# Lawyers Note Parochial Aid May Be Legal

WASHINGTON, March 29—Federal administration lawyers Kennedy and Rosen announced yesterday that a federal ban on parochial aid to schools for special aid to Catholic schools for religious teaching may be constitutional.

They emphasized that solid grounds exist to support Kennedy's position that outright grants of unrestricted loans to parochial and other private schools are not unconstitutional. They applied the same reasoning to tuition payments for church school pupils.

Asked by the committee attorneys in consultation with the Justice department, expressed these views in a report to Chairman Kennedy in a report to the Senate education subcommittee.

More than \$500 million of federal aid is now being provided for parochial schools. Kennedy is the sponsor of the \$1 billion, 50 cent school program.

The administration proposal would benefit parochial schools, Roman Catholic schools, and any parochial school leaders have said that such aid would be discriminatory and encouraged their opposition to the program.

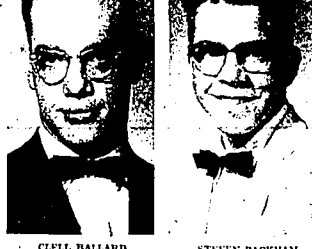

Line Hard to Draw

HAVANA, March 29—Premier Fidel Castro said yesterday that if the program of his revolutionary regime is communitarian he is in favor of communism.

In a 2 1/2-hour speech to the Association of Young People, Castro said his government had given bread to farmers, converted barracks into schools, eliminated unemployment and improved housing for the poor.

"If this communism then we're in favor of it," he said. "At least they can't say we didn't comply with the mandate of the Bible which says everyone should earn his bread by the sweat of his brow."

"We have seen anything more similar to the Bible passage . . . than the position of the Russian revolution that he who does not work does not eat."

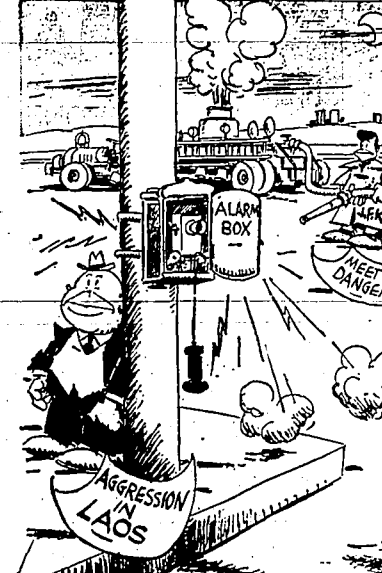

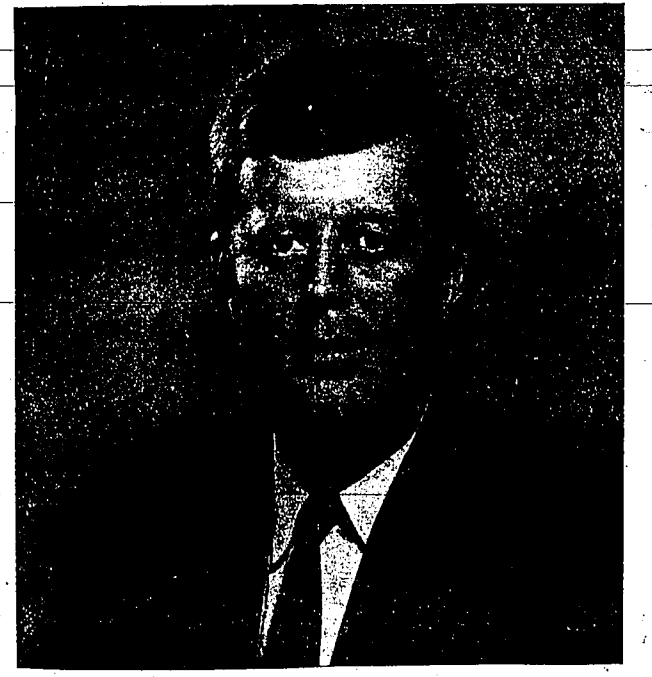

### Wreckage of Plane Found In Australia

SYDNEY, Australia, March 28.—Army search parties have found the wreckage of a U.S. World War II aircraft in the New Guinea jungle.

Five were Thunderbolt fighters and the other a C47 transport containing the skeletons of 14 men, including the pilot and two Japanese. The wreckage of an Australian Zep fighter and an Australian bomber fighter with the pilot's body still at the controls also were found.

The wreckage of the planes was discovered within the last three weeks by parties searching for a light plane that disappeared on a flight to Port Moresby on March 11.

All the aircraft were found in the central highland area. The wreckage was spotted from the air and planes were sent to the spot. One patrol took 17 1/2 days to reach the wreckage, 18 miles of jungle to reach the C47 wreck. It was 20 miles northeast of Port Moresby.

The pilot in a radio message said the fuselage of the freighter was almost intact and a fuel tank in the fuselage appeared to be in good condition.

There was no information here about the identity of the men who died in the C47 crash, but it was pointed out here that they could be Americans or Australians being ferried in the U.S. transport.

### Dog Licenses Are Available At City Hall

Dog licenses to replace current licenses which expire April 30 are available at the city clerk's office in the city hall, reports Mrs. Constance Lester, city clerk.

The new license is annotated with a blue color so it is distinguishable from the old license. It is a wearing of the correct color is noted by Mrs. Lester.

The old license is strongly retained to prevent the metal from being used where it is attached to the dog, thus providing additional safeguards against its use.

All dogs 6 months old and older must be licensed. The fee is \$4 for each male or spayed female and \$3 for each unspayed female. Mrs. Lester said each dog owner is required to provide each dog with a collar to attach the license with a collar tag. Replacement tags may be obtained for a lost tag. The tags cannot be transferred from one animal to another, she noted, that no refund will be made on the license fee because of the owner's leaving.

Before the expiration of the license period, rabies vaccinations are required by the time the dog is 6 months old and every 2 years afterwards. The rabies tag must be affixed to the collar and worn at all times.

Dogs may not run at large from sundown to sunrise.

License tags are found without a license or without an anti-rabies vaccination tag or running at large from sundown to sunrise, dogs will be impounded. Owner tags will be returned by paying fine to the city.

### Massive Retaliation Traded For Balanced Force System

WASHINGTON, March 29 (AP)—President Kennedy has officially discarded massive retaliation as the nation's all-purpose war deterrent.

In its place, Kennedy prescribed a new strategy of nuclear deterrence to congress the application of what military men call the "balanced force concept."

It means the United States should be equally prepared for any war—big, little or no-between.

While Kennedy has indicated dissatisfaction in the past with the size and shape of the national armed forces, the remedy he ordered is not original with him.

It may be only coincidence, but Kennedy's striking the President recommended was outlined by Gen. Maxwell D. Taylor, former army chief of staff, in the January issue of Foreign Affairs Quarterly.

Taylor fought a long and losing battle against the Eisenhower doctrine of "more bang for a buck."

"This brought him into conflict with the air force—the proponents of the theory that an overwhelming nuclear strike force is the best guarantee against wars, large and small.

While this fight was going on, the air force steadily gave more powerful and the army and navy demanded a post bordering on interdependence in limited ways—that is in non-nuclear situations.

Until now, the air force has claimed the role as the chief strategic deterrent arm of the United States.

Now it seems that the Air Force is going to have to share its strategic role with the navy, and the army is to be upgraded to a role approaching equality with the formations of military posture.

In brief, Kennedy apparently has adopted the Taylor theory in its entirety.



### U.S. Citizens Have Fun in Slump Year

**NEW YORK, March 29 (AP)—**The slowdown in the nation's business activity this past year did not keep Americans from enjoying themselves.

They continued to visit amusement parks, kiddieland, miniature golf courses, self-driving ranges, drive-in theaters, skating rinks, commercial swimming areas and other tourist attractions.

And they spent more money than ever before, some 21 billion dollars, according to the publication Amusement Business.

The magazine's fourth annual market analysis showed that attendance at these permanently located facilities increased by 23 million last year to 2,077,000,000. This attendance rise accounted for half of the 75 million dollar increase in gross receipts. The total came from a two-cent rise in average per patron spending to \$1.20.

When other elements of the total amusement market—fair, circuses, carnivals, arenas, auditoriums and stadiums—are included, the total amusement industry receipts last year were 28 billion dollars.

### Free, too

**NEW YORK, March 29 (AP)—**A radio broadcast transmission device to make ordinary home receivers sound much like television-in-itself equipment—at no cost to homeowner—was announced yesterday by the American Broadcasting company.

The invention will be put into operation soon at ABC's radio station here, WABC. The network expects to make it available to other ABC stations at a later date.

ABC said the new device—the result of two years' work by network engineers—is a dynamic equalizer which will virtually enable home radios to sound like high fidelity instruments.

**PORTLAND, March 29 (AP)—**The federal power commission hearing on rival dam applications for the Snake River of the Snake river valley ended yesterday.

### Mormons Invading England With Zeal, Bible, U.S. Sports

LONDON, March 29 (NPA)—It's called the Mormon invasion here. Not since John Wesley traveled 20,000 miles on horseback to spread Methodism in the 18th century has Britain seen anything quite like it.

Nearly every liner that docks at Southampton and every plane that arrives at London airport from the states have quotas of bright-eyed Mormon missionaries, most of them barely out of their teens.

They come to Britain armed with baseball bats, catchers' gloves and Bibles, and the zeal of their forefathers who trekked to Utah in primitive schooners.

They ring doorbells or push religious tracts under the doors in the ugly industrial Midlands towns. They cycle down the narrow, cobble-streets of Welsh mining villages.

They climb dusty attic or invade crumbling churches to microfilm parish registers, containing the names of their British ancestors. (The Mormons believe in various baptism—baptism of the water, the word of the church's worthy dead) as they call it—of those who died prior to 1830, before the word of the church's founder, Prophet Joseph Smith, was spread.

And, above all, they introduce American sports.

John Wesley is said to have preached 40,000 Methodist sermons in his lifetime; today's Mormon missionaries find that they make more recruits by simply taking a baseball bat and into the nearest park or playing field.

In no time at all, they have a crowd of British kids around them who prove equally receptive to the Bible and the mysteries of the sport.

Thanks to this combination, the Mormon invasion is getting results. In the past two years this LDS church has nearly doubled its membership here to 25,000.

In the next three years the Mormons will build 50 new chapels in the British Isles at a total cost of 30 million dollars.

First of these new chapels, the million dollar Hyde Park chapel, was opened in the heart of London that month. A functionally modern building, it boasts a 90-foot tower, with a 40-foot golden spire; it also has one of the best pipe organs in London.

Typical of the young Mormon missionaries operating in Britain is May Ann Clyde, 21, daughter of the governor of Utah, who arrived here in January for an 18-month tour of duty. Her first assignment: Washington (population 1,675) in Hampshire.

Mia Clyde, an attractive, blue-eyed university graduate, said the Mormons find Britain such a fertile field for conversion "because we are so youthful in our outlook. Young people find that our church is not just a force to go to on Sunday, but a whole way of life."

"We offer them a sports program, classes in drama, choral singing, dancing, as well as Bible lessons. In the Mormon church everyone participates."

The Mormons made their first converts in Britain in 1837, so why did the mother church wait for 124 years before making the big recruiting drive in Britain?

T. Bowring Woodbury, a Kansas investment banker arriving as unpaid mission president here, says: "First of all, you must realize that 50 per cent of American Mormons are of British descent."

"Secondly, the opening of a British Mormon temple in Lincolnshire, Surrey, in 1958, marked the beginning of a new era here. Until that time British Mormons had to journey to the temples in America in order to take part in various religious ceremonies. Now we encourage them to remain at home and to build up congregations in their own communities."

So America now sends missionaries to Britain; there'll be 600 by June.

### In Line Firm's Employees Receive Trophies

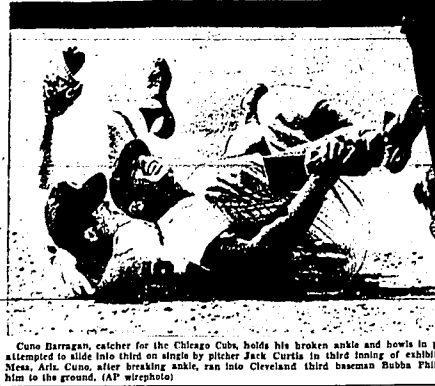
