Perhaps the best plan would be to improve available roads from the Hagerman valley area, providing suit-able directional signs. It would seem there is little use in preserving this part of the old Oregon Trail if the only people who can see it are alline passengers. Idaho showld be able to preserve the Trail and capitalize on it at the same time. For imfaince, it would be an entarul tourist at-traction to improve available roads to the area ending in a parking lot with a suit-ble monument and explanatory plaque, where the fading ruts lead off into the west... Unless the NFO has a wide-spread, disciplined membership in the 12 states, it could handly hope for anything except publicity.
