Spy Sent To Prison 42 Years

LONDON, May 3 (UPI)—A British diplomat pleaded guilty today of spying for Russia since he emerged from Communist North Korean captivity eight years ago.

George Blake, 35, was sentenced in the Old Bailey court to 42 years in the electric chair for espionage after being imprisoned in British peacetime history.

Mr. Blake, Sir Reginald Manderham-Buller said the suave, dark-haired diplomat had made a "big mistake" after his arrest in Beirut three weeks ago.

A foreign office spokesman said Blake was vice consul in Korea when invading North Koreans in January 1950.

Blake, who until recently sported a scraggly beard, was released by Communist North Korea in London last July 1953.

In court the prosecution said the voluntarily being betraying British secrets to the Russians while in Communist North Korea.

London newspapers reported that Blake "brainwashed" and became a Communist while in North Korea custody.

Manderham-Buller said Blake admitted passing the Russians a "mass" of "very important" information on the defense of the United Kingdom, including the location of the Royal Air Force's nuclear weapons.

Company Is Starting New Burley Plant

BURLEY, May 3—Our company officials decided to locate a new plant in Burley because it is the business center of the Mini-Cassia area and it also places us close to Twin Falls," announced Cecil Shaw, superintendent-manager of the Concrete Products company, Inc., at the Burley Chamber of Commerce luncheon meeting Monday at Council Roy's.

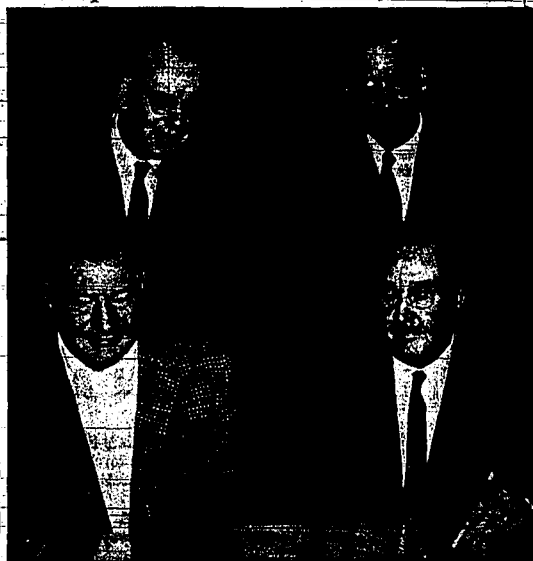
"The company has operations at Idaho Falls, Pocatello and Rupert. We have received a warm, friendly welcome here and have entered with interest the progress of Burley. We also have advised others to settle here," he declared.

"More than 80 per cent of our business out of the little sales yard in Rupert goes to Burley and our volume became too great to be handled there. During this year and next we have sewer jobs in Burley and Twin Falls totaling more than \$300,000, and in 1965 we have a job with the state highway department, district two, for sewer construction totaling 11 million dollars," he reported.

Shaw said 75 per cent of all sales of pipe comes back into the community. Construction on the plant was begun about a month ago and will be completed in another month. The site covers 17 acres at Farmer's corner, two miles south of Burley. The 12,000-square-foot plant will be of cinder block construction with pre-stressed roof of concrete. The plant will make concrete pipe of all kinds, including irrigation, culvert, drainage and sewer from six to 24 inches in diameter and from three to eight feet in length. They also produce septic tanks and manholes. The plant will have 20 employees.

"The plant" will be a \$200,000 construction and the company has \$500,000 standing for line construction at the site. The office will be completed at a later date. The Rupert yard will operate as a sales yard, he explained.

WASHINGTON, May 3—An air force official said last night the defense department and the national aeronautics and space administration will attempt to limit overtime pay at missile construction sites.

The past of United States policy toward Cuba becomes more clear as the invasion post-mortem continues.

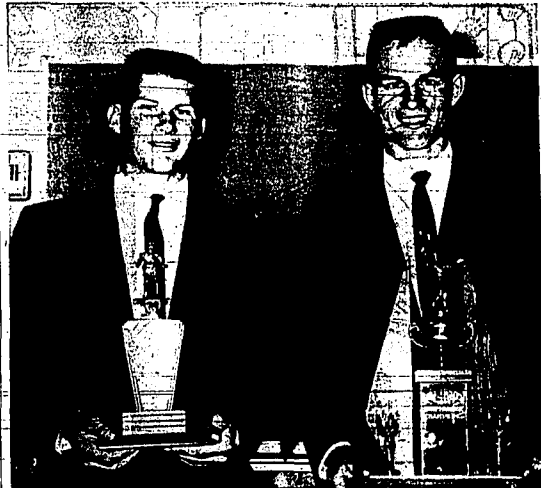

SPRINGFIELD, Ill., May 3 (AP)—Robert O. Klein, who was press secretary to former President Richard M. Nixon, has challenged whether he is to be considered the newspapers' "critic" of the Kennedy administration.

"This is blackmail—raw blackmail. The implication would be that newspapers that own television stations are considered friendly to the administration would be spared; but there is a cut to be held over the heads of the large newspaper operators who may be critical of young Bobby or his brother."

Carl Braden, Louisville, Ky., whose release the bi-racial leaders are demanding was jailed Monday along with Frank Wilkinson, Los Angeles. The two were convicted by a federal jury in Atlanta in early 1959 for refusing to tell the house committee whether they were communists.

They surrendered Monday to a U.S. marshal three hours after their final appeal was denied by a federal judge in Newman, Ga. The U.S. supreme court recently denied their appeals against the one-year prison sentence.

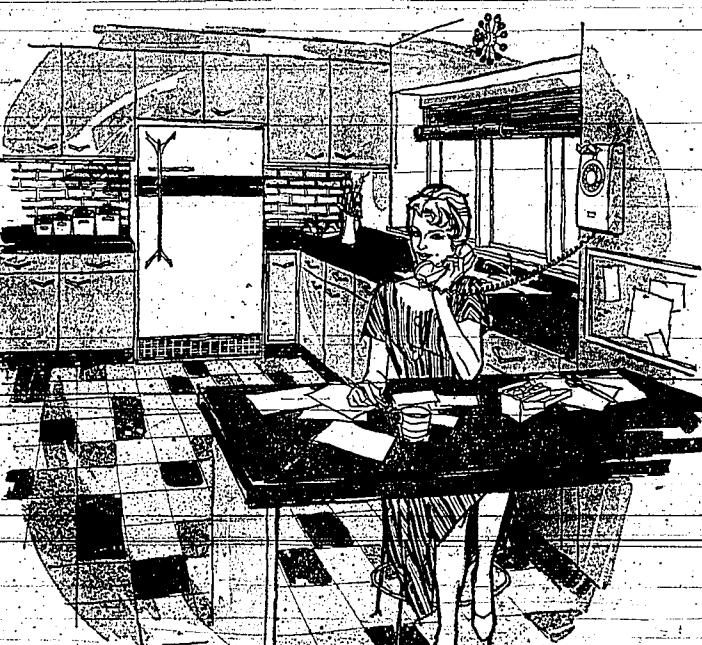

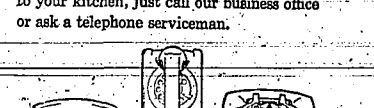
