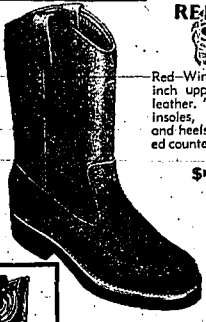

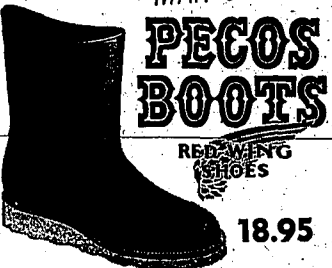

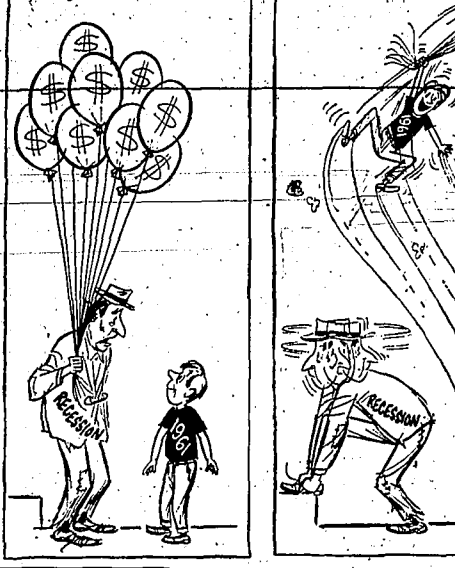

### Indians Meet To Vote Upon U. S. Policies

CHICAGO, June 19 (AP)—Representatives of a half-million American Indians met today to vote on an "Indian declaration of purpose" calling the federal government to "get off our backs" on many points.

The declaration, drafted by a steering committee, said the government assumed obligations toward the Indians when it took away their lands. Treaties signed by representatives of both the government and the Indians, provided for the welfare of the tribes, the declaration said.

"The federal government has a moral responsibility to the Indians that cannot be terminated without their consent," the document said.

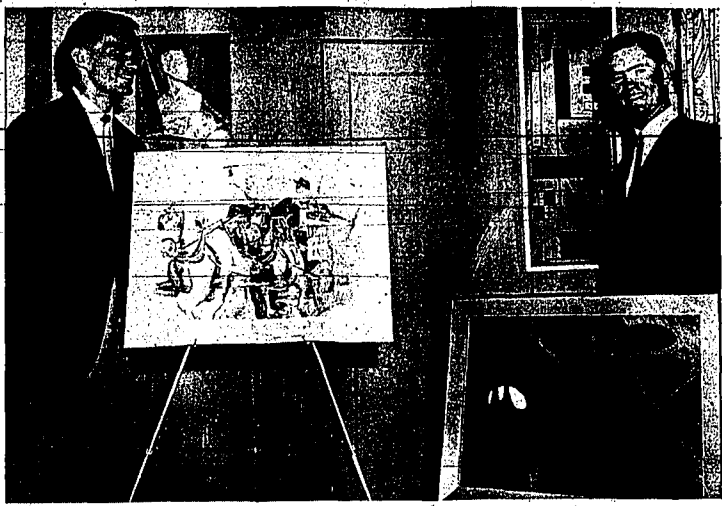
The final draft of the declaration will be sent to President Kennedy.

Indians attending the conference at the University of Chicago were disturbed by a policy adopted by congress in 1953 which sought to end federal control over Indians. The conference, which began a week ago, was attended by a thousand delegates representing virtually every tribe in the nation.

The declaration called for a "greater reorganization" of the Indian bureau of the federal government and asked for a new commissioner of Indian affairs "who is strong enough to carry out President Kennedy's campaign promises." Appointments within the Indian bureau should no longer be considered "political rewards," the declaration said.

"Indians are expressing themselves for the first time," said anthropologist G. D. Peck of the University of Chicago, one of the conference sponsors.

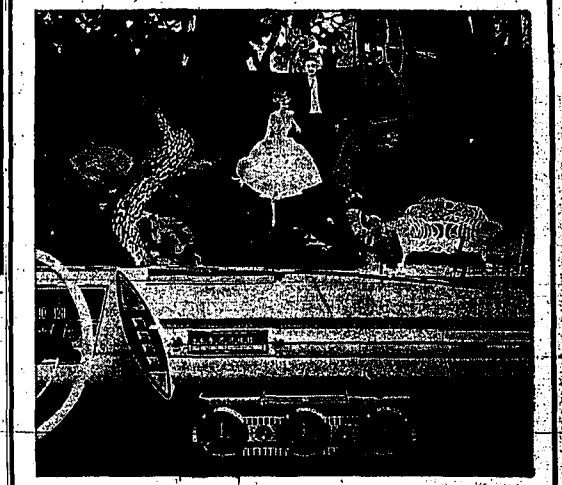

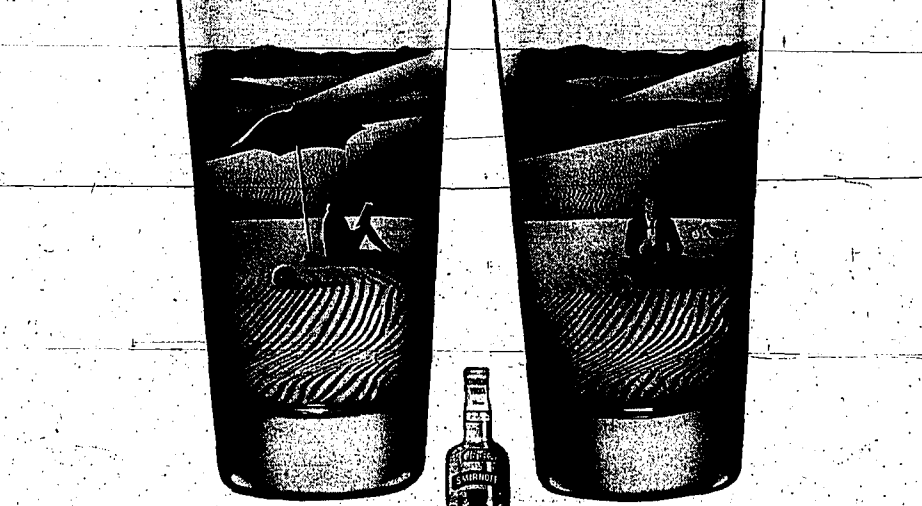

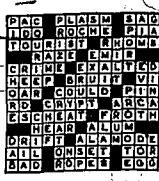
