LEOPOLDVILLE, The Congo, Sept. 13 (UPI)—United Nations troops fought a bitter hand-to-hand battle with Katanga forces in Elisabethville today and ended the rebellious province's 15 months of independence from the rest of the Congo. U. N. Secretary-General Dag Hammarskjold arrived at Leopoldville airport at 11:15 a.m. (EDT) after a flight from New York. He received an immediate report from Sture Linnér, U. N. civil operations chief, that the Katanga problem was virtually solved. Hammarskjold came here on a mission described as economic.

Hurricane Carla's Death Toll Is 15; Rebuilding Task Is Started

GALVESTON, Tex., Sept. 13 (UPI)—Texas and western Louisiana areas residents in watery ruin turned today to a staggering task of rebuilding left by Hurricane Carla, one of the mightiest ever to roar out of the Gulf of Mexico. With a possibility more bodies yet may be found, the death toll stood at 15 along 250 miles of coastline laid waste by hurricane gales up to 176 miles per hour, raging seas and a rash of tornadoes. Damage which may take months to compute ran into hundreds of millions.

NEW YORK, Sept. 13 (AP) — "About all you can say was that it was typically Jack Parr." That was the reaction of Sen. Jacob K. Javits, R. N.Y., to the tightly contrived "Jack Parr in Berlin" film telecast last night. Asked in Washington today whether he had watched the telecast, the senate majority leader replied: "No—Lord, not! The incident is closed as far as I am concerned!"

The furor stirred by the filming had caused concern even in the White House, which approved a defense department investigation of the use of U.S. army troops by Parr.

Javits said he saw "nothing fatal" in the NBC show but added he didn't "think anything so sensitive should be handled in this manner."

"I hope this kind of approach will not be repeated," he said.

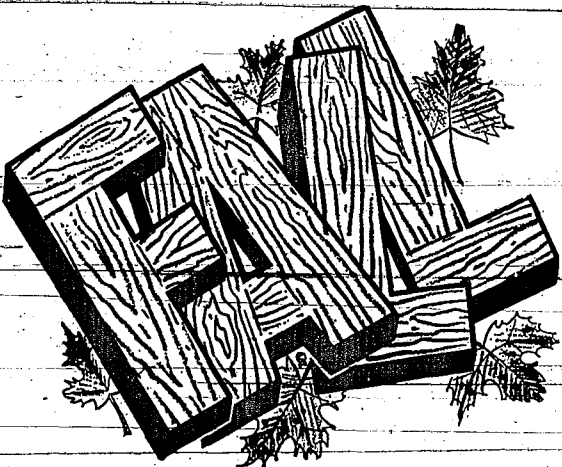

WASHINGTON, Sept. 13 (AP)—The senate spurned a plea by President Kennedy yesterday that it ease the way for revival of his aid-to-education program.
