JEROME, Sept. 14—Wilmer G. Priest, Jerome county agricultural extension agent, today received the Idaho award for distinguished service at the annual meeting of the National Agricultural County Agents association in New York.

He organized the 1960 campaign at Jerome to control the pest of the Idaho bean beetle that threatened the commercial crop and end the program this year.

Priest has served as a county agent for 15 years in three counties. After graduation from the University of Idaho in 1946 he was 4-H club agent at Twin Falls. From 1948 to 1960 he was county agent at Rupert. Since then he has been county agent at Jerome.

Before earning a degree in agriculture, Priest served more than four years with the army in France, in England, North Africa and the Mediterranean. He was awarded the distinguished flying cross.

While in Twin Falls county he was instrumental in organizing the 4-H Leaders and sponsoring the county fair. He also developed a lamb and wool production and marketing program. For several years he assisted home leaders on the North Side pumping project. He developed a farming guide that has been used by most farmers of the area.

In the program for control of the bean beetle in 1960 and 1961, Priest played a leading part in the successful effort that involved cooperation of growers, gardeners, and state and federal entomologists.

Mr. and Mrs. Priest have four daughters and one son.

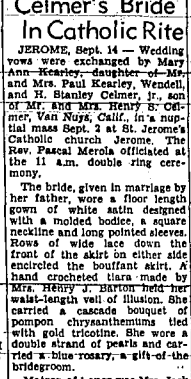
