### Grissom Has Studied Task For 17 Years

**CAPE CANAVERAL, July 20**—The nation's first astronaut has spent the last 17 years of his life studying the task of being the first American to ride a Redstone rocket 115 miles into space, here today.

Grissom, who was born in 1926, has been out of high school since he graduated in 1944 and left home to enter the army as an aviation cadet.

He was discharged when the war ended in the Pacific. He didn't want his wings but he kept his eyes on the stars.

Grissom went home to Purdue University and won a degree in mechanical engineering in 1950. He then joined the military in the air force and the Korean War.

The new 100 combat missions in the F-86 Sabrejet in Korea, training a new generation of jet jockeys in Texas, studied aeronautical engineering for this moment as an air force test pilot.

He flew with his six fellow astronauts. Grissom tends to be overlooked. He is the smallest at five feet, seven inches and 150 pounds at 25. He is younger than all the others except fellow force Capt. Leroy G. Cooper, who is 24.

Grissom is not handsome in the "all-American boy" way, but his face in profile has a surprising dignity that is shattered by his quick grin and quicker wit.

Then he strongly resembles television comedian George Gobel.

Education—Korean combat, flight instructor and the ability to relax under stress now are paying off for Gus Grissom.

Grissom was born on April 3, 1926, in Mitchell, Ind., one of three children—Oona, brother—Lawrence, and sister—Dorothy. He works for McDonnell Aircraft company, which makes the Mercury capsule in which he will ride.

He is married to the former—Mary Moore—also Mitchell. She is a housewife and a telephone switchboard operator to help pull Grissom through Purdue. Their two children are—Mark, 11 and—Mark, 7.

Mark predicted two years ago that "daddy is going to be the second" of the astronauts to ride into space.

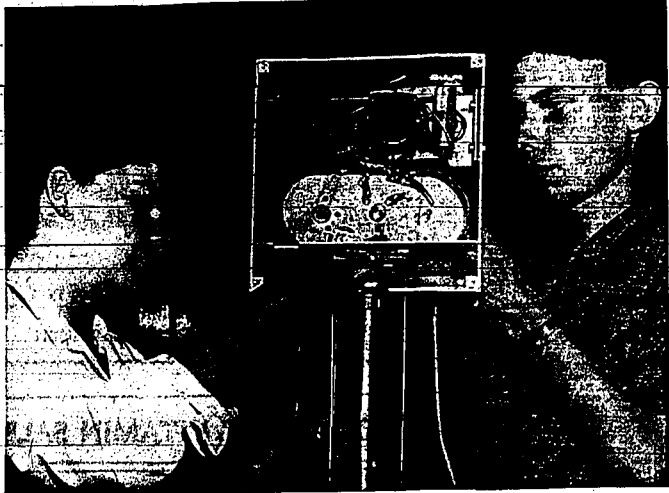

### "Tons" of Trash Are Being Cleared From Area North of Perrine Bridge

Workers began this week to clear a 20-acre accumulation of "garbage" from concrete sidewalks to tree stumps from a two-mile stretch of a Jerome county road from north of the Perrine Memorial bridge to the Shoshone falls power plant.

L. H. VanRiper, a Jerome county commissioner, said Wednesday three bulldozers began clearing the road. The project is expected to take as long as 10 days, with more bulldozers being used later, VanRiper said.

The two-mile stretch of gravel road has been a "dumping ground" for 20 to 30 years, VanRiper said, despite the fact that "dumpers" have been violating Jerome county and bureau of land management laws.

Cooperating in the project are the Jerome county commission, Twin Falls city, bureau of land management and the state highway department. All work and equipment is being donated for the job.

While the work is going on and "until the dumping ceases" Jerome county commissioners will hire a special deputy sheriff to patrol the area and prevent dumping, VanRiper said. Any violators will be taken into custody under the BLM law which is a misdemeanor.

Eventually, the commissioner hopes that two scenic points can be developed along the road. One would be at Pillar falls and another near the power plant.

The commissioner stated: "Negligent taxpayers have littered the place and now all taxpayers are having to pay for the job," VanRiper commented. He said literally "tons" of everything have been dumped there.

The program first was conceived about a year ago, VanRiper said, at a meeting of the board of directors of the "south central health district. Attending the meeting were James Norbeck, Twin Falls, Harold Lancaster, then a Twin Falls county commissioner, and Van Riper.

"We thought it necessary to clean up from a health standpoint and it progressed from there," the Jerome man said.

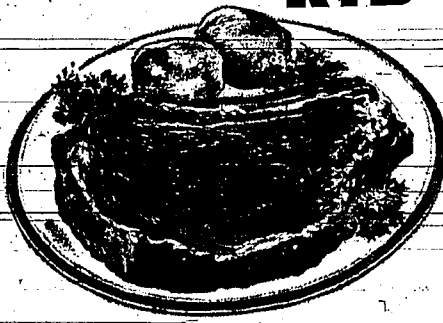

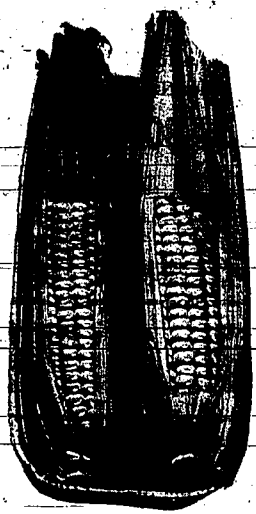

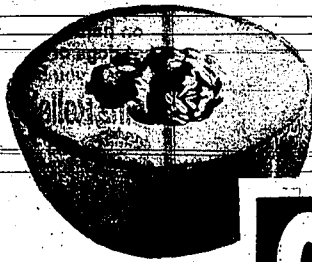

# Driver's License Revoked? Don't Drive! Jail Term Will Be Penalty

In addition, a fine of \$100 to \$500 may be levied for each conviction.

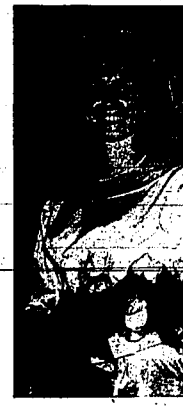

A few other better, but more mechanical hitters than Cobb, could feel better, throw better, could hit the ball farther than Cobb, but none matched him for speed of mind and limb for aggressiveness and daring, for flaming competitive spirit. He stands alone as the first genius of the game."

# Last Respects Are Paid to Tyrus Cobb

HOUSTON, Ga., July 20 (AP)—Ty Cobb went home for the last time Wednesday. The body of baseball's fiery genius was entombed in the white marble family mausoleum beside his parents and his sister, Florence.

His earthly saga ended in the rolling red hills north of northeast Georgia only a few miles from his place. Some of the oldtimers who once played and ball with the mighty slugger. Few were on hand to see him into his final resting place.

Cobb, 74, died Monday in an Atlanta hospital after a 19-month illness. He had long had a chronic heart ailment and a severe arthritis condition which made it difficult to walk. He was born in Corvallis, Ore., and made his final years in Detroit.
