In high school, the objective is to get the student to learn to think.

But, Conant's former president of Harvard University, remains convinced that the secondary grades are particularly important just because they are so important.

"So junior high school instruction has to be better, rather than in a part where they are caught in a squeeze. Educators, primarily in elementary schools, are more concerned with children than subject matter."

He cites a resulting danger of junior high being treated as a miniature high school.

Conant says, "Junior high school personnel often become too concerned with student social life. So they have mimicked many of the high school customs, notably in extra-curricular activities."

He urges playing down inter-school sports and other entertainments with no educational value.

Conant says, "When I talked to educators about increasing the size of their physical fitness programs, at least half were reluctant because of the expense involved in expanding gymnasium facilities."

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The recommendation probably getting least attention is the one calling for abolition of making the students in each class according to the grades they take in all subjects.

"Educators tell me they like my idea, but the colleges will want rankings so they have to keep them. I do not consider this too important," Dr. Conant says.

But what does perturb him is the misuse of his study and class rankings to satisfy what might be called an "ivy league fixation," particularly in suburban communities.

"First, is that school in suburban areas as I have defined it? And, particularly in a suburban area, is the high school study program more important?"

"This may well make college students work harder, but others may be pushing beyond their capabilities."

Here, Dr. Conant says, "I am not a point about this book. The fact is that high school today which has received little attention."

"I primarily was concerned with comprehensive high schools in communities with 100,000 to 150,000 population."

Three other types of schools have later been mentioned. They were only superficially mentioned in the high school study program last year.

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Eastern Area To Be Key In Jobless Issue

CHARLESTON, W. Va., Dec. 12 (AP)—The so-called "jobless issue" is a symbolic shadow, representing the challenge President John F. Kennedy and his special citizens' committee face in trying to halt creeping unemployment throughout the nation and to realize its economically depressed areas.

The citizens' committee, a task force of 24 business, labor, civic and government representatives, was appointed by Kennedy two weeks ago. The members held their organization meeting here Friday.

They plan to convene again in Washington Wednesday, Thursday and Friday to draw up some measures which Kennedy can act on soon after he takes the oath on Jan. 20.

West Virginia is certain to play an important role in Kennedy's revitalization program.

The state is an ideal guinea pig in unemployment work, as representatives of the majority of depressed areas packed a labor force last autumn by changing economic conditions and shifting from coal to other industries.

The committee chairman, Sen. J. Morgan Kousser, said the task force will have specific recommendations in Kennedy's hands by New Year's day.

No implied economy-rebuilding program will be launched immediately by presidential directives after Kennedy takes office.

Colonel Boumedienne, who had the violence and bloodshed that wrecked Algeria over the past two years, said the French colonial regime finally has lost its control.

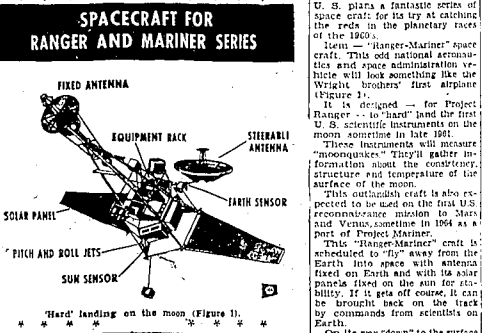

Abbas told a news conference that President Charles de Gaulle had made Algeria a semi-independent republic linked with France "to end the 130-year-old French domination."

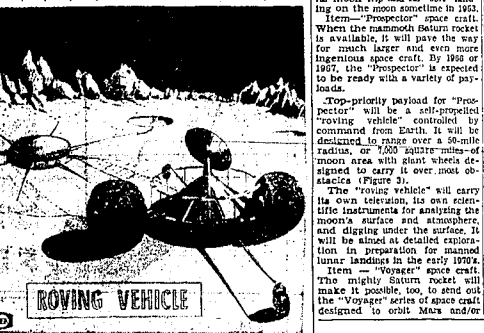

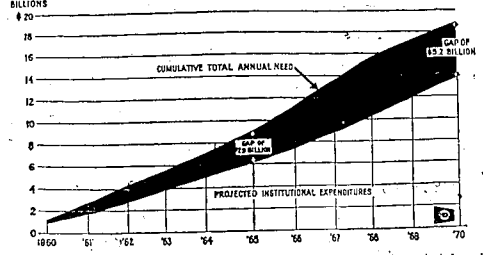
