"Hey, Adolfo, no wagner. Without hesitating, Phillips responded, "Frank Sinatra is boss of Chicago."

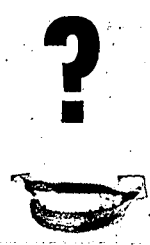
