## Week-End Floods Siege Continues in Midwestern States

Sanitizing crews worked around the clock and new towns weaned off a water legacy today in the Midwest's week-long battle against floods. The floods approached record levels in Missouri, Illinois and Indiana. They threatened a serious planting delay in the heart of the nation's farm belt. Hundreds of families were still homeless. The death of a 6-year-old Marion, Ill., boy who drowned while playing with a toy sailboat by the creek's total of storm and flood fatalities is 38.

The town of Carmi, Ill., became a "ghost town" as the floods advanced. National guardsmen, civil defense workers, police and volunteers worked through the night and into the day along the levees holding back the record-breaking crest of the Little Wabash river.

## Shortages of Water Supply Are Stressed

BOISE, May 11 (UPI)—State Reclamation Engineer George E. Carleton today urged farmers to plant only those crops which can be matured with the probable amount of water which will be available.

He emphasized that water runoff predictions beginning last winter have pointed to a serious shortage on southern Idaho's irrigated farmlands.

"It's not Carter said, 'but we've got to make the best of it. Surely the farmer has more control over the water than he has over the weather.'"

He suggested that if the outlook for the water supply is not bright enough, water to meet normal needs, the individual farmer should consider the possibility of using water to irrigate only a portion of the area planted.

He said it is impossible, without court action, to change provisions of decrees which give priority to water rights. "The only way to get around this is to plant crops which require less water," he said. "This right might be satisfied, he said, even if it means that water to later-developed areas."

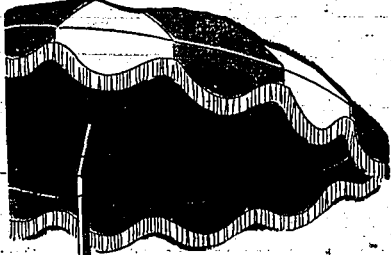

Best Possible Penalty

Cassia county's probate judge, Vern Carter, picked the best possible penalty when three 16-year-old youths appeared before him on charges of littering painted the town red.

The judge promptly ordered the three to remove the paint they had sprayed on some of the 20 homes and then to pay any damage that couldn't be solved by removal of the paint.

When the sentence is executed, the judge specified the three youngsters would remain wards of the court until they had removed the paint and then they will appear in court again to hear final disposition of their cases.

In a series of vandalism, there is nothing more likely to deter a would-be vandal than the knowledge he will have to work to remove or rectify the damage.

There might be some merit in greater use of the work penalties. Here and there judges are showing more inclination to pronounce work penalties.

A speeding driver who had to mow the lawn at the city park, for instance, would be more likely to mow longer than merely shelling out \$10 for a fine.

FISH AND POLITICS

Peculiar to the Columbia basin region is the joint problem of high dams and fisheries resources. Perhaps the most peculiar is the continued salmon and steelhead swim up the Columbia river and smack dab into the middle-of-the-public-private power argument.

With all the concern expressed over the fish caught in the middle, it would seem strange that the federal government, or perhaps too many of the people involved are more interested in politics.
