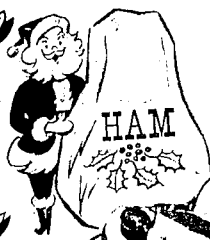

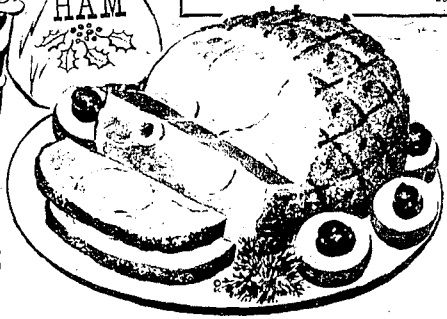

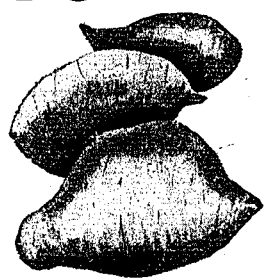

So the big push will be on in 1961. William C. Doherty, president of the National Association of Letter Carriers, has announced that striking next month will not be a drive to organize unorganized U. S. government employees into "one big union."

Today, about 700,000 of the 2.4 million federal workers are in some 23 unions. Mr. Doherty wants all the rest, and he advertises to incorporating some of the existing unions.

This labor leader is a vigorous man, as he proved when he spearheaded the drive for a federal pay raise in the last session of congress, and succeeded over President Eisenhower's objections. He then pressured the pay raise bill through both houses in a single day over the President's veto.

He did it in behalf of 138,000 members. Imagine what he can do if he succeeds in his announced objective of speaking for more than 10 times that many.

While there is no doubt that a powerful single federal union would make government workers more powerful, it is not the chief matter for concern. In Philadelphia, the city government has bowed to pressure and granted union shop for city workers. That has meant that some 23 unions and their union or are fired. Such a thing could happen in federal government, too.

And unions today do not confine their activities to bargaining pay and fringe benefits. They are active in a wide range of governmental objectives, in all fields from education to foreign affairs.

A handful of elected representatives and appointed officials are in key positions which have a hard time implementing any policy that did not conform with these union objectives, we can be sure. This is something that congress should consider as it sits down to begin its work in 1961.

Alien Report Is Required By U. S. Law

All aliens with specific exceptions are required by law to report their address to the Federal government during January.

R. O. Hoffelder, district director, United States department of immigration and naturalization service, Helena, Mont.

More than 10,000 persons are expected to be affected by this requirement in the Montana and Idaho districts, Hoffelder stated.

Aliens must report their address to the U. S. citizen must make an address report unless he was admitted temporarily for agricultural work, is a foreign diplomat or is an international organization representative, Hoffelder explained.

Any alien who violates this law by not reporting his address may be fined \$100, imprisoned for 30 days and deported, he emphasized.

Aliens now in the United States during January must report their address to the service within 30 days after their return, he added.

Cards for reporting addresses are available during January at every postoffice and at all immigration and naturalization service offices, Hoffelder said.

So, as is usual when Sir Winston is just that halibut job, he will spend Christmas in the country.

Today, little more than two weeks after an injury that could have been serious for men 10 years younger than he, the 86-year-old statesman was continuing his steady progress.

His longtime physician and friend, Lord Moran, has kept him under almost strict surveillance but none of the complications so often triggered in aged persons by shock has made an appearance.

The possibility of a chain deterioration had worried Sir Winston's medical advisers even more than the actual injury received when the former prime minister slipped on a bath-room rug.
