Goldwater Not Planning Presidential Bid; Draft Possibility Not Closed

SUN VALLEY, Sept. 29 (AP)—Sen. Barry Goldwater has no plans to seek the Republican nomination in 1964 but he left the door open for a draft movement. Goldwater spoke with businessmen on his arrival here Wednesday but he has no plans to speak at the banquet of the Western Republican conference. Concerning the Arizona conservative said "I don't know frankly... I couldn't care less. If I run for anything, I'll run for the senate... but I don't want to make an announcement now about the senate."

Western Leaders Meet at Sun Valley

Goldwater looked up from his text to say to President Kennedy "We hear him talk like Churchill then see him act like Chamberlain." Neville Chamberlain was the British prime minister who vainly tried to appease Germany prior to World War II. "The failure of the new frontier, both at home and abroad, makes it a matter not just of political choice but of national and international urgency that Republican power be increased in the congress," Goldwater said. An audience of more than 750 gave the leader of conservative Republicans an ovation before he left after his speech. Goldwater noted at the afternoon press conference that he did not anticipate being drafted in his behalf at the 1960 Republican national convention. Goldwater said Richard Nixon announced Wednesday he would run for the senate. (Continued on Page 2, Column 4.)

SUN VALLEY, Sept. 29 (AP)—The two-day conference here looking to the week-end and a visit from Richard M. Nixon to boost enthusiasm and rally the party level after a routine, rather calm day Friday. BEIRUT, Lebanon, Sept. 29 (UPI)—President Gamal Abdel Nasser's United Arab Republic collapsed today. Syria declared its independence from the union with Egypt after a lightning revolution and set-up a civilian transitional government to rule until a parliament can be named in free elections. Nasser halted all military operations against Syria in a tacit admission of defeat. The rebels' victory was so swift and so complete that Jordan immediately recognized the new Syrian government and pledged "unlimited support." Other Arab nations besides Nasser's power were expected to follow suit. Syria has reported ready to recognize Syria.

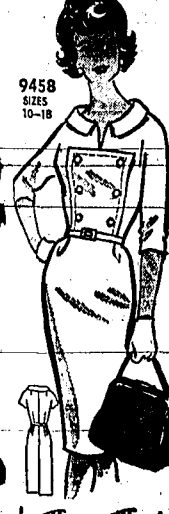

Government Scientists Are Studying Water Evaporation Reduction in Soil

WASHINGTON, Sept. 28 (AP)—Government scientists are giving more and more attention to reducing evaporation of water from the soil as a means of saving food production. They estimate that up to 50 per cent of the water reaching the root zone of plants is lost through evaporation. They say that if evaporation from soil surfaces could be reduced by some 20 per cent, it would practically eliminate the need for supplemental irrigation in much of the eastern United States. Scientists today do not know of any practical means of reducing evaporation losses from soil surfaces, but they say there is some research that shows promise—at least from a research standpoint. They say that the use of chemicals to reduce or prevent evaporation has great potential, but much research needs to be done. They know that plastic films will practically eliminate evaporation losses. It is known also that, placing of gravel or coarse material over soil surfaces greatly reduces losses of water. The researchers say it seems possible that through proper treatment, small clods could be stabilized and used as efficiently as gravel. The researchers say compaction of soil surfaces frequently reduces evaporation losses. But, they add, a thorough understanding of the physical-chemical processes involved in soil compaction is needed before major breakthroughs will be made in the area. The scientists plan intensive research to develop ways of obtaining deeper storage of soil moisture from small showers, so that evaporation losses may be reduced and more water made available to plants.

WASHINGTON, Sept. 29 (AP)—The hog-corn price ratio based on barrows and gilts was considerably better in the week ended Sept. 16 than it was a year ago. The ratio was 16.7 on Sept. 16, compared with 13.8 a year earlier. On Sept. 15, a hundred pounds of hog was worth \$18.37. This could buy 16.7 bushels of corn at \$1.10 a bushel. 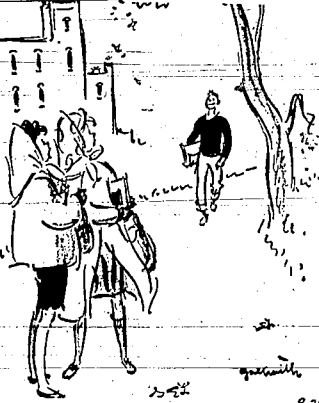

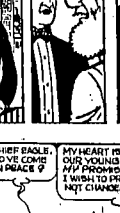

Titan Blazes Skyward for Seven in Row

CAPE CANAVERAL, Fla., Sept. 29 (AP)—A blockbuster Titan, soon to be added to America's long-range missile arsenal, blazed to its seventh straight success last night on a 5,000-mile test flight.

Sputting a tongue of liquid flames from its powerful engines, the 99-foot intercontinental range weapon roared azimuthally across a clear sky. The second stage ignited two minutes after launch and boosted the nose cone toward its destination in the southern Atlantic ocean.

The air force reported the missile performed as intended in a test aimed at proving reliability of its thousands of complex systems.

The combat-effectiveness of the Titan was demonstrated last Saturday when air force troops fired one of the big rockets from Vandenberg air force base, Calif. That missile was raised from a concrete underground shelter.

Titan is being operational by the end of the year, will join Atlas in this nation's line-up of long-range nuclear rockets. A total of 27 Atlases are on station, with 18 more to be added before 1962.

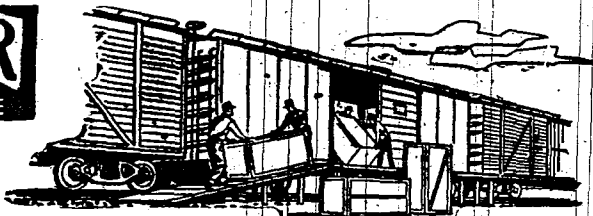

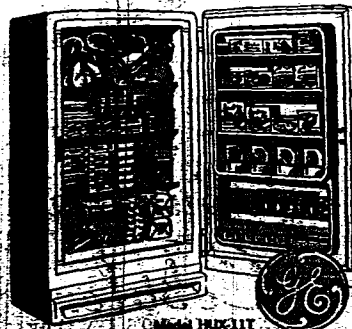

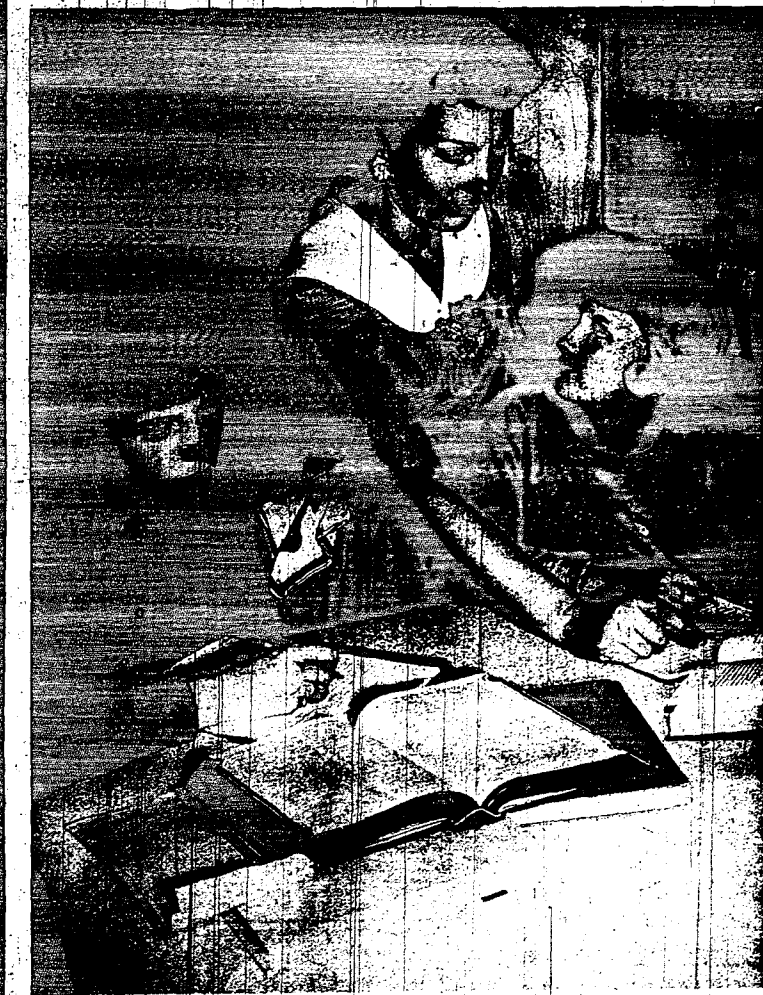

The 1971 schedule just would not get me from Moscow to Japan in time," he said. "Be lieve it or not, you can't fly from Moscow to Japan directly. The fastest way is by way of Africa."

During the first JTB program, starting in April, Arledge traveled more than 500,000 miles. He had 18 round trips across the Atlantic.

The swimming championships brought out a new development in underwater TV work.

Underwater photography is certainly not new," he said, "but no matter how good film is it is not as good as video-tape."

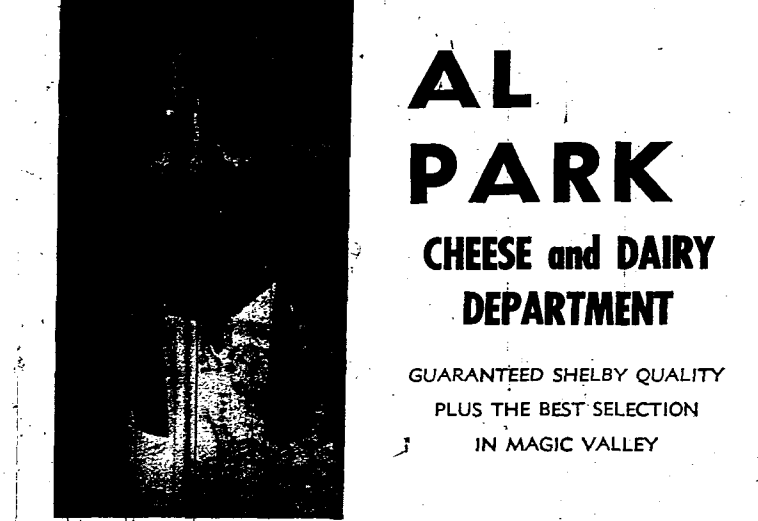

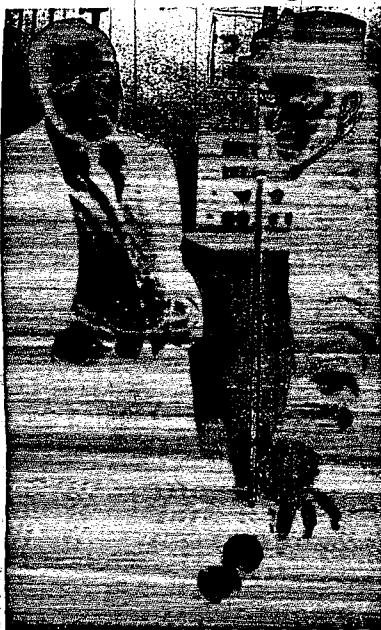

Working Around Home

Knocking Hole in Wall Not Difficult If You Get Down to Work, Plan Right

Knocking a hole in the wall or foundation of your house isn't as difficult as it may seem. If you plan to install a kitchen exhaust fan, to vent a clothes dryer or you will have to overcome whatever feelings of apprehension you may have and get right down to work.

As long as the opening is a small one you can handle it with a few cautions, and much experience. Openings for new doors or windows are best left to professionals. These will require extra framing and bracing.

If you are going through the kitchen wall, first mark the size and shape of the opening. Try to place it between wall studs. Also, don't locate it right above or below an electrical outlet or wire. You are likely to run into the wires.

Look for Plaster Walls
If the wall is plaster, cover the area right around the opening with masking tape to prevent cracking. Then a chisel and hammer chop right through the plaster.

If you have a plasterboard wall, drill a hole first and then cut away the material with a keyhole saw. The small hole is necessary to start sawing. Beneath the plaster you will find wood lath. Cut these strips with the keyhole saw.

Drill to Outside
Once the hole is completed on the inside, drill a hole through the wall to the outside. The hole will provide a starting point for the keyhole saw.

If the outside wall is brick you will have to do some careful measuring to locate the opening on the outside. The process is just that point is the same as cutting a hole in a brick or block foundation.

Cutting through brick or block requires a hammer and a heavy cold chisel. Although you may have to go through six or eight inches of wall, ease the first brick is removed the rest is relatively easy.

On a brick wall, start by breaking one brick. Keep working with hammer and chisel until the entire brick is removed. The bricks around it can be removed by working on the mortar joints. Most of the bricks will come out whole.

Remember that along the edges you may not want to remove an entire brick. Establish a line for the opening. Bricks in alternate rows will be divided by the line. These can be split with a chisel. Building blocks—sunder or concrete—should be tapped to locate a hollow spot. Hit that spot with your hammer a few times and the block will break. The chisel will remove the rest of it. Follow mortar lines for the other blocks.

Special plates and collars with fans and vent kits will hide ragged edges.

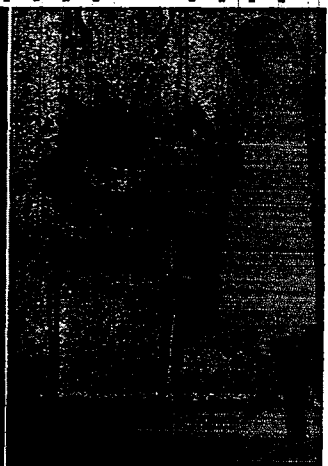
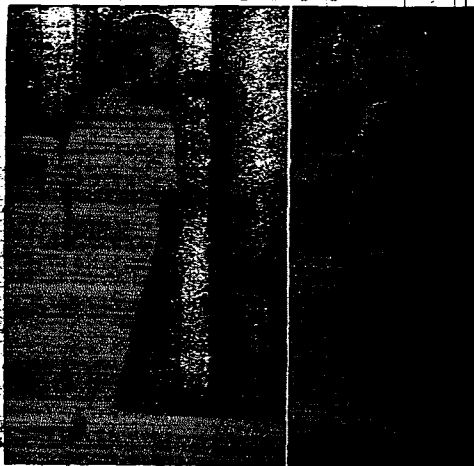
