Nuclear Testing Depends on U.S., Russian Claims

MOSCOW, June 21 (UPI)—Soviet Premier Nikita Khrushchev warned today that the United States breaks the current voluntary moratorium. "As soon as the United States resumes nuclear explosions, the Soviet Union will start testing its own nuclear weapons," Khrushchev said at a Kremlin gathering marking the 20th anniversary of the German invasion of Russia in World war II. "Quiet a few devices requiring practical testing have been developed in the Soviet Union."

Cassia Turns Down Levy by Slim Margin

BURLEY, June 21—Cassia county school districts voted against a three-mill additional levy Tuesday night. BOISE, June 21 (UPI)—The reclamation bureau today said it has no present prospect of bringing water to the Boise river valley. The report said Cascade reservoir was nearly full but will never reach capacity because the spring runoff was small. The reservoir has 12,000 acre feet of usable storage water—3,000 below capacity. Deadwood reservoir is reported in good shape with current storage of 18,000. No release of water is anticipated from Deadwood, officials said.

School Bond Law Ruled as Invalid By Idaho's Court

BOISE, June 21 (UPI)—The Idaho supreme court declared invalid yesterday the 1961 law permitting school districts operating high schools to continue their bonded indebtedness at 15 per cent of assessed valuation. The court's decision apparently scuttled a proposed \$1,235,000 Twin Falls bond issue for a new junior high school, an \$885,000 bond issue passed by the Bull school district last month for two new elementary schools and conversion of an existing school to a junior high school, and a proposed bond issue in Blaine county for new school construction.

Special Session Idea Not Backed

BOISE, June 21 (UPI)—Despite a state supreme court ruling invalidating the 15 per cent school bonding limitation, Idaho legislators generally feel the school districts can survive until another legislative session. Only a small per cent of lawmakers answering a United Press International poll could see the necessity of Gov. Robert E. Smylie calling an extraordinary session. And about the same number said maybe the solons should come back into another meeting to correct their mistake. The high court yesterday ruled the 1961 law unconstitutional. The act did not meet the constitutional requirements because it allowed the legislature to act after the session had closed.

Supplies for Peace Unit Are Sought

GENEVA, June 21 (UPI)—Canada today demanded that Russia supply the international commission in Laos with the planes and equipment it has urgently asked to police the truce. Canadian External Affairs Minister Howard Green said in a sharply worded statement to the United Nations conference that the ICG has not been able to make progress since the truce in Laos because of severe limitations on the number of non-munitions-directed PAV aircraft. Further, he said, the lack of transport and communications equipment was reducing the control body to a position of ineffectiveness. He said he had scheduled for July 10, he said he would have no comment until after the end of the summit.
