Possible moves included use of allied troops in Laos or South Viet Nam and possible U.N. action.

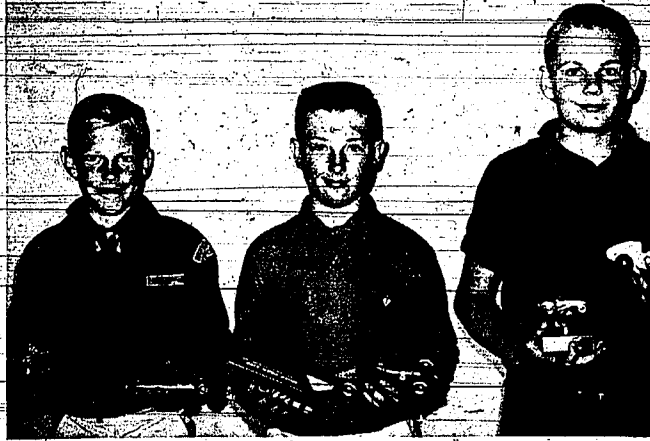

Riot Is Over As Students Go to Class

GALETON, Tex., May 1 — Thousands of college students who played during Galveston's splash day festival over the weekend went back to classes today and officials breathed a sigh of relief. Policemen, however, were still on duty and Texas rangers patrolled the downtown streets and the beach area in drive-through yesterday. The festival which officially opened the Galveston beaches and the summer tourist season in the Gulf coast, ended with a rain on Saturday night.
