House Bill for Projects Passes

WASHINGTON, July 14 (AP) — The house yesterday passed an amended bill which would authorize appropriation of \$13,000,000 for construction of 30 projects of the atomic energy commission.

This included \$14 million for construction of the March linear electron accelerator at Stanford University in Palo Alto, Calif., and \$1 million for a test plant for project S-3 at Santa Susana, Calif.

The only opposition was a proposal to add electrical generating facilities to a nuclear reactor under construction at Hanford, Wash.

Republicans, supported by Southern Democrats, succeeded in passing an amendment to prohibit the construction of the power reactors out of the bill.

Gasoline Price War in Idaho May Fall Into Legal Scrutiny

BOISE, July 14 — The gasoline price war in Idaho may fall under legal scrutiny, according to Atty. Gen. Benson.

In contemplating a thorough investigation of the gas, Benson said that the time is coming to take action "before the price war reaches its end."

Benson said he had already received complaints from Pocatello and three southern Idaho counties about the situation.

"The attorney general said two years ago he was consulted in regard to the 'gas war' going on in Pocatello at that time.

"At that time I was sympathetic toward a reduction in prices," Benson said, "and I advised in Senator Church (Frank Church, D. Id.) requesting that the attorney general advise Attorney General Rogers.

"Immediately thereafter a federal attorney called on me and advised against taking action—stating that about the only evidence of law violation they had was the fact that the price was higher than in other states and that there was a tendency to keep the prices down."

Benson said that the present situation indicated that the independents are being forced out of business.

"So I think the time has come to take action locally," he said.

Benson presented some figures to show the price of gas in Idaho. He said that the price of gas in Idaho is 22 cents less than he has to pay for it wholesale.

Benson said, "I think city gas is 16 cents for 14.8 cents per gallon. I think very much that the commission is not doing its job."

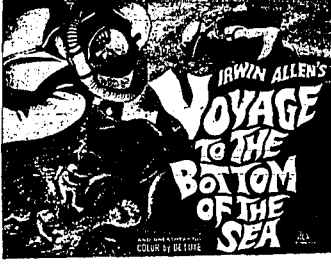

"I went to see his picture 'Patton' three times before I even met him," said Sandburg. "I would rate it a 'placard' picture. It's a 'placard' picture. The Diary of Anne Frank as having an importance as classical — a little more important to be used in high schools and colleges than the plays of Shakespeare."

"The white-haired poet said 'Shakespeare' is a word, I don't mean he's no good, but he lived in a period when there was a drenching of blood over religion — yet you don't find him doing anything with some of the most momentous issues that John Milton wrote about. "You don't look down at Shakespeare. Oh, he had a 20th life of it. There are times when he is lighting up a short cigar, Sandburg explained his function in the making of the picture. "Maybe a quarter of the script is written. I've only done some small scenes here and there, and I'll be in on conferences to counsel script. I'll go over that much more carefully."

"You know, when you go to the Encyclopedia Britannica and turn to the heading of Jesus Christ, you'll find the first few sentences say something like: 'Jesus who attempt to write a biography of Jesus should abandon this task.' "But there is a story. It also is a biography, but it's almost as though there are various facets, there is a Christian family of 800 — 900 people — and he is the greatest story ever told."

Sandburg, who arrived here last July, said he would remain in Hollywood for work on the picture until February or March. In the meantime, he has adjusted with good humor to the glamorous surroundings of the film capital. "His office on the 20th lot is in a building reserved for the dressing rooms of the stars. He has a beautiful brunette secretary who treats him almost reverently. And the bright, modern office presents an amusing contrast to the hard of the prairies."

"I live in a room at the 'Bet Air Hotel,'" said the poet, whose home is in Flat Rock, N.C. "And I have faithful hours of 1 to 6. You get into your box and you have to watch your sleep. But this is the first time since I was 8 or 9 that I think of getting up to my next birthday. I figure I'm now months into my 80th year, I marvel that I'm still here, and in my right mind as an author."

Sandburg's mind focused critically on television for a moment. "At its best, it's priceless," he said. "There are all sorts of traveling pictures on TV, and I've never turned one off. They're wonderful. But I also saw a wrestling

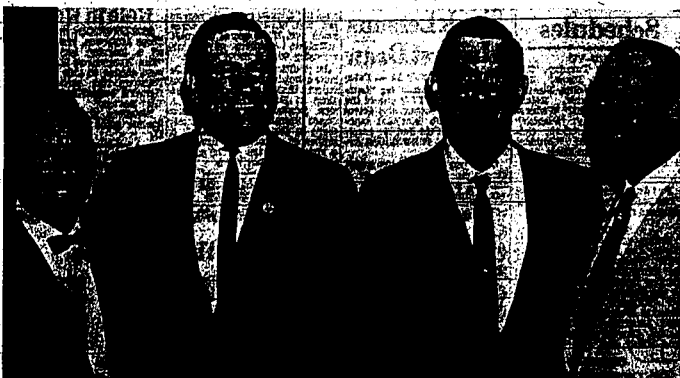

This is a procedure and a use for contract garden beans. Bush-type beans, that Magic Valley farmers have read about as happening in the Midwest and the East, but not here.
