Vision Check Of Minidoka Children Set

RUPERT, Aug. 1—Plans for the third annual statewide vision readiness program for preschool children to be held in Minidoka county Aug. 15, announced Dr. R. C. Phillips, superintendent.

Dr. Gale Allen, Boise, president of the Idaho Optometric Association, announcing this year's plan, pointed out that for the first time an eye examination is required for all children entering school and many children who enter school for the first time are not "visually ready" for the work.

He said approximately 80 per cent of what a child learns in the first year of school depends on the presence of good vision in relation to the child's ability to learn in school. He said that during the past few years more than 100,000 children have been found to have a vision problem.

The readiness tests are given to determine the presence of vision problems or eye conditions which may be in need of treatment.

The association president pointed out that the tests are not intended to help parents but to help the children as they enter school.

In addition to the vision tests, a complete dental examination will be made by the Optometric Association members, Minidoka county health authorities announced a new service as a part of the total health program, offered by the dentists of Rupert.

Mrs. Mary Ellen Carlson, county health nurse said if dental X-rays are indicated, a small charge would be made.

Local dentists participating in the program include Dr. P. S. Smith and Dr. J. R. Borek who will see the preschool children Aug. 15, from 9 a.m. until 5 p.m.

Dr. George Nielson, because of previous commitments, could not be part of the same site, but will see all those wishing to be checked at his office from 9 a.m. until 5 p.m. Aug. 10.

Optometrists who will participate are Dr. R. C. Phillips, and Dr. Arthur Bonze.

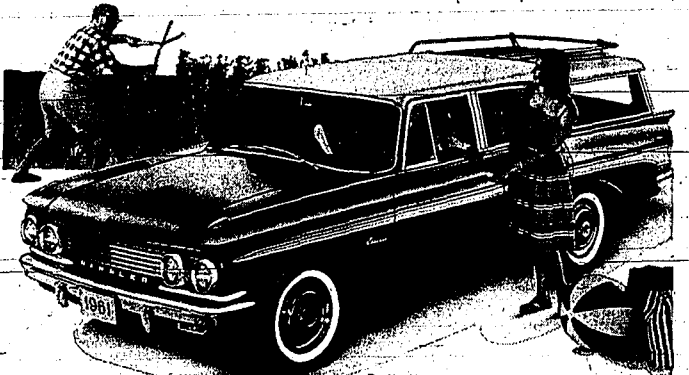

TUCKER'S NATIONAL WHIRLIGIG

WASHINGTON—The most realistic answer to top Republicans' criticism of the administration's foreign policy has been given by the man who is regarded as the administration's chief foreign policy spokesman on the issue on Capitol Hill—Sen. J. William Fulbright, D-Ark.

Fulbright, who is chairman of the senate foreign relations committee, was speaking here today in a hearing before the subcommittee headed by Sen. Joseph McCarthy. He was testifying in support of the administration's foreign policy.

"I am not presenting a new program," he said, "but I am presenting to the senate a partisan defense of the policy of the administration."

On the contrary, it was a grim and pessimistic analysis of the world situation and a listing of the handicaps from which the United States suffers in foreign relations.

"TOTAL VICTORY" MEANS WAR—in the view of Sen. McCarthy's invective attitude, the Arkansas patriot, it is impossible for some arbitrary stroke of American diplomacy or public force or military action to bring the communists to "change and acknowledge the error of their ways."

"Total victory" means achieving "total victory," Senator Fulbright observed, is a nuclear war. Almost every military expert here and there agreed that the only way to bring the communists to conventional weapons and tactics.

Even if the United States and its allies should emerge victorious from such a conflict, for which both sides would be preparing to increase their fighting forces, the senator asks whether OEO's forces has considered a withdrawal of this kind of "total victory."

WASHINGTON (UPI)—The House today passed a bill to increase in its speech to the nation. But the House did not approve the bill until 10:30 p.m. after a long session.

Making this designation at face value, the president could heed the request of the governor of either Oregon or Washington to plan Columbia river basin projects, and that includes everything along Snake river.

The principle of upstream development, which permits the use of water over and over again, is one to which Idaho should cling with determination. After all possible upstream development has been completed, then and then only should attention be given to downstream projects.

In supporting the new water resources bill, Secretary of the Interior Stewart L. Udall said it would permit congress to "decide upon the many individual project developments that will be needed on the basis of full information as to the overall needs for water resources development of the basin, its necessary timing and the particular contribution that each project would make to the needs of the basin."
