### Soviet Publication Charges U.S. With Spying in Space

**MOSCOW, July 24 (AP)—**The Soviet army newspaper Red Star yesterday charged the United States with using space satellites to spy on the Soviet Union.

The official newspaper said the flights of U.S. reconnaissance satellites over territory of other nations "is an act of aggression."

It compared the satellite operations to the espionage tactics of the 17th and 18th centuries, which led to the collapse of the Paris summit conference last summer.

Red Star said the new satellites showed that "the Pentagon has not given up earlier outlined plans of spy measures aimed against the socialist camp."

### Castro Cuts Down Flights Out of Cuba

**MIAMI, Fla., July 24 (AP)—**State Department plans to fit 20,000 Cuban refugees to Miami in three weeks were dampened with an order by Fidel Castro's regime that only two flights a day would be permitted.

The government of Havana said it would be sought to keep the refugees moving as rapidly as possible, Florida Gov. Farris Bryant urged immediate federal assistance in resettling the refugees away from South Florida.

"Two flights yesterday brought a total of 240 refugees from American World Airways, which has been offering one flight daily from Havana," said a state department spokesman.

An estimated 100,000 Cubans are in the greater Miami area and the U. S. Cuban emergency refugee center there has been processing 1,500 arrivals each week.

The state department had proposed 10 flights daily to Havana to airlift the many Cubans who have waited months to leave the island. But the Cuban government over the week-end issued an order limiting flights between Miami and Havana to two a day.

A Pan American spokesman said passengers will be loaded on a reservation basis "since we have no other method of determining priority." The airline has booked through January, 1962, for persons wanting to leave the island.

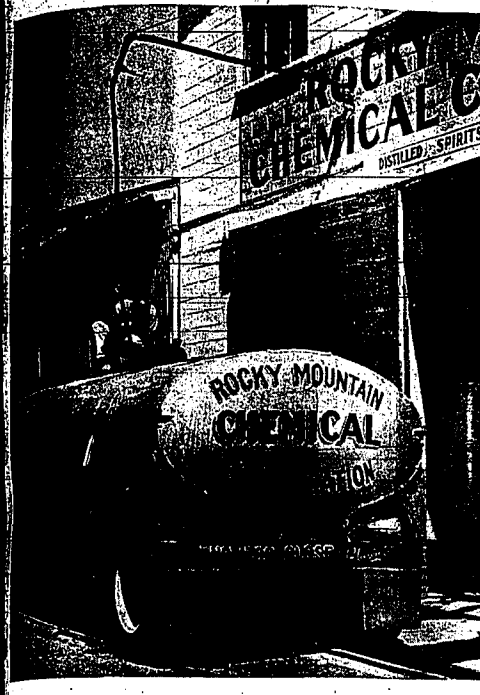
