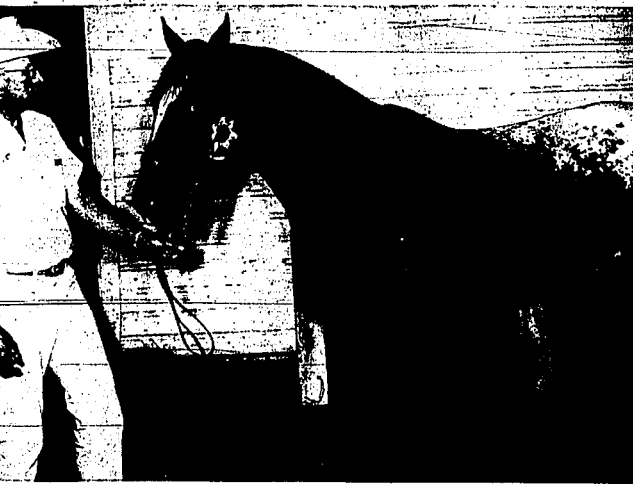

The conference, attended by attorneys general from the 50 states, began and Puerto Rico, continues through Wednesday at the Hotel Roosevelt here.



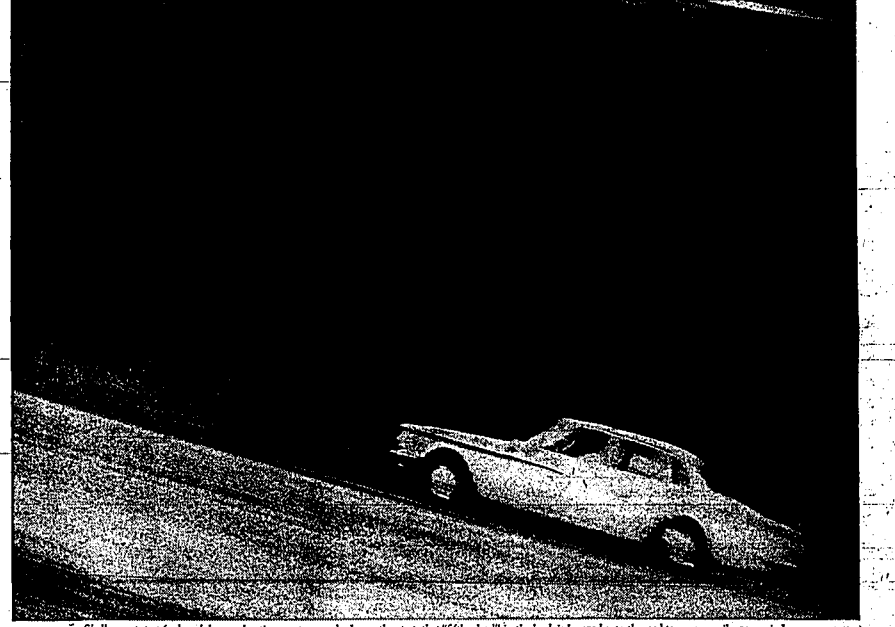

Demos Hope for Passage of Bill

WASHINGTON, June 12 (UPI)—Democratic farm leaders in congress are showing new confidence in their chance to pass a compromise version of the administration's farm bill.

The basic purpose of the bill is to set up a new, speedier, more flexible procedure for developing programs to control farm production and boost farm income.

Agriculture Secretary Orville L. Freeman and his backers say that with urban domination of congress growing, this may be the last chance to provide for workable new farm commodity programs.

Critics of the bill say it would give the secretary power to clamp rigid controls on all American farmers, and would strip congress of its traditional power to shape farm programs.

House farm leaders have developed the outline of a modified version of Freeman's proposal which they hope will eliminate the objections of some Southern Democrats and produce near-solid Democratic backing for the bill in the house-agriculture committee.
