BOISE, Aug. 2 (AP)—Preparations for the first extraordinary session of the Idaho legislature were completed today. The special session first in session, begins at 10 a. m. tomorrow. The conference of legislative leaders of both parties and Gov. Robert E. Smylie this afternoon is expected to hold the key to whether the session will be brief or prolonged. A caucus by house Democrats has been called for this evening to review procedure, but Republicans said they would not call a caucus before tomorrow morning.

Minority Smylie has announced appointment of substitutes to serve for two senators who will be absent.

Sen. J. Cecil Sandberg, D., of Idaho, is traveling in Europe and Sen. Frank J. Cooper, R., Boise, will be unable to attend legislative sessions.

The acting senators, Thales Leavitt, Shelby, to serve for Sandberg, and Charles Kinsley, Warren, to serve for Cooper, are of the same party affiliation as the men they will replace, Smylie said.

Republicans hold a slim majority in both the house and senate. The governor said he would request both the lawmakers the senate to meet in a special session to consider and will present to them proposed drafts of bills which follow the constitution in a series of articles. Changed Old Age Benefits Are in Effect

Changes in the social security act passed by President John F. Kennedy on June 30 took effect on Tuesday. More than four million persons are estimated to be affected by the revisions, which included in the changes, which are effective immediately, provisions for financial, medical and socially responsible persons increasing their benefits to \$10 a month. Widows' benefits will be increased by 10 percent, and the amount needed to be paid for benefits and insurance will be reduced by 10 percent for persons aged 62.

Persons eligible for increased benefits may now receive them earlier than before, according to Wesley F. Smith, manager of the Twin Falls office of the social security administration.

There is no need to apply for increased benefits because they will be automatically increased for about 10,000 persons who are now getting benefits while not eligible during the next two years under the lower work requirements. Watson

Dam Construction to Be Challenging



Locked-in North America's deepest canyon, this rugged Hells Canyon dam site that road and bridge builders have started driving toward is Idaho Power company officials launched construction of the third project in its new Snake river development. Between the walls of this deep gorge, created by a twisted upheaval of the Earth's crust, will rise the concrete gravity structure that is to be 400,000-watt Hells Canyon dam. Little room is provided by the canyon's plunging terrain for manufacturing equipment and erecting temporary construction plants. First step in Hells Canyon construction, the heavy-duty road into the gorge, will be a major project itself extending some 23 miles along steep rock mountainsides to a new bridge near the company's Oxbow dam. This new bridge, nearly 500 feet long, will replace existing outmoded Ballard interstate bridge at the foot of Kalaichmidt grade below Hometown.

Burke, 69, said sea power is the "one constant" influence on the affairs of men and nations in the midst of a changing world. Anderson, elevated to the navy's top post by President Kennedy, pledged to keep the navy "on course and alerting" to meet "whatever challenges" the future may portend.

Survival Is Possible In Nuclear War

BY RAY CROMLEY WASHINGTON, Aug. 1 (AP)—Your chances of surviving an all-out atomic attack on the U. S. are not as bleak as you may think today when others dare hope a year ago.

The United States has fewer missiles by far than predicted. The effects of atomic raids have been measured, more than 100,000 people have been evacuated from shelters than had been calculated.

No sane person in the government is suggesting that an atom and hydrogen bomb attack on the U. S. would not be a horrible and devastating blow.

But defense and Pentagon officials do say that you can disregard stories that you will be killed in the first minutes of an atomic attack.

If all the Soviet bombs, missiles and missile-carrying submarines were thrown into use against the United States, the number of Americans killed would be about 100,000.

But the number of Americans who died that year from nuclear accidents—provided U. S. atomic power plants and the U. S. population takes a few simple precautions.

You and your family must be prepared to hide in radiation shelters to avoid a burning cloud to end and last measurably.

This is true if you live in a large city such as New York, Los Angeles, Chicago or San Francisco. It is equally true if you live in a small town in Minnesota, Iowa or California.

Some people in large cities are being killed and some strategic bases are in large city areas.

But if you live or work in these three areas you would not be "doomed" to death or injury. They are "three things you can do today to increase markedly your chances of surviving."

First of all, you must have a plan for what to do in an atomic crisis. The best way to do this is to better than no plan at all.

Ask yourself these questions: Where is the nearest shelter to my office, to my home, to the school of my children, to my car? Do I know a shelter when I see one? Do my children? Can I build a shelter myself?

Civil defense experts estimate that there are in existence now in all major metropolitan areas, buildings, natural shelter spaces for almost 60 million Americans.

Some of these are in schools, churches and other underground excavations—some hold another 40 million or more.

The new civil defense budgets, it is reported, will provide for national warning, identification and mark these "natural" shelters by highway markers.
