U. S. Set for 'Meaningful' Berlin Talks

WASHINGTON, Sept. 11 (UPI)—The State Department replied today to Soviet Premier Nikita Khrushchev's new bid for a "meaningful" dialogue with the United States ready to resume "meaningful negotiations."

A department spokesman said the United States will continue to try to reach a disarmament agreement with the Soviet Union despite Khrushchev's new bid to resume nuclear testing. The State department followed a week-end statement by Khrushchev that there was "hopeful signs" for negotiations with the free world allies in the Berlin situation. For their part, U. S. officials said any such talks must hold hope of real results.

In another development, the Secretary of Defense announced yesterday that the United States will attend the United Nations general assembly session opening Sept. 19 in New York. It was not announced whether the United States would go to New York. In still another facet of East-West relations, the department is now looking at a new proposal with the Kremlin over the status and secret American of a 10-year-old American student, Edward William Malin, on release charges. 250,000 UAW Workers Strike General Motors; Negotiations Continue

DETROIT, Sept. 11 (UPI)—The United Auto Workers union struck General Motors today in the biggest walkout in auto industry history and the giant corporation's car operations were expected to be virtually shut down by tomorrow. More than 250,000 UAW workers in 88 of its 129 plants from coast to coast walked out at the 10 a.m. (EST) deadline arrived and more were expected to join them in a strike that hit just as the industry moved into 1962 model production. The union and company almost immediately renewed efforts to reach a contract agreement and end the walkout, scheduling a resumption of bargaining talks at 7 p.m. (EST) today.

The UAW national leadership left it up to individual locals whether to strike and most of them did not. However, wherever all the local strikes, UAW President Walter P. Reuther said, "The plan is to have a strike that would soon force others to close." The strike also was expected to have an effect on production at Ford and Chrysler, where contracts are slated to run out at midnight Wednesday, since some GM plants make parts that are sold to the competing companies. The union and GM reached a second last week on economic terms of a new contract and Reuther said today's strike was due "90 per cent to working conditions."

The economic settlement was "very attractive and liberal," he said, but it could not substitute for the demand for a "regret that GM workers found it necessary to strike." Reuther said, "We have said all along that we were not looking for a fight. We extended the contract twice and made meaningful progress, but we were not looking for a fight. More Private, Public Power Fights Loom

WASHINGTON, Sept. 11—A bitter fight between public and private power forces is expected to erupt in the house tomorrow. Sharp debate is in prospect over a proposed appropriation for lines to carry electric power from dams in the upper Colorado river storage project.

The house appropriations committee last week approved \$10,000 for construction of the lines. The item is included in the public works appropriation bill as recommended by the committee.

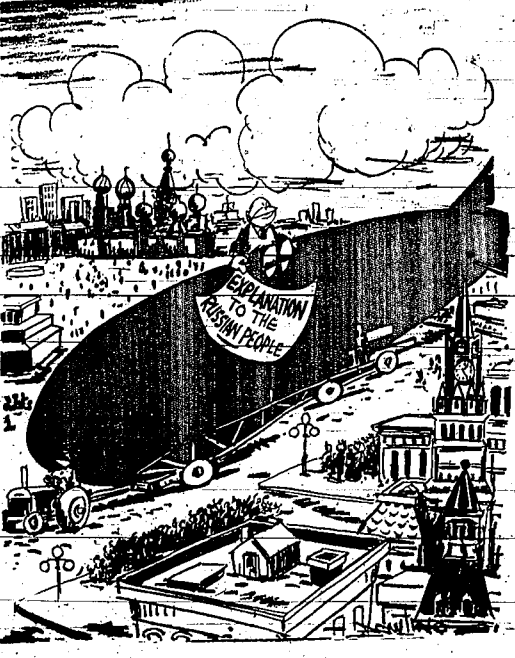

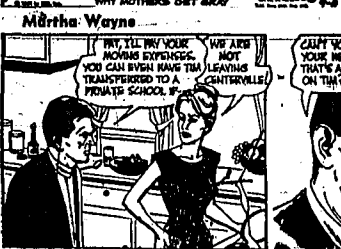
