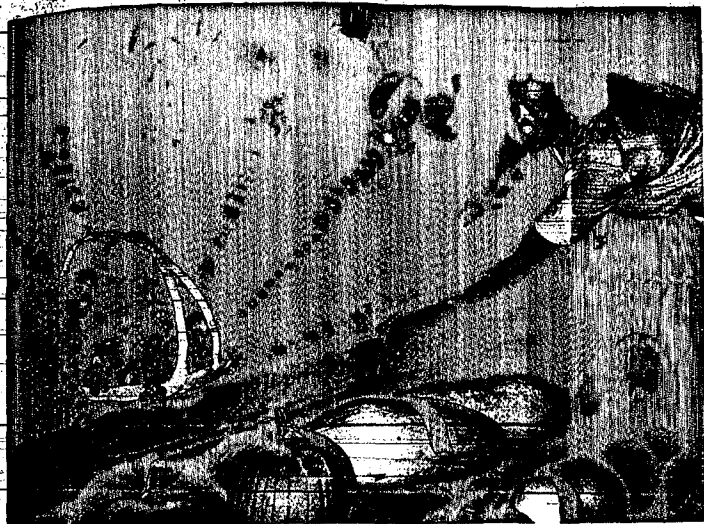

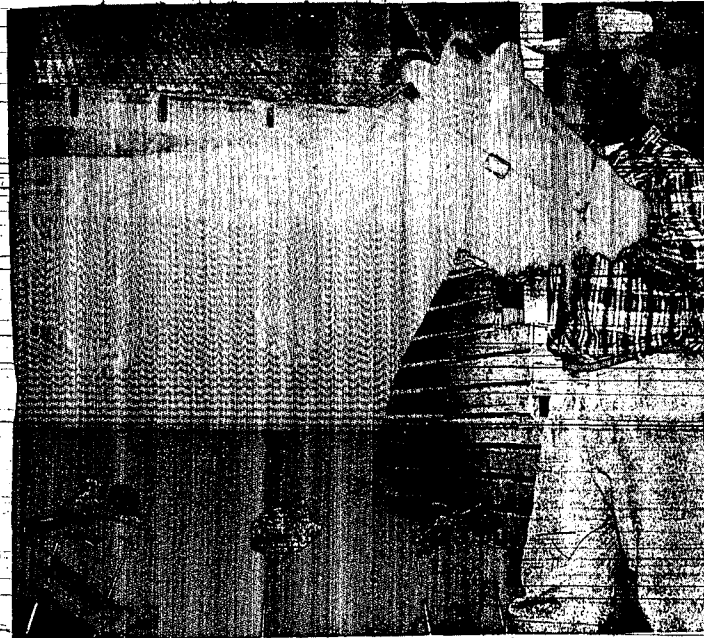

Church Gets Warning on Wilds Billot

BOISE, Sept. 7 (AP) — Sen. Frank Church, D. Ind., said in a news item from Washington that he voted for the wilderness bill despite warnings from various pressure groups that told him he was signing his political grave.

Meanwhile, Sen. Henry Dwarshak, R. Ind., was listed as one of six GOP senators who voted against the measure contending it would curtail operations of various industries among other things.

The Idaho mining association has come out strongly against the bill which now goes to the house for action. Some state timber interests also have voiced opposition to it.

However, State Land Commissioner John G. Wilcox, and the state Democratic chairman, said he thinks the bill "is a good thing" and added "the state will probably get along with it fine" if it passes congress.

The measure, which provides for preservation of a vast wilderness comprising millions of acres of scenic wonders, passed the senate 78-8. It was a victory for many western senators who helped draft a national policy of wilderness preservation after five years of hearings and committee debate.

The senate approved several amendments which were acceptable to Church, the bill's floor manager. Church contended the American people have a right to claim from establishment of a wilderness preservation.

The Gen. state Democrat took note of the opposition in the measure from some interests in the western states in the final minutes of debate on the senate floor.

He said the pressure came largely from those with a gross misconception of what the bill provides. "They (the pressure groups) have warned me that I'm signing my political grave in Idaho by choosing to support this bill," he said.

"It's a new technique," he said. "I deplore those who scatter for the sagebrush once the sniping starts." "If I'm shot down, so to speak, it will not be in the back, concerning my duties, as I see it, to the people of Idaho."

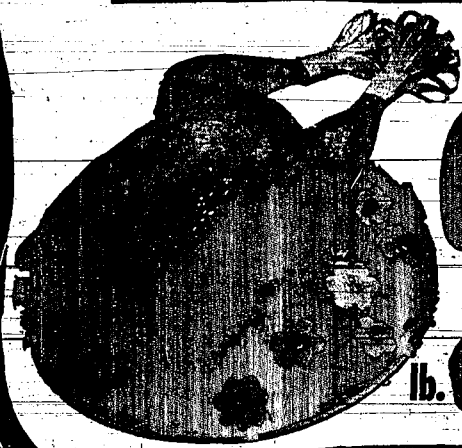

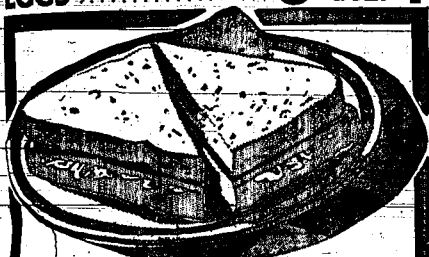

Water Tank At Richfield Is Damaged

RICHFIELD, Sept. 7—The 55,000 gallon city water tank is about two feet below ground level, officials discovered Wednesday.

Richfield City Marshal Martin Whiteless says a suspicious Tuesday evening when the discovery of the ground cracked around the base of the tower while he was watering the grass in the area.

Investigation Wednesday by Whiteless and members of the city board revealed that two of the 125-foot high tower's four legs had been pulled partially out of the ground. While one leg had tilted back to its former position the other one did not, thus the tilting tower.

Whiteless reported the high wind which struck Richfield Saturday afternoon must have loosened the base. He reports the tower was constructed in 1938 and each leg was fastened to a rock base 12 feet below the ground and supported in five-foot high cement blocks, set flush with the ground.

The city board contacted a firm in Wyoming Wednesday to repair work expected to start Saturday, Whiteless said.

Orphans Bill Turned Into Major Policy

WASHINGTON, Sept. 7 (AP)—The house yesterday turned a little over 600 orphans bill into major immigration legislation.

When the bill was passed last month, it provided for a permanent extension of a law allowing a couple to adopt a foreign orphan child from abroad, outside the immigration quotas.

But when it left the house today the bill aimed at speeding the deportation of Communists and subversives.

Granted veterans of the Korean war the same naturalization rights as held by veterans of other wars.

Removed the present 3,000 ceiling on immigration from the Asian and Pacific areas so that new nations can qualify for an annual 100 quota.

Set an immigration quota of 300 for the new federation of the West Indies. The new colonies handling together would be limited to 100 without such a change.

Eliminated the checks for "race and ethnic" qualifications on visa applications because it is offensive to some foreigners who want to visit the United States.

The measure sailed through by voice vote and was sent back to the senate.

Human Error Ruled Out In AEC Mishap

IDAHO FALLS, Sept. 7 (AP)—The atomic energy commission has discounted theories of human error in the reactor blast last January at the national reactor testing station in eastern Idaho.

The AEC reported on progress made in dismantling the reactor and said that a broken piece of rack from a reactor rod assembly had been found above the reactor.

Investigation showed, the AEC stated, that at the time of the explosion, the central rod extension was frozen at a point below the top of the reactor and had been withdrawn about three inches.

But the rod still extended through the reactor core, the AEC statement said.

This seems to cast doubt on earlier theories that the accident could have been caused by rapid and extensive motion of the central control rod.

Earlier reports had indicated that one of the three men killed in the explosion might have pulled out the control rod too fast, causing the explosion.

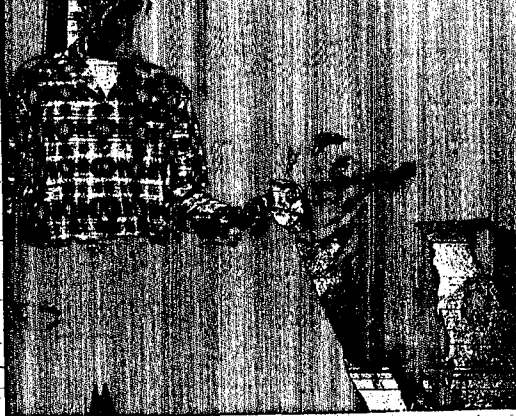

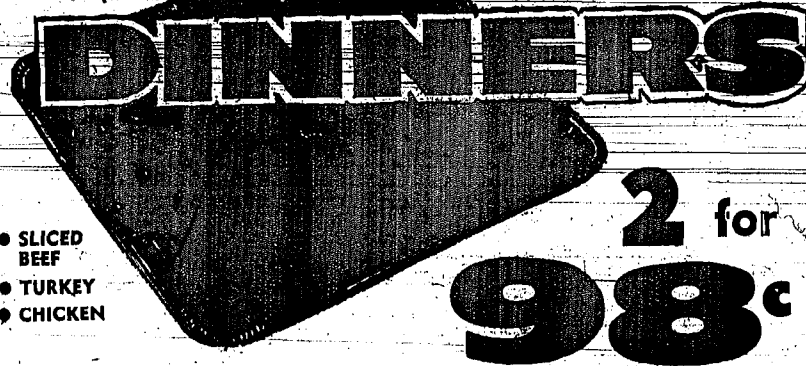

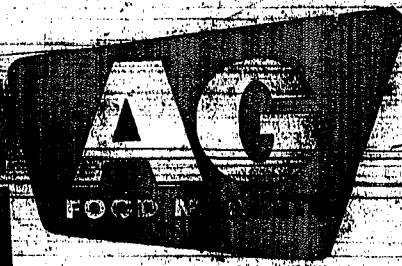

House Committee Rejects Firms' Bid To Build West Power Project Lines

SALT LAKE CITY, Sept. 7 (AP)—Gov. George D. Clyde says he hopes the "full house" of representatives will reverse its appropriations committee on the question of public versus private construction of the upper Colorado river project's primary power lines.

The committee approved spending \$356,608,000 on the project yesterday, but it rejected proposals that the key transmission facilities be built by private utilities.

"I am hopeful Clyde said later that the full house will see the long-range picture and recognize the advantages to the project of the combined federal-private system.

"But if the all-federal system is approved, we will do the best we can."

E. M. Naughton, president of the Utah Power and Light company, one of the utilities involved in the proposal, said in Kemmerer, Wyo., he hoped the full house would view the transmission lines question "in the light of engineering and economic rather than politics."

Naughton said the private utilities' proposal to carry the federal power on its own lines "will save the government 130 million dollars in initial investment, increase funds for water development by 150 million dollars, and generally add millions in federal income tax and in tax

income of state and local governments."

Opponents of the plan have objected that the fees charged by the utilities to be "wheel" the power could be used to pay federal costs for the system account.

Gov. Clyde is a member of the upper Colorado river commission, which met in secret in Denver Friday, then announced it had unanimously endorsed a new bill which promised a cut in "wheeling" rates after the transmission lines have been paid for out of revenues Clyde offered the endorsement resolution.

In Denver yesterday, Colorado Gov. Steve McNichols charged that Friday's meeting was pre-

ceded by a secret meeting in Salt Lake City the week before. He said Colorado's representative on the commission, Edwin C. Johnson, acted on the question without McNichols' knowledge or consent.

McNichols said he understood the utilities' compromise plan was made orally to the commission and was not presented in writing until after the commission had approved it.

"The proposals made at the Salt Lake City meeting," said McNichols, "were never communicated to me, to the commission's own staff, nor to the responsible state agencies."

In Salt Lake City, Governor Clyde confirmed the earlier meeting but said he did not want it announced because it wasn't an official meeting. He said he attended, but he didn't name the others who were present.

"I resent these charges that we are holding secret meetings on this matter," Clyde said. "Any group has the right to meet in an executive session, for clarification of matters and for fact-finding."

There had been comment about last Friday's meeting in Denver, because its tight secrecy excluded the public and even members of the Colorado water conservation board.

"Even now our fact-finding efforts are not ended," Clyde, a Republican said. "We still don't have all the facts and information we would like at our disposal. I don't know what's wrong with these Democrats."

Earlier, Clyde said the commission's endorsement of the utilities' proposals came only after they had agreed in writing to reduce their wheeling charges after their original capital investment was paid off.

Paper in Oregon Changes Owners

HOOD RIVER, Sept. 7 (AP)—Former Oregon Gov. Elmer Smith, a newspaper publisher, has announced he has purchased the weekly Hood River News.

The purchase price was not disclosed but was estimated at about \$100,000. The transaction was effective Sept. 1.

The seller was E. A. Sonnichsen.

Smith owns two other newspapers—the daily Albany Democrat and the weekly Astoria News.

Potatoes and potatoes head the list of outstanding buys among fresh vegetables this week. Among other items include regular cabbage, cauliflower, California corn, endive, escarole, green beans, green peas, green onions, parsley, peppers, radishes, yellow squash, turnips and rutabagas.

But birds at least are plentiful. In California, grapes, lemons and honeydew melons, while you can get good buys among other items, peaches, prunes, bananas, nectarines and small California oranges.
