Reports Say Iraq Readies Invasion of Kuwait; New Mideast Crisis Is Feared

BEIRUT, Lebanon, June 30 (UPI)—Diplomatic sources said today reports from Baghdad indicated that Iraq is preparing its army for an attack on Kuwait. But there were no signs of massing of troops on the Iraq-Kuwait border, and travelers reported all was quiet there. Informed reports that Iraqi Premier Abdul Karim Qasim would launch an attack tomorrow, coupled with the announcement in London that British warships are steaming toward the Persian gulf to protect Kuwait, raised fears that the Mideast is heading for its gravest crisis in three years.

Magic Valley Spud Growers Concerned Over Effects of Prolonged Heat Wave

With the heat registering over 90 degrees for more than a week, growers of early spuds have had to be concerned about irrigating their fields—more so than growers of late spuds. In fields of "earlies" like those raised by Duane Ramseyer, north of Filer, some of the spuds already are the size of eggs and a hot sun can rough up these spuds here.

Ramseyer planted his potatoes during the first week in April. Plants are blooming and tubers growing and the prolonged heat can have a marked effect on quality. Last summer, Idaho produced about 10.5 thousand acres of early spuds, with a total yield of more than two million sacks. This year, there probably will be more late summer or early fall potatoes produced in Idaho.

NEW YORK—On his travels in the South of late I read in some of the northern papers that the attitude of the communists toward the riotous pogroms by interlopers from New York is a disgrace.

Faster and Faster

Track and field records are almost peculiar in a world that continues to place more and more emphasis on machines and devices designed and built by humans, rather than actual accomplishment of the humans themselves.

Although the new 100-yard dash is only one-tenth of a second faster than the former record, it represents a significant accomplishment because the man who set the record, Frank Wykoff, was not a professional athlete.

An Ohio State sprinter named Simpson first reached the 0.4 time in 1926, but Wykoff's time the following year was recognized as the world record. It took more than three decades to clip a mere two-tenths of a second off the record.

Actually, such new records don't mean sprinters are faster now than they were 30 years ago. Contributing factors include improved and better-fitting shoes, better track surfaces, and improved training methods.

That doesn't mean that records can be attributed mostly to improvements in equipment and mechanical and sociological advances. It means that the factors contributing a good deal to records, but the individual is still the one great consideration in setting any sort of record.

ANOTHER WORD

Another word has been found for the paralyzing complacency that grips the United States more firmly every day. Dr. Dana L. Farnsworth of Harvard university spoke on the problem at the American Medical Association meeting, declaring, "The great sickness of our age is aimlessness, boredom and a lack of meaning and purpose in living."

Senator Proposes Worldwide Chats

WASHINGTON, June 30 (UPI)—Sen. Alexander Wiley, R., Wis., has proposed worldwide television and radio chats in which President Kennedy and Soviet Premier Nikita S. Khrushchev would explain their positions. Wiley said in a Chicago radio broadcast that such talks "could result in better understanding of the respective approaches of East and West on the peace-threatening problems." He said such a plan would give the west an opportunity to "refute much of the illogical, self-serving propaganda of the communists" and "more effectively present Western proposals." "What have we to lose?" Wiley asked.

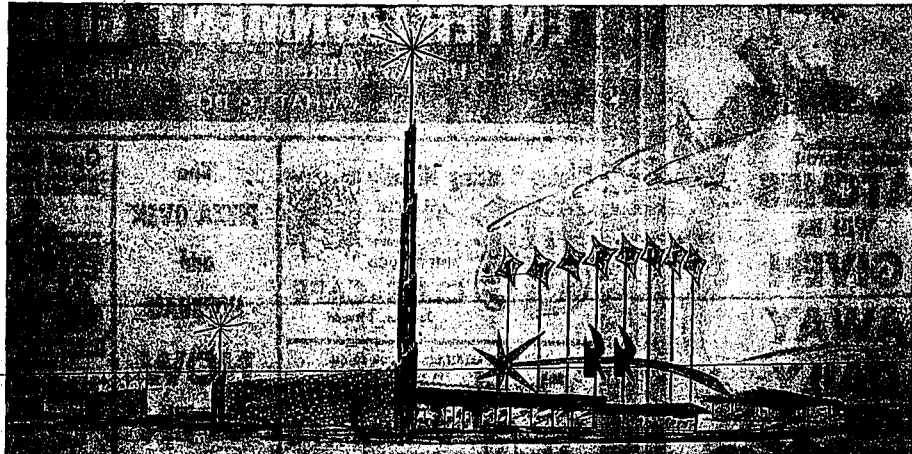

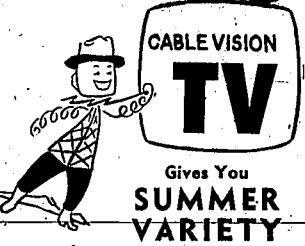

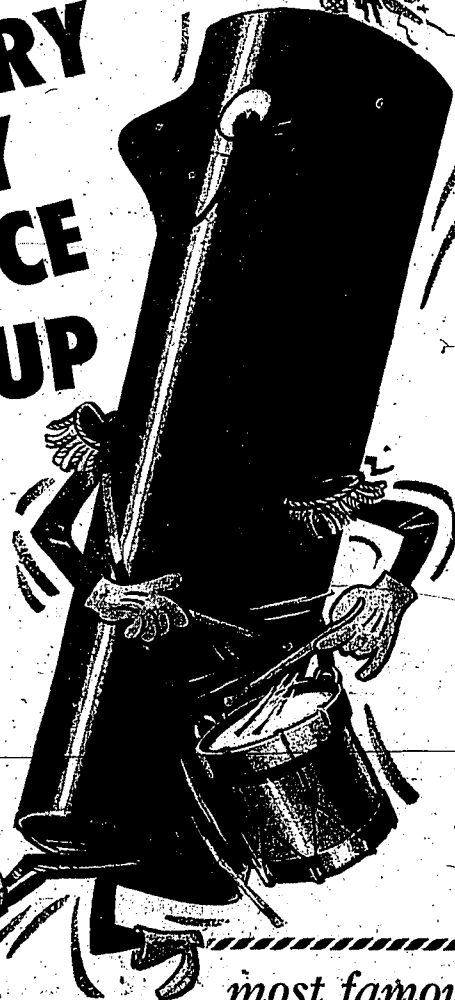
