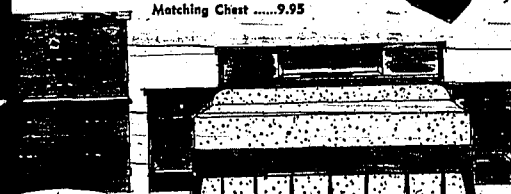

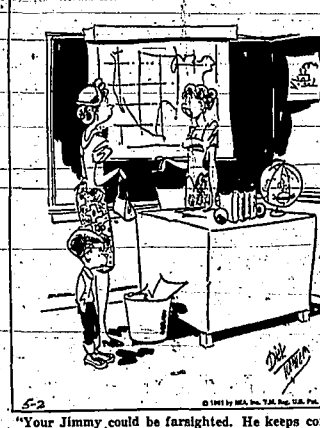

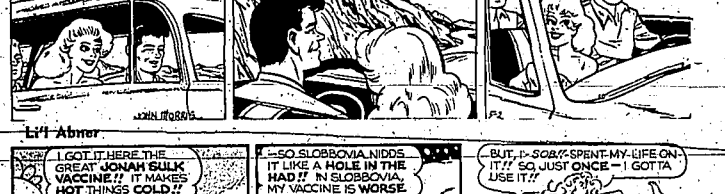

She seemed very calm though she has heard she admitted being a little apprehensive over her son rocketing through space. When told that Alan had been selected, she replied promptly, 'Good, that's what he wanted.'"

### 5 Tuberculosis Cases Reported

BOISE, May 2 (U)—Five cases of tuberculosis reported in Idaho last week brought the 1961 total to 26 compared with 39 cases a year ago this date. State Health Administrator T. O. Carver said this does not indicate an increasing tuberculosis problem since for the comparable time last year 1960, 44 cases had been diagnosed. "The new tuberculosis program beginning effective and the transition period from the mass X-ray program to the skin test program has been accomplished," Dr. Carver said. There was no other significant change in the number of other diseases reported last week. Tuberculosis reported last week totaled 214 with 54 physicians reporting and another 166 not reporting.

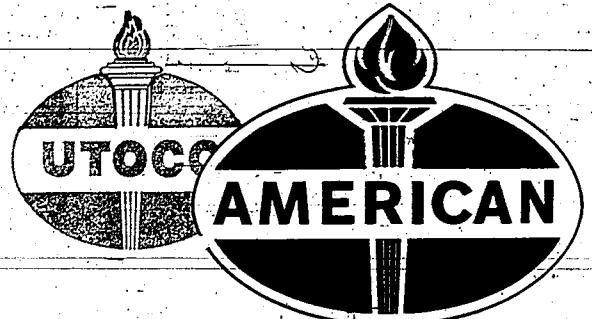
