Easier Plans For Jobless Pay Wanted

COURT DALENE, Dec. 13 (UP)—A recommendation for more lenient unemployment compensation will be made to the state legislature next week by Gov. Robert Smylie.

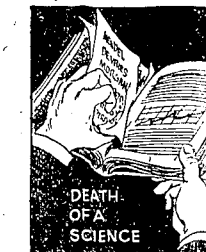
Gov. Smylie told the Courier-Tribune Press he will recommend that the formula for extending pay benefits be figured on a monthly basis rather than quarterly unemployment benefits expire after 26 weeks under the present formula.

Smylie said the situation is aggravated because of the relatively high unemployment in south Idaho compared to north Idaho. "I'm concerned," he said, "with the possibility of an emergency clause in the law, under which the formula would be of assistance by the time the unemployment benefits begin to run out in February."

Although the Idaho law to provide for extensions was passed by the 1959 legislature, it has not yet been used because the quarterly basis, under which the formula works, does not reflect employment situations quickly enough.

The 1959 Idaho law was the first of its kind in the nation, written by the Idaho employment service agency at Smylie's request. Several states have since copied the law, which was intended to aid the complex formula provided under federal law.

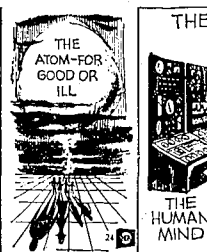
In the great purges in Russia in the 1930s, not only political but scientific opposition was eliminated. Some of the world's leading geneticists were shot or exiled. Others confessed their "errors."

In their place, the old theory of the Frenchman Lamarck was accepted, under the leadership of a Russian scientist named Trofim Lyenko—the belief that acquired characteristics can be passed on to our descendants.

Ironically, the idea of genes and chance mutations, universally accepted in the West, was denounced as degrading to human dignity, Lyenkoism, on the other hand, fitted into the Communist dream of remaking mankind through the environment of Marxism. Thus was science powered by dogma.

It is dangerous for the world to ignore the

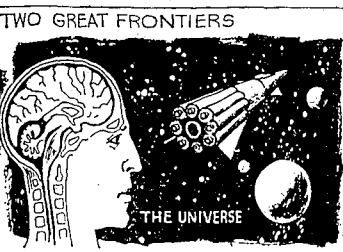

findings of genetics. For geneticists know that radiation causes mutations (first proved by H. J. Muller in 1927), and that most mutations are harmful. They warn that it will be another 50 years before the full effects of the bombs on Hiroshima and Nagasaki are known.

It is often said that our moral development has failed to keep pace with our science. It may be more accurate to say that we have not yet learned to apply the methods of science (instead of just its inventions) to solving our personal and international problems. Everything in life comes under the scrutiny of science, which is guided only by observable facts. "Truth," to scientists, is a working hypothesis, subject to change in the light of further knowledge. But most of us, both East and West, are jealous of our prejudices.

THE TWO GREAT FRONTIERS



Nonscientists will more than ever have to adjust to new discoveries in science. The first application of the power of the atom was not a promising beginning. The argument that all-out atomic war can be survived may be an indication of the end.

Tomorrow, science promises to give man even more godlike power—perhaps even the power to change his own evolution. Men are probing more deeply all the time into the human cell and the workings of the brain.

It may be that in space men will find a challenge larger than our life on this tiny planet. And, as has happened before in the story of man's evolution, we may open up a whole new area for human development in this universe of earth, stars and man.

The first New York vote count showed Kennedy's margin by 20,892, and with the unofficial call, Kennedy was compiled quickly after the Nov. 8 election.

The new figures for New York showed 330,785 for Kennedy and 316,420 for Nixon.

Rusk, together with his two principal aides—Alden E. Stevenson and Chester Bowles—were named as a state department team that could be organized to pursue western aims with dignity and resolution.

The French newspaper *Combat* applauded Kennedy's choice of Rusk, Bowles and Stevenson as "breathing a new leadership in American foreign policy."

A front-page editorial in the conservative London *Daily Mail* said the appointment "above that of the most important man is going to be President Kennedy."

Herter Offers to Work With Rusk

WASHINGTON, Dec. 13 (AP)—Secretary of State Christian A. Herter offered cooperation to Dean Rusk only a few hours after Rusk was named yesterday to succeed him under the incoming Kennedy administration.

In a telegram to Rusk at Palm Beach, Fla., Herter said he will be in Europe for a week but that top state department officials "will be glad to facilitate your contacts with the department."

Millions More Are Likely to Be Minus Job

WASHINGTON, Dec. 13 (AP)—Another million workers are virtually certain to lose their jobs in December and January, pushing the unemployment over five million today. No drop was in sight before March.

Barring a sharp—and unforeseen—surge in production and hiring, the number of jobs was expected to rise to 42 million this month and to 32 million in January. Another 100,000 workers were likely to be laid off in February.

Seymour Wolpert, a deputy assistant secretary of labor, said he foresees "nothing in the office which will bring unemployment down before the end of winter."

He said November figures supported earlier predictions that unemployment would not drop until March, falling then to five million. He noted that joblessness usually jumps in January because Christmas workers are laid off and cold weather curtails outdoor work.

November marked the first time unemployment topped four million since June, when the figure was 4.4 million. But the June increase was largely due to the many students seeking vacation jobs. The November increase was described as a normal seasonal rise.

In addition to the jump in unemployment, more workers were forced to go on a part-time basis last month. The number of part-time jobs dipped by 233,000 but still set a November employment record of 67,182,000.
