U.N. General Assembly Begins 11-Week Recess; End of Session is Quiet

UNITED NATIONS, N. Y., Dec. 21 (AP)—The general assembly began an 11-week recess early today, bringing to an end an assessment of Russia and its friends. The 17th annual session of the assembly has been adjourned for a quiet flurry of financial figures that contrasted sharply with the parade of figures from the international scene who gathered for its opening last Sept. 20. But the turbulent forty-fourth touched off by the aggression of Nikita S. Khrushchev and other world leaders left its mark. Secretary General Dag Hammarskjöld left his mark on the assembly's start. He called the United Nations "the only organization in the world which has tested the United States and its allies in its very foundations."

Canada-First Tax Changes Are Designed

OTTAWA, Dec. 21 (AP)—Canada's new tax changes are designed to attract investment and promote home-ownership of Canadian property.

The changes, announced last week by Finance Minister Donald Fleming, look the form of increased taxes on profits and dividends in Canada. Fleming said that the changes will cost the government about \$100 million a year.

Fleming called U. S. Treasury Secretary Robert Anderson's budget to tell him of the tax plan and not reveal Anderson's reaction.

The tax changes also had the effect of discouraging Canadian investment abroad, especially in the New York market, and prompting local investors to seek their investments in Canada first.

The moves were the first in a series expected to be a prelude to a platform on which the Conservative government will go into the general election scheduled within the next two months.

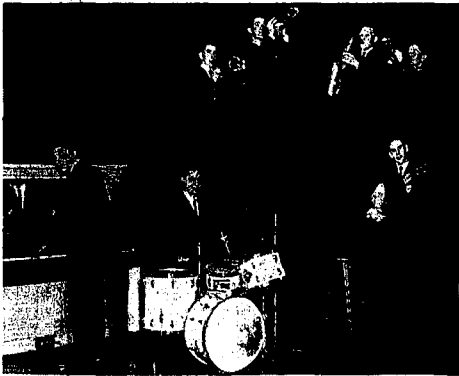

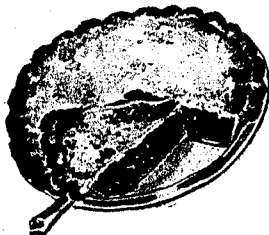

Deoxidized Water From Milner Dam Has Displaced Storage in Murtaugh Lake

Murtaugh lake is now a dead body so far as supporting fish life, a series of checks conducted by district fish biologist Stacy Gebhardt, Jerome, indicated Tuesday. "The deoxidized water from Milner dam has gone completely through Murtaugh lake," Gebhardt said. "We saw dead fish at the outlet of the lake. These were mostly herring, but they will be killed by the lack of oxygen." The matter of deoxidized water has reached a controversial point in Twin Falls, which obtains the major percentage of its drinking water through the Twin Falls canal system. The water is diverted at Milner dam, through Murtaugh lake and then later from the south of Twin Falls. However, the lack of oxygen in the pool does not constitute a health hazard once it passes through the city water works. The deoxidized water is used in industrial wastes, largely deposited in Milner reservoir, which is used for irrigation. Gebhardt has used up all available oxygen. Thousands of dead fish occurred in the Milner reservoir in the past few days.

Idaho Wheat Aide Talks to Burley Unit

BURLEY, Dec. 21—There is an intense desire on the part of Oriental people to like American wheat and have similar possessions and they make great sacrifices to acquire wheat, Harold West, chairman of the Idaho wheat commission, told the Burley Chamber of Commerce during its Monday luncheon meeting at County Roy's.

During the last 60 days 150,000 bushels of wheat have been sold to Korea. It was a thrill to go back to the Orient and see the wheat 15 years ago with the armed service. Many changes have been made in the culture, economy and the western adaptation of the people. They have a higher standard of living than we have," he asserted.

West stated that the rumor had been circulated that he had been asked for his trip as well as Crow, Robert E. Smythe's trip to Brazil. They were paid for by people from those countries, West declared.

He brought greetings from Mrs. M. Phillips, Mrs. Ellis, India, whom he had seen on this trip. She was in the wheat commission and spoke here just yesterday. She told West that she would never forget the kindness of the people and her trip here.

My purpose in going to the Orient was to see if our people are doing an adequate job for us in growing wheat and wheat products. Japan is our dollar consumer of wheat today. The trade balance now shows that they are buying more wheat from us than we are buying products from them and they are wondering why," he said.

We have real competition with the Canadians and the wheat market over there. If we don't watch out, Canadian wheat will replace millions bushels of Idaho wheat in the Philippines. The reason for this is that they still use the old-type, round, large ear wheat over here.

Competition with Canada is a serious one, he asserted. The Philippines have been 100 per cent importers of flour only in the past. They have now built four mills in operation, one on the drawing board and one in the building stage.

He showed colored slides of how Americans are helping Japanese people to use wheat and its products in making noodles, cakes, wafers, rolls and breads. Japanese pay to go to schools to learn how to make western pastry, and most of this is made from Idaho soft wheat. The people are enthusiastic in learning new things and many classes are held on Sunday as their work days during the week are so long.

West stated that in the four years of the promotional program statistics show people are growing taller and have gained weight. The people have learned wheat contains more nutrients than rice and they are trying to sell one bushel of rice in order to buy a bushel of wheat, he said.

Pictures of the school lunch program were shown and most of the children were in western attire. Menu for lunch one day was milk, white meat and bread.

West stated the grain industry of California had teamed up with the wheat program and by working together much was being accomplished in introducing new items into the diet.

He showed pictures of large loaves of bread that sold in Tokyo for nine cents. He stated the loaves were much larger than American "fluff" and were much better.

West summed up his impression of the Korean people by saying, "Here is a country torn by war, strife within the government, economic trouble during the last 40 years, yet you can't help but notice the people still have the courage to smile and make happy talk about the future," he said.

A Christmas card was placed by all present to be sent to Lloyd Hollinger, a member who is in a hospital at Wala Wala, Wash.

Most Legislators Opposed To Highway Board Change

(Editor's note: This is the last in a series of articles on the "highway board" of the 1951 Idaho legislature, which is expected to meet in Boise on Dec. 21. The members of the board are listed on page 18.)

BOISE, Dec. 21 (UP)—Do you favor any change in the status of the state highway board? "No," replied 52 per cent of the Idaho legislators responding to an Associated Press survey.

But the 25 per cent who said they favor some change (13 per cent did not answer the question) spoke out vigorously against the agency which has been the target of considerable criticism in recent years.

Much of the criticism has centered on the board's actions in highway routing and in right-of-way acquisition. Opponents generally contend the board is responsible to no one.

Actually, state law makes the board responsible to the governor. He can remove a member for cause, but must conduct a public hearing for the firing of his charges.

More Democrats than Republicans the poll showed, favor change in the board and one Democrat, Rep. Alvin B. Benson, of Owyhee county, said if the 1951 legislature doesn't do anything "I believe the next Democratic legislature will make changes."

Benson said members of the board "have adopted the habit of government to take cases to court till they break their opportunity."

Sen. C. A. Reddick, R., Butte, said he thinks the board "should be made more answerable to the people in such controversial matters as now appear to be causing as much confusion."

One suggestion is that the board membership be expanded from three to five. In that way better geographical representation could be given the state. Since its creation the board never has had a member from southeastern Idaho.

Little support was voiced by legislators for a proposal that a general agency be created to handle affairs of the University of Idaho and Idaho State college. Both institutions now are controlled by the state board of education, which also supervises the Idaho Industrial Training School at St. Anthony and the State School for the Deaf and Blind at Pocatello.

But the survey showed that only 37 per cent of the legislators reportedly favor the separate board. Twenty per cent did not answer the question and 43 per cent said they favor continuing the present arrangement.
