21 Burley Plant Workers Hospitalized From Fumes

BURLEY, Jan. 27—Approximately 21 employees of the A and P Tea company's local potato processing plant were taken to the Cassia Memorial hospital this morning after being overcome by gas. Three were reported in a state of semi-consciousness. Seven were sent home after checkups by physicians, but the remaining 13, including three men, were being kept at the hospital under oxygen treatment. Airmen Greeted By Families and Chief Executive

WASHINGTON, Jan. 27 (UPI)—Two American airmen flew home today to a personal welcome from President Kennedy and a joyous reunion with their wives after seven months in a Russian prison. An air force constabulary carrying the RB47 fliers, Capt. John R. McKone and Freeman Bruce Olmstead, landed at nearby Andrews airbase, where Soviet Premier Nikita S. Khrushchev first set foot on American soil in 1959. McKone and Olmstead, who were shot down by red jets over the Barents sea last July 1, stepped from the white-painted plane into the arms of their wives.

Joint Unit Claims State Can Operate Without More Tax

BOISE, Jan. 27 (UPI)—Additional taxes will not be necessary to operate the state the next two years, the joint senate finance-house appropriations committee announced today. Sen. K. C. Barlow, R., Cassia, joint committee chairman, and Rep. Pete Cenarrusa, R., Blaine, said the appropriations schedule would be acceptable to all members of the legislature. However, the schedule by the joint committee would not include the building program. A bill to start the program passed the house yesterday and calls for increase of the beer and cigarette taxes.

Captain Accepts Navy Protection

SAN JUAN, Puerto Rico, Jan. 27 (UPI)—Rebel leader Henrique Galvao radioed today from the hijacked liner Santa Maria that he would "accept" U. S. navy protection against Portuguese warships while taking his 620 captive passengers to an undisclosed port. Galvao, in a message intercepted here by the navy, said he would "land passengers near the South American or West African port, giving preference to Africa" if he were guaranteed that the ship and his followers would not be captured. The message, in imperfect English, also agreed to a U. S. navy suggestion that American officers confer aboard the ship on the disposition of the passengers, 42 of whom are Americans. He said he accepted the Americans' right to protect their nationals.

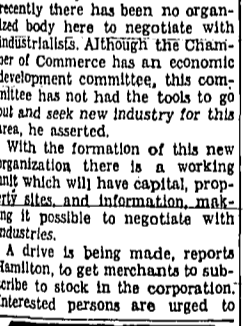

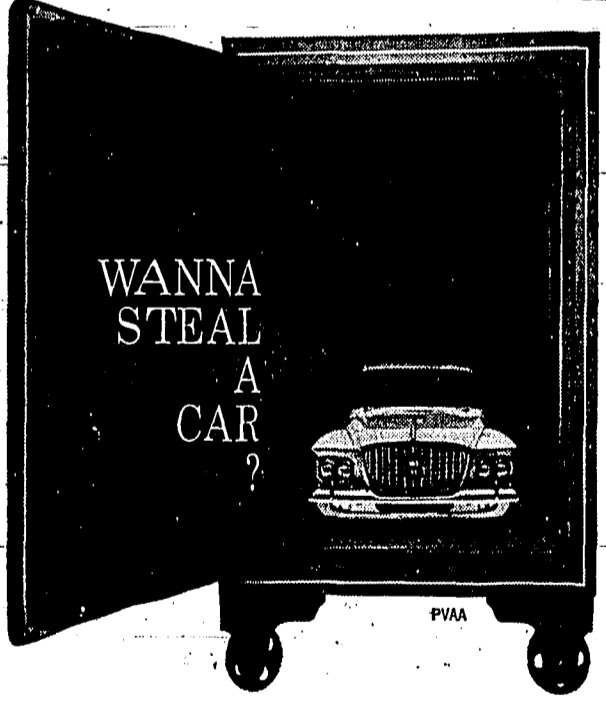

Cassia's 1961 Funds Lower Than in 1960

BURLEY, Jan. 27—Cassia county's budget for 1961 has been set at \$171,600.33 by the county commissioners, states Frank Kearns, county clerk.

Last year's budget was for \$183,575.50. The reduction is because the amount set aside for revaluation of the county's property is \$13,000 and this amount comes under a separate levy than the general expense levy.

Other items under a separate levy are hospital and charity salaries and wages \$4,000, expenses \$41,000, total \$45,000; fair and exhibits salaries and wages, \$2,500; expenses \$9,500, total \$12,000; roads and bridge salaries and wages, \$7,500; expenses \$5,726.80, total \$13,226.80; weed eradication salaries and wages \$1,000, expenses \$3,200, total \$4,200; bond interest and redemption, total \$31,247.25.

One big change in the budget is the amount allowed for elections. Only \$100 is in this year's budget compared to \$5,369.74 last year.

This year's budget includes clerk, recorder salaries and auditor, other expenses \$1,900, wages, \$18,200; district court salaries and wages, \$5,000; other expenses, \$3,300, total \$8,300; sheriff, salaries and wages, \$19,710; other expenses, \$6,766; total \$26,476; assessor salaries and wages, \$12,550; other expenses, \$3,900, total \$16,450.

Treasurer salaries and wages, \$11,580; other expenses, \$2,425, total \$14,005; prosecuting attorney salaries and wages, \$5,020; other expenses, \$2,425, total \$7,445; county commissioners salaries and wages, \$1,000, total \$1,000; agriculture extension service salaries and wages, \$5,320; other expenses, \$3,500, total \$8,820; department of public health salaries and wages, \$8,880; other expenses, \$630, total \$9,510; coroner salaries and wages, \$300; other expenses, \$500, total \$800.

Other items of the budget include probate court salaries and wages, \$6,010; other expenses, \$1,375, total \$7,385; justice court salaries and wages, \$5,750; other expenses, \$1,425, total \$7,175; county building salaries and wages, \$3,500; other expenses, \$21,883.33, total \$25,383.33.

Total for salaries and wages is \$112,000 with \$59,600.22 for other expenses, making a total of \$171,600.33.

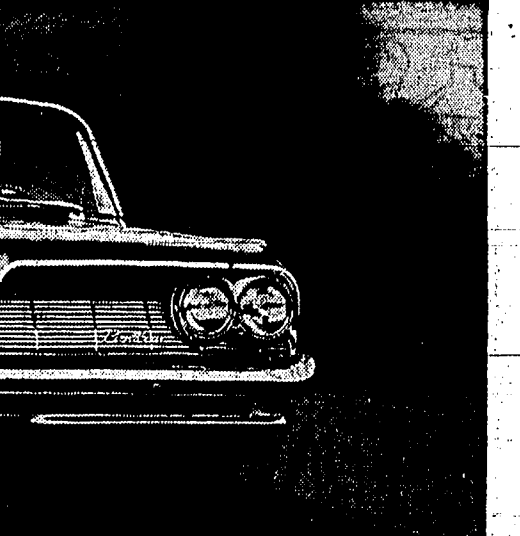

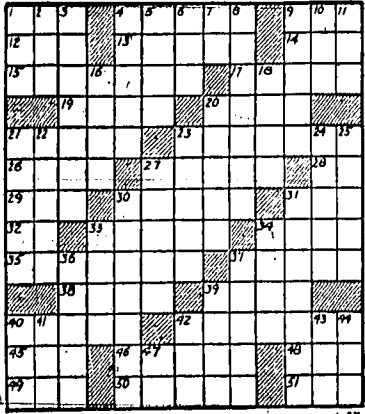

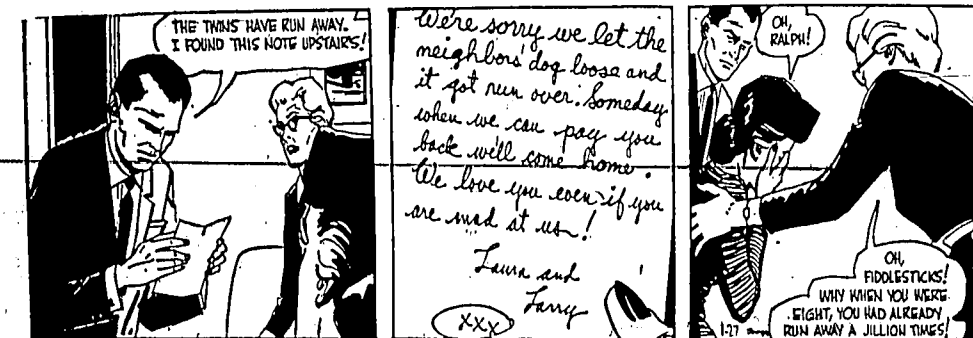
