BOISE, Jan. 16 (UPI)—The house today passed a bill to raise the minimum driving age in Idaho to 16 from 14. The vote was 32 to 23. Passage came after better than two hours debate and attempts were made to put the measure on general orders to amend the bill. Rep. Pete Cenarrusa, R., Blaine, asked that the house resolve itself into a committee to amend the bill to eliminate "hardships" on farmers and others. Proponents of the bill argued that children in the 11- and 15-year-old bracket do not have mature enough judgment to drive automobiles; educators say automobiles and poor school grades go hand-in-hand; the National Safety Council has called for more uniformity in

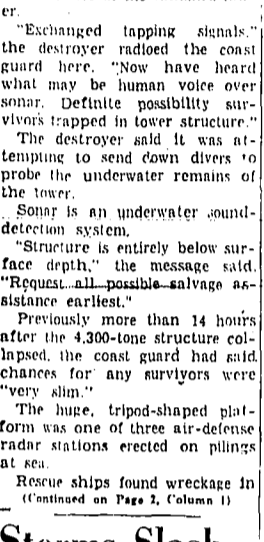

Getting Sick in Italy Boosts Henry's Devotion for U. S.

By HENRY McLEMORE ROME, Italy — An American doesn't realize how American he really is until he has to call a doctor in a foreign city. It brings out his patriotism more than a war. His love and devotion for his home land increases with the rise of the mercury in the thermometer and, by the time it reaches 103 degrees or so, he wants to struggle from his bed and head for America by jet. When he is well the American trusts Europe, and everything about it. He accepts it as a part of the civilized world. But when the miseries strike him, his viewpoint undergoes a lightning-swift change. In a flash Europe becomes - to the sick American, not only the old world, but the old, old world. He looks upon it as medieval - a land where progress hasn't taken a step forward since barbers did the doctoring and potholes were the last word in treatment. It's no use to tell him that Europe has known medicine for centuries, that its doctors are world renowned and that its contributions to medical science have been vast and important. He wants an American doctor. Nothing else. He is positive, once a "bug" takes over his aching frame, that Europe doesn't have a man capable of "reading" a stuck-out tongue, or interpreting a chest rattle, or diagnosing a broken toe. The thought of having an appendix taken out in Europe, or swallowing penicillin made in Europe, sends his fever soaring another degree. I speak from "in the bed" experience. Two days ago I came down with a "bug" and when my fever hit 103 I demanded to be carried on a litter to the airport and put on a plane for home. Mary called an Italian doctor instead; one recommended to us when we first arrived in Rome. "Give him a chance," she said. "With the only life I have?" I asked. She said the doctor had studied in America, and I wanted to know how she knew that and, even if he said so, what guarantee did we have that he was telling the truth? When the doctor came he spoke almost perfect English. Instead of reassuring me, it heightened my suspicions. I whispered to Mary that his English proved him a fake—that he had learned it to make his claim of having studied in America stand up. His routine was okay. The right thumps, the flashlight in the mouth, the pokes, the questions of when, where and how much. His findings confirmed my opinion that he was a throwback to the dark ages. There was nothing hunch the matter with me he told Mary. Take three capsules daily, stay in bed, eat lightly, drink a lot of liquids and I'd be okay in a day or two. "A lot of this bug is going around Rome," he said. When he left I asked Mary if she didn't agree with me—that I should be on my way to America for treatment. "Wait! I'll show you his bill," she said.
