Reduction Is Reported for County Taxes

BOYERT, Oct. 3—Mishkoka taxpayers will pay five cents less per \$100 assessed value than last year for the coming year, according to Willard Hayward, county clerk. He pointed out it was erroneously reported in Sunday's Times News there would be an increase.

He explained that the 30 cents added on for the fire building was more than offset by a 10-cent decrease in several areas, including a five-cent reduction on the sewer fund, 10-cent current cemetery-building fund; 10 cents on the revaluation program; two cents on the waste redemption fund and 15-cent reduction on the hospital maintenance fund. This is a total of 35 cents, or five cents all over the county.

A breakdown of the county districts shows an increase in the village of Heyburn of 10 cents, with a 10-cent increase for the cemetery fund and \$1.50 for the sewer bond. Aegleis shows a 10-cent drop; Mishkoka, five-cent drop; Paul, a little more than five-cent reduction; Rupert, 15-cent increase; in the city.

The part of the county within the Mishkoka county fire district and the Rupert cemetery district shows a 10-cent reduction, with five cents less on the fire district levy and the five cents off the general levy.

The area within the West End fire district and the Paul cemetery district shows an increase of five cents because of the increase of 10 cents on the cemetery levy. The area within the Heyburn cemetery district and the West End fire district shows an increase of five cents because of the increase in that cemetery levy.

Hayward explained that a 20-cent levy earmarked for the 1961 fund was removed when state tax officials and the prosecuting attorney ruled that the annual state levy include a 20-cent predatory control and sheep inspection; 50 cents for tuberculosis on cattle, horses and swine; three cents for brand inspection; three cents for honey advertising and five cents for his inspection.

SEATO Meet Will Develop New Strategy

BANGKOK, Oct. 3—The Southeast Asia Treaty organization (SEATO) top military advisers met today to draft a new strategy against possible new communist aggression in Laos and South Viet Nam.

High ranking members from the eight SEATO nations assembled here for a week-long session of preparation by subordinates. Maj. Gen. Sir Stephen Weir, New Zealand, was chairman of the 15th semi-annual conference of advisers.

Laus was high on the agenda despite a peace meeting of the kingdom's three contending princes set for Friday.

The princes will meet in the frontier village of Ban Hin Heng to seek agreement on a coalition premier for the war-torn nation.

But both the royal government and the communist-backed Pathet Lao forces, together with their "neutralist" allies, have reported building up their strength during a shaky truce period.

With the monsoon season in Laos coming to an end, western sources have expressed fears that the Reds may return to the attack soon.

Laos is under SEATO's protective umbrella. But officials here said SEATO cannot help the tiny kingdom because the Laotian government officially asks for help.

In South Viet Nam, President Ngo Dinh Diem declares yesterday that his nation faces a full-scale war rather than continued guerrilla activity.

Way to Prevent Blood Clots Is Told at Confab

CHICAGO, Oct. 3—Two University of Rochester surgeons have discovered a way of preventing blood clots during surgery with a negative electrical charge.

The technique was developed for use only against blood clots developing during surgery. It cannot prevent the formation of blood clots under ordinary circumstances.

Schwartz told observers at the 47th annual clinical congress, American College of Surgeons, that he and his colleagues tried only on dogs, used a small flashlight-like battery to charge a tiny stainless steel tube inserted into the vein or artery during surgery. He said the negative charge on the inside of the blood vessel appeared to repel the formation of clots because of the negative charge on the surface of the blood cells.

Once a clot has formed, a negative charge seems powerless to dissolve it. Schwartz said, however, little possibility of development of the technique as a treatment for ordinary thrombosis.

Army to Fire Nike Zeus in Bid to Win Missile Funds

WASHINGTON, Oct. 3 — The army plans to try again next week-end to fire its Nike Zeus antimissile out over the Pacific. The test, probably on Saturday, will come at a time when the army is bidding anew for money to start limited production of parts for the controversial system.

Nearly a month ago, on Sept. 9, army technicians made their first effort to shoot the Nike Zeus from Point Mugu, Calif. The effort ended in a skyward explosion.

Although resuffed repeatedly in the past, the army is known to be seeking again to win an allocation in next year's defense budget for starting production of long-range items for the Zeus system.

Officials declined to say how much money was being sought, but it appeared likely the request might be about 100 million dollars. The army hoped for that amount a year ago but was turned down.

In addition to production of Zeus, the army is bidding anew for money to start limited production of parts for the controversial system.

Testifying before congressional groups earlier this year, Secretary of Defense Robert S. McNamara spoke of widespread doubts as to whether the Nike Zeus would be cost-effective.

He said then that the system, mostly above ground, is vulnerable to ballistic missile attack. He also indicated he was not convinced that the Zeus could work effectively against enemy missiles screened by decoys.

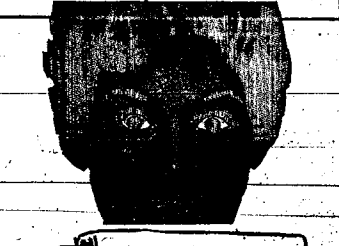
Since then, resumption of Soviet nuclear testing has given rise to speculation that the Soviets may be working on an anti-missile system.

The army hopes this development, plus Soviet threats to build a super nuclear bomb with the explosive power of 100 million tons of TNT, may cause defense officials to look more favorably on the Zeus.

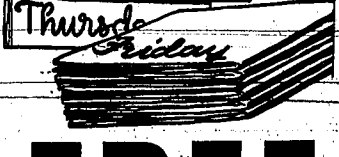
