T.F. School Board Election Rest to Be Held Sept. 9

The Twin Falls school district No. 411 board of trustees rescheduled a \$122,500 bond election for Sept. 9 at a special session Monday night at the Twin Falls junior high school. The action was taken following the special session of the board which re-enacted the 15 per cent bonding law. The bond election previously was postponed indefinitely after a supreme court decision ruled the law unconstitutional.

City OK's Contract For Sewer Bonds

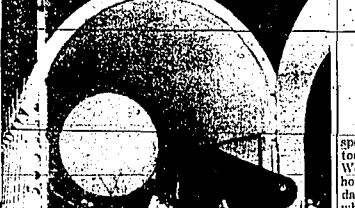

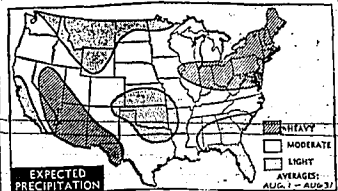

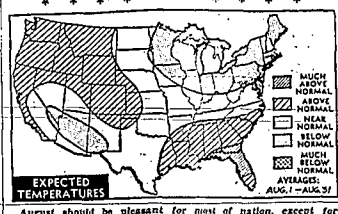

Opera Voices Seeking Way To Open Met

NEW YORK, Aug. 6 (AP)—Opera stars were raising their voices today in hopes of reversing the decision that would cancel the Metropolitan's 100-52 season because of labor discord.

Directors of the August Metropolitan Opera Association yesterday announced they were ready to announce the early start of this season would not be held because they could not meet contract demands without incurring the annual deficit by \$750,000.

Anthony A. Bliss, president of the association, held out hope that the season, originally due to open Oct. 23, might go on if agreement could be reached with Musicians union local 802 "within a day or so." However, he labeled union insistence on a 57% weekly raise "exorbitant."

Progress By-Product

We all hear a great deal about the wonders of modern industrial civilization. But these marvels have some rather grim by-products that we have given all too little attention to, up to now.

The one which has hit these by-products is pollution: Of the air, of the fresh water streams and lakes, even to some extent of the oceans we say we must now conquer in order to feed and give work to billions who will swell our population in the decades ahead.

The nation seems reasonably alert to the water pollution problem. Moving through congress toward President Kennedy's desk is a measure that would set up a comprehensive water control and assist local communities in expensive efforts to reduce pollutants.

The air we breathe is something else. Smog, a product of varied chemical pollutants, is becoming a commonplace overcast of the country's cleanest cities with little industry.

Every year doctors advise a few thousand residents of Los Angeles to leave its smog-ridden atmosphere for places with cleaner skies. There are also persons with respiratory ailments.

Some states, blaming automobile exhausts for a good deal of the trouble, already have enacted or are threatening to enact laws that will compel the motor industry to install devices which will reduce to exhaust pollutants. California awaits only the first licensing of such a device before enforcing this rule.

Compounding the difficulty are the radiological wastes from nuclear power plants. These factors affect not only the air we breathe but the food we eat. Insecticides have effects we are just starting to understand.

The civilization we have built represents an immense man's triumph over his natural environment. But in fashioning this victory he is creating an artificial environment that could exact a tremendous offsetting price. Cost—no too much time to avoid this cost.

MORE SAFETY FOR PLANES

The federal aviation agency is successfully experimenting at Pittsburgh with an experimental "hot line" terminal system which affords many distinct safety benefits in our most congested areas.

The new practice involves a "hot line"—a telephone contact maintained continuously between a man at terminal in airport and another man at another terminal at an air route radar position.

The two men devote themselves exclusively to exchanging detailed information on the movement of aircraft from one terminal to the other.

The "hand-off" of incoming planes from a route center to the terminal tower has long been a tricky operation. To identify and retain identification of planes in terminal areas is not always possible.

The terrible collision of two giant aircraft over Staten Island last Dec. 16 may have involved a hand-off problem, among many others. Idlewild tower never "saw" the ill-fated, jet-set plane which hit another at 5,000 feet.

The telephone "hot line" is aimed at improving hand-offs. The average person might imagine that the business of exchanging traffic information is completed at simple, especially since the two men do nothing else.

Actually, only men with at least two years training in traffic control and radar scope reading can do this. The fact is that it is true that men of the air traffic, however alert, can personally keep track of more than two to four aircraft at a time. With 80 to 90 landing every hour at such a field as Idlewild, the problem is plain.

Gradually the new technique will be extended to the busiest terminals. But with its admitted limitations and the steadily rising traffic volume, air traffic will be perfected computer which can give us faster, more complete and more positive control of our air traffic.

LICENSE LUNACY

The National Safety Council and other agencies long have campaigned for uniform traffic laws across the country. The ever-increasing volume of motor traffic thronging across state lines obviously heightens the need for standardized regulations.

Once that standardization is achieved, and the sooner the better, there ought to be speedy effort to develop complete reciprocity among the 50 states in the matter of drivers' licenses. Failing that, good argument could be made for issuance of a federal driver's permit valid everywhere in the nation.

With one in five Americans moving each year—many from state to state—there is nothing quite so silly as compelling complete, tested drivers to keep re-taking each state's examinations.

Regular physical checkups are essential. But much of the official energy now devoted to routine, almost automatic testing of ready properly licensed drivers would be better spent on more effective traffic law enforcement.

TUCKER'S NATIONAL WHIRLIGIG

WASHINGTON—Renewal next year of the Roosevelt-Bull law-tariff program is endangered by the prospective entry of Great Britain into the European economic union known as the Common Market.

Today the Common Market, which was organized in 1959, has only six members—France, Germany, Italy, Belgium, Luxembourg and The Netherlands. They have a population of 165 million.

FREE TRADE ASSOCIATION FAILS TO FLOURISH

TO meet this challenge and safeguard the interests of the United States, the European Free Trade Association—Austria, Denmark, Norway, Sweden and Switzerland—today has been established.

This organization has not flourished. England has had to adopt an "unilateral" program to attract business.

It has been reluctantly, Prime Minister Harold Macmillan has broken with Britain's centuries-old system of economic isolationism from the continent.
