## Dam in Canyon Started

OBOY, July 27 (UPI)—Construction of Idaho Power Company's Hells Canyon dam project on the Snake river was launched officially today when workers began building a bridge and an access road to the third unit of the concrete dam development.

The new bridge and pioneer road will be used to transport heavy machinery to the rocky site of North America's deepest canyon. The \$100-million project is a three-dam development.

The bridge will be carried on a trestle and will be used for transport of heavy machinery and materials needed to construct the dam. The bridge will be a 2,000-foot-long concrete structure with a maximum capacity of 400,000 pounds.

Work has been in full swing since the dam project was started in Oboe, on the Snake river, with the first two units of the dam project.

## Single Party Planned by Fidel Castro

HAVANA, July 27 (UPI)—Fidel Castro, leader of the Cuban revolution, announced last night that the Cuban revolution will be integrated into a single "socialist" organization.

The alleged prime minister made his announcement before hundreds of thousands of cheering Cubans gathered in Jose Marti square for celebrations marking the eighth anniversary of Castro's revolution. Commenting on the integration of the revolution, Castro said: "The revolution will have only one organization. This is the meaning of the integration of revolutionary organizations."

He declared "this process started in 1953, but will still not be completed."

Castro spoke after 71-year-old Soviet spokesman Yuri Gagarin denounced the United States and pledged "the armed help of the Soviet people" in what he called Cuba's fight for freedom and independence.

Gagarin called the Cuban revolution "the most just and noble revolution in the world."

# Senate Takes up Military Build-up Requests; GOP Says, Cut Domestic Cost

WASHINGTON, July 27 (UPI)—Republican congressmen today formally pledged their "complete" support of President Kennedy's Berlin crisis, bills asked by President Kennedy for building up the military. The committee acted shortly after Defense Secretary Robert S. McNamara testified on the legislation.

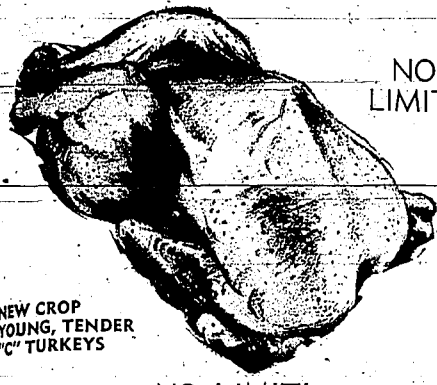

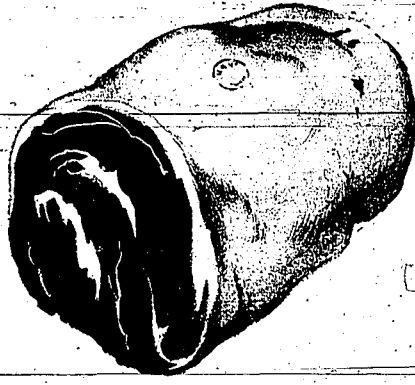

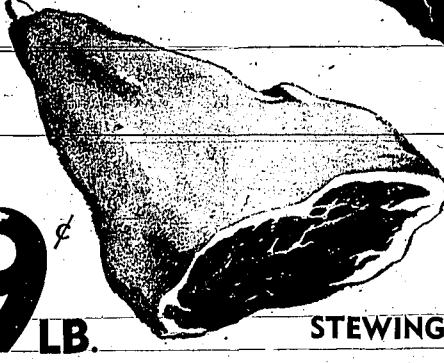

### Foreign Aid Bungles Are Blamed on U. S. Aid Chief

WASHINGTON, July 27 (AP)—A report that made nowhere an attempt to project that "does not" distribution of relief supplies during a drought had ended, food aid was some things the government operations committee did not support a state department and USA claim that the 14-million dollar drought relief program achieved its objective.

The committee said its own investigation showed that much of the food remained undistributed after the 1956 drought, and that less than six per cent of the food was given free to drought sufferers.

The report said "in the middle of 1956—on the site of a mountain where funds were exhausted—the committee charged Neale with shirking off responsibility for the major relief programs and turning them almost entirely over to the Peruvian government. This despite a warning by an American ambassador that the Peruvian government "lacked the experience and facilities to cope with a program of such magnitude."

The committee also said Neale was involved in a "conflict of interest situation for personal profit" when he organized and headed in a corporation benefitting from American aid.

### Suit Filed to Desegregate City Airport

MONTGOMERY, Ala., July 27—The justice department has filed suit to desegregate the city airport facilities at Dennyfield field, municipal airport.

Atty. Gen. Robert Kennedy announced that the suit was filed in federal district court at Montgomery, Ala., on July 27, 1954, to enforce the provisions of the civil rights act of 1954.

The suit named as defendants the city of Montgomery, the board of commissioners, and the airport authority, which operates the airport.

Kennedy brought the action at the request of the civil rights commission and the federal aviation agency. He said the commission has received numerous complaints about segregation at the municipally-operated airport.

The airport is used by many interstate travelers and is a major transportation hub located nearby.

### Major Shifts Are Made in U.S. Strategy

WASHINGTON, July 27—President Kennedy's new proposals for a major shift in recent American military strategy for meeting the worldwide communist menace.

The indicate heavy influence of Gen. Maxwell D. Taylor, who was opposed consistently by his military peers when he was army chief of staff. But now he stands top at the White House as Kennedy's military representative.

In some respects, especially in the call for large manpower increase, the proposals run counter to positions being taken publicly by top defense department officials barely two weeks ago.

In essence, the President seems to be veering away from the old policy of main but as reliance on nuclear weapons to a dual strategy based on both nuclear and conventional forces without reducing strategic reserves which Taylor has advocated.

Kennedy's increases in conventional forces almost exactly mirror the Taylor favor.

With adoption of the military "new look" and its air-atomic strategy in 1953, the Eisenhower administration gradually cut back the forces by a million men and established them at about 2.2 million for all services.

Food in hand went reduced from 100 million bushels in 1953 to 75,000 a month.

Now, to meet the red threat now the whole range from atomic attacks to all-out war, Kennedy wants to increase the forces and this is in addition to 25,000 he proposed earlier and would raise the total authorized strength to 2,750,000.
