### Eisenhower Says U. S. Must Stand Firm in Berlin Crisis

CITIZENSHIP, Pa., July 12 (AP)—The United States must stand firm in Berlin and "not let itself be outfoxed" by the former Soviet Premier, Dwight D. Eisenhower said.

Eisenhower's statement on the most troublesome international issue of the day was coupled with another by the former Supreme Allied commander that he had no quarrel with the Kennedy administration over its Berlin stand.

"We must stand by our rights and stand with our allies," he said.

On two other subjects, Eisenhower said:

"I have always been an expatriate in this country. But America's interests and courage are up to it. The United States is strong and we shouldn't scare ourselves to death. We should keep confident and strong and keep our powder dry."

## TUCKER'S NATIONAL WHIRLIGIG

WASHINGTON—Stronger federal legislation governing labor-management relations will result in a series of strikes, demonstrations and lockouts that there is no satisfactory curb on the nation's health and security.

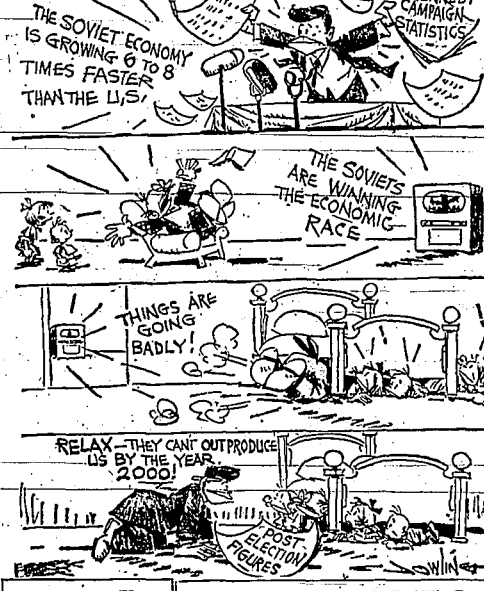

### Coronet Owner Says Costs Will End Publication

NEW YORK, July 12 (AP)—Coronet magazine has announced plans to cease publication, victim of rising costs that have recently killed other publications and threaten more.

The small format monthly said it will end with the October issue. It joins Collier's, Woman's Home Companion, Better Living and others which also went out of business in recent years.

A. L. Blinder, president of South, Inc., owner of Coronet, said the magazine has been unable to find any organization inside or outside the publishing business willing to take over publication.

He said rising costs made the decision to discontinue "the only remaining solution to this problem."
