Bridges, surprise speaker at the Teasdale party, said the international strikes triggered in the maritime strike drive were needed for an alliance to bring more stability to the industry. Another speaker, George Handman of the AFL-CIO Council of Textile Workers, praised Hoffa and the Teasdale party as setting ways gains and military.

Ernest Hemingway Dies Of Self-Inflicted Wound At His Home in Ketchum

(From Times-News Correspondent, Associated Press and United Press International)
KETCHUM, July 3.—The death early Sunday of famed author Ernest Hemingway, 61, went into the record officially today as "self-inflicted gunshot wound in the head" after a conference between Coroner Ray McGoldrick, Sheriff and Prosecutor V. K. Jonsson. They said there would be no inquest. The decision was made after the three officials conferred with Mrs. Hemingway. Officially, they did not label the author's death as either suicide or accidental. Following the conference with the officials, members of the family contacted the pastor of Our Lady of the Sacred Heart church, where there was no mention of the word as funeral. Tentatively, the funeral has been set here Friday night concluding services also planned here.

Hemingway Home Purchased From Topping

The family has been deluged with inquiries and they request that friends contribute a memento that offering to their favorite church. Mrs. Hemingway, who heard a shot, found the author dead about 7:30 a.m. Sunday. He was lying in his pajamas near the living room of their home with a double-barreled 12-gauge shotgun by his side. Rebels Seek Supports for Sahara Claim

PARIS, July 3 (AP)—Algerian rebel leaders sought Moroccan support today in their dispute with France over the Saharan Sahara desert.

Rebel Premier Ferhat Abbas and some of his aides flew into Rabat yesterday to confer with King Hassan II.

Their delegates are expected to begin talks soon with French government officials on the six-and-a-half-year-old Algerian war and establishing a sovereign Algeria.

One of the principal issues in contention is whether the Sahara is part of Algeria. France says it is not. The rebels say it is either North African territory or part of Morocco.

Yves Cochet, French ambassador to Morocco, said today that French troops and riot police kept a tight grip on the city today to try to prevent a repetition of the rebel-inspired rioting that resulted in 14 deaths and 10 wounded Saturday.

French officials anticipated the next big trouble would come when the rebel leaders, who have their headquarters at Tunis, have called for a "day of protest."

The demonstrations are aimed at President Charles De Gaulle's plan to partition Algeria into pro-rebel and pro-French sections unless the rebels come to terms on an acceptable solution for a future Algerian nation. This would include a Sahara settlement and guarantees for the safety of the outnumbered 1.1 million European settlers in Algeria.

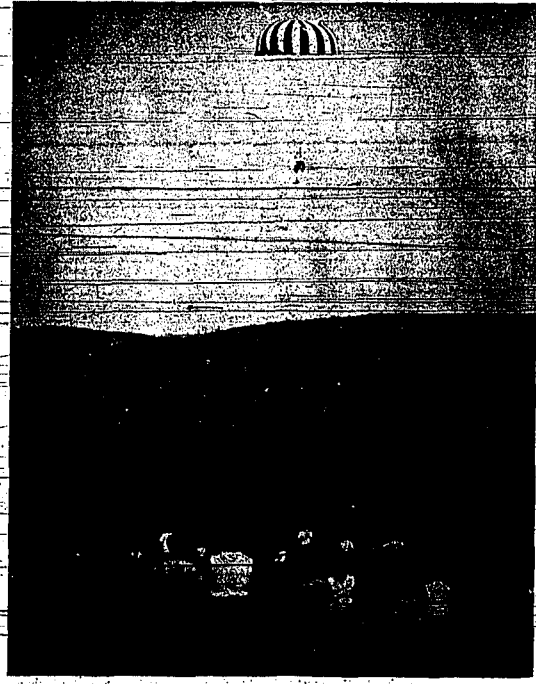

Pakistani Student Has High Praise of Exchange Program

REPRESENTATIVE July 3—Appreciation for the opportunity of participating in the work of the American field service plan which brings students from foreign countries to live for a year in America, were expressed by Adam Khan, Pakistani student who left Thursday after spending the past year at the Elmer Rush home.

The young student was older than most who come over under the AFS program, having already finished high school and attended one year of college in Pakistan. He studied American government, which he said was his favorite, and English, speech and debate.

He said he felt he had accomplished a great deal in his year at the Rush home. He had high school, and that the one thing that stood out most among all things he had learned was that a person could do manual work and still keep his self respect and be respected by those around him.

In Pakistan, Khan said, the working class does all the work and the upper classes do not consider any labor at all. Another difference he noted was that everyone who wishes may have an education and go as far as the White House in London.

In his country it is limited to the few who can afford it, and who are allowed to attend. In recent years schools have become more widely scattered throughout the country, and aid is given by the government for those who need it, Khan said, but more than 50 per cent of the inhabitants are illiterate.

When Jim Rush, son of his parents, won a trip and a scholarship for his work in the Future Patriots of America, Khan said it was just one more example of the opportunities offered in this country—that in Pakistan, the boy of a farmer would never have been given the chance to participate in anything of that kind.

Young Khan was impressed, he said, by the enormous size of the country, and when he first landed in New York, by the skyscrapers and the mechanical things used in everyday life by even the poorest. Such things as electricity, and all the things operated by it, cars, tractors, and all the myriad things taken for granted by the average American were all new to Khan. He said he had seen all these things in his country, but not in every home, and loved by almost everyone.

When asked if his opinion of America had in any way changed by his stay here, Khan said yes in many ways. In the first place, he said, he had a very high regard for the country or the people until he came and saw how they worked. His former ideas and opinions had been. He said the friendliness of the people was something that really impressed him.

Everyone he met was so genuinely interested in him and in being his friend, that it was something that required adjusting to. Another thing different from his conception was the wide variety of jobs offered in the reach of anyone who had the desire to learn.

When Khan left Ruyed for Salt Lake City to join a group of other exchange students of a tour prior to embarkation from New York City, he was not on his way home as were the other exchange students for several more years of schooling before he will be ready to go home.

In England, Khan will study law, planning to practice in his own country when he has finished. It won't be so much like a foreign

tended there, Khan said English is taught all the way through school. He attended the Forman Christian college in Lahore, and explained that English and mathematics are the subjects stressed since most of the students who go on to higher education do so in either the United States or England.

One of the highlights of his year here was the opportunity to attend Ruyed's state through the sponsorship of the Toastmasters club. Khan said he learned more during the sessions there about government than he could have ever done from just studying books in school.

In the course of furthering world peace, young Khan urged the community to sponsor other exchange students and to let other communities know of the value of the program.
