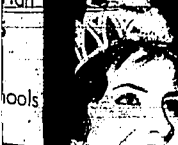

### Auto-Mishap Survivor Still Can't Forget

NEWPORT, Ky., July 31 (AP)—The body healed, Heisey says, but the scars of the crash will never fade. He has not found it yet, but he has not found his life. The former coal miner's life changed 20 years ago today, when a heavily loaded auto drove into the side of the Cummins chain.

Heisey was 12 passengers, and three were killed and three injured, but only he survived. Heisey says he called the local police and the fire department to report the accident in his own words.

"I still can't sleep some nights because of it," Heisey said. "I've stopped to fill a customer's order. I get out of the store and into the restaurant work when it happened."

Heisey remembers the excitement of his brother-in-law, James Brown, bought the 13-year-old car the day before the crash.

"I was driving wanted to see the car, and where both of us were so we decided to go on the next day. We wanted to be a holiday."

The Heiseys, Brown, and a friend who lived with them were in the automobile and were on the way to Pine Mountain.

"I was driving, and I was trying to brake, but I didn't have any."

The car, rolling down the steep, winding highway, bounced off a cliff to another, overturned, and burst into flames. Heisey got out a few minutes. The others were trapped inside.

### Cardinal's Rites to Be Wednesday

VATICAN CITY, July 31—Funeral services will be held Wednesday in St. Peter's basilica for Archbishop Cardinal Tardini, 87, who died Friday in his Vatican apartment.

The Pope interrupted his annual summer stay at Castel Gandolfo to pay tribute to the late cardinal.

The 73-year-old prelate was cardinal secretary of state and carried much of the burden of church government, particularly in the field of foreign affairs. He had been ill for several days with a recurrence of a heart ailment and also suffered from hardening of the arteries.

The doctors have been much more concerned over the condition of Nicola Cardinal Canali, 87, who has been near death with the administration commission for Vatican City. Cardinal Canali is in effect the mayor of the little city-state.

A uncle of Rome, Cardinal Tardini, was ordained a priest in 1912 and entered the Vatican Curia in 1921. Since then he has spent almost all his time in the government of the church.

Cardinal Tardini's death reduced the membership in the College of Cardinals to 63.

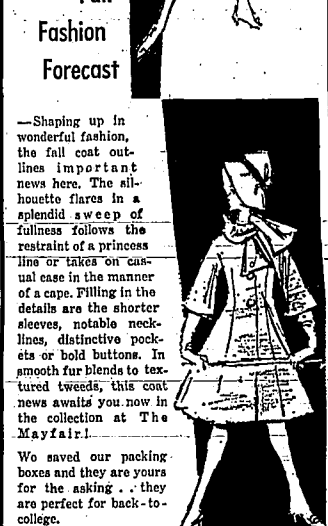

### Nevadans Say They'll Care For Californians in Crisis

LAS VEGAS, Nev., July 31.—(AP)—Local civil defense officials yesterday denied an official statement implying southern Californians would be repulsed by Nevada in the event of a nuclear war.

Southern Nevada is preparing for the care and aid in evacuation of Californians refugees in case of a disaster instead of barring them from the state, the officials said today in a statement following an emergency meeting.

The civil defense officials who attended yesterday's meeting said the statements about the militia were "irresponsible and not reflecting the views or opinions of the citizens or officials of southern Nevada."

The officials said Adair had no authority to speak for the entire agency.

### 3 California Fires Traced To Firebug

WEAVERVILLE, Calif., July 31.—A search was called on today for a firebug who set a chain of fires in tinder-dry brush near here, destroying 200 acres and threatening the tiny town of East Weaver Creek.
