Midwest Floods Crack Barriers, Many Homeless

Swollen creeks and rivers cracked levees and left thousands of persons homeless today, including 1,250 families in a five-state rain and flood-ravaged area of the Midwest. Twenty-five dams and millions of dollars in damage were left in the wake of rampaging waters in parts of Missouri, Indiana, Kansas, Kentucky and southern Illinois. Five persons are missing in the five-state area, 113 persons are injured, and 68 hospitalized. Red Cross rescue workers converted barracks, garages and civic buildings into emergency shelters. They fed around the clock for food, medicine, orders for clothing and household necessities and shelter to refugees from 34 counties in the stricken area. High waters closed schools and business places, isolated many communities and made impassable many major and secondary roads.

The threat of typhoid fever from contaminated drainage waters worried officials in many midwestern communities.

Through the night river town dwellers and flood areas battled the churning waters. Volunteer workers, civil defense and national guard units were assigned to the flood holds.

Near Washington, Ind., the wall for the first time broke around an earthen levee, but nearby workers hoped that a two-foot wall of water would hold back the flood crest. Thirty national guard units and volunteers filled the breach.

The sandbagging crew totaled almost 400 during the night as persons were rescued from their homes.

Flood conditions paralyzed business and industry in a few bright spots in the murky water.

No rain splashed across the water opening at the bridge. The weather was the immediate outlook for most areas. The worst splashing was in some sections in Ohio and Oklahoma, many streams and rivers were bank full but the threat of major flooding appeared easing.

As the rains halted in the middle of the night, a severe storm for four or five days, stormy weather spread into eastern sections of the country.

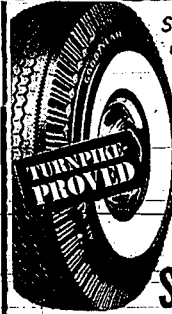

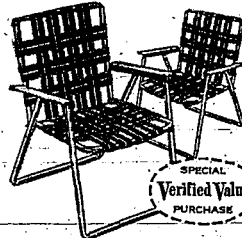

Atomic Future

France continues to test atomic bombs in the Sahara desert and there is speculation around the world about how soon the Communists will have a workable atomic bomb. With continued progress and education in the science of nuclear weapons, it may be possible eventually for even small nations to build such bombs.

An additional national which managed to build an atomic bomb increases the danger of nuclear conflict. News reports indicate that only four nations have the potential now to produce today's ultimate weapon, the U.S. Russia, Britain and France. America and Russia, the two principal, are gripped in a world-wide "cold war" struggle just as bitter in many respects as a fighting war.

Yet there is restraint among the nations that have the bomb, a restraint resulting, perhaps, from the awareness of the consequences of atomic warfare.

There is a difference in nations, even as there is a difference in men. As more nations master the use of atomic weapons, atomic weapons will be governed by the same restraint that applies to the present atomic powers? That's a question that one day will become a reality.

Back in 1945, the United States led the present race for atomic weapons. Thousands upon thousands of people died in two explosions that brought a shattering end to World War II. Possibly use of the bomb saved more lives than were lost by ending the war. However, the precedent was set.

Another precedent was set in World War II when poison gases were used on a large-scale basis for the first time in warfare. For years the world feared gas would be used even more extensively in any new conflict. Those fears did not materialize in World War II.

Even so, gas masks were standard equipment of troops in World War II. As the war progressed, discarded gas masks became a common sight, yet for the most part the conflict against atomic warfare was readily avoidable if needed.

Likewise with the atomic bomb, there is a chance that it will never again be used, yet no one can make such an assumption safely. Wars are planned and fought against the possible use of poison gases. Precautions must be set up in event nuclear weapons are used. Perhaps those very safeguards combined with the certainty of reprisal, will do more than anything else to bar future use of the bomb.

The difference is that gas warfare precautions were confined to the military while safeguards against A-bombs are largely the responsibility of civilians.

GUARD AGAINST FIRE

Drought conditions create fire hazards and Idaho may be facing one of its worst fire seasons this year to go along with a record dry spell. At any rate, the state is preparing for fire season early and long than last year and 1960 was the worst in 20 seasons.

Dousing a small fire along a ditchbank or on a vacant city lot is one thing, but it's quite another to control a fire raging across miles of open sagebrush or in heavy timber. Fighting such a blaze requires organization, manpower, machines and teamwork. So forest service and bureau of land management personnel are making plans now for the fire season.

In the case of fires blowing across sagebrush desert, many people see no reason for attempting control. "Why don't they just let the sagebrush burn?" they ask. If it were just a matter of sagebrush, undoubtedly it would be better to burn. But there are matters of rangeland, erosion and possible damage to private property, to list a few side effects.

Much public range is classified for grazing even though it may appear that the land supports little or nothing except sagebrush. However, the lowly sage is the plant that plays a vital part in preventing wind erosion. With it gone, the soil would blow away and nothing would grow. So in cases of burns early in the season, it is better to denude areas to grass to prevent erosion. It is easier to recognize the value of timbered areas and the need for fire-protection.

Everyone should take an interest in preventing the national disaster of fire. It is whether you drive a car or on a deer-hunting way or camping in isolated timber regions. Carelessly discarded cigarettes or matches cause too many fires.

Outside the immediate cost of fire fighting, a range of fire treatments that frequently cannot be repaired by either Nature or man in a normal life span.

Caution with fire is sensible and thrifty.

GOOD CREDIT RATING

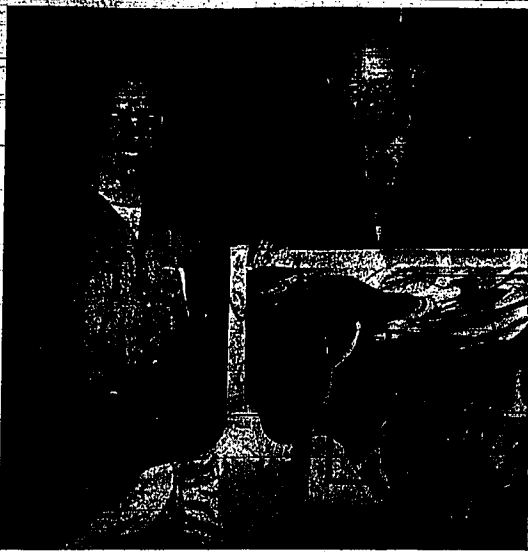

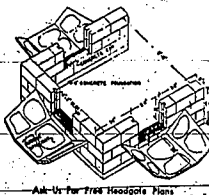

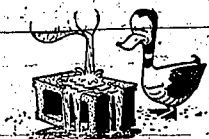

April Is Dry; Water Supply Still Critical

BOISE, May 10 (U)—The irrigation water supply for southern Idaho, eastern Oregon and western Wyoming remains critical as a result of a dry April, the U.S. soil conservation service reports.

Mortlan W. Nelson, snow survey supervisor of the Columbia River basin, said the snow pack melted normally during the month, "but because of the dry soils beneath it, it did not produce normal runoff."

He said the northern portion of the basin in Canada, northern Idaho, Washington and northern Montana will likely have a near-normal water supply outlook for the season.

The soil moisture status below the snow line for the month of April, Nelson said. Forecasts of inflow on the main stem of the Snake river, Boise and Payette rivers were reduced but reservoir-stored water will make up for most of the deficiency in streamflow for 1961.

The smaller rivers and tributaries to the Snake river in Idaho and Oregon face a serious water shortage because of the low reservoir carry-over, the dry soil, the light snow pack and low precipitation in April, the report showed.
