Coming to Life

The Berlin crisis with the awakening threat of nuclear warfare has awakened Americans from a state of complacency that has existed since shortly after World War II.

On a nationwide scale, an illustration of the awakening and concern can be found in the migration of 12 families from New Jersey and New York to Chico, Calif., as a refuge from any future nuclear attack.

Nearly everywhere in the nation, people are discussing the need for shelters against radioactive fallout and a good many have been built or are under construction.

So the prime target of the executive order may be public housing which is directly subsidized by the federal government.

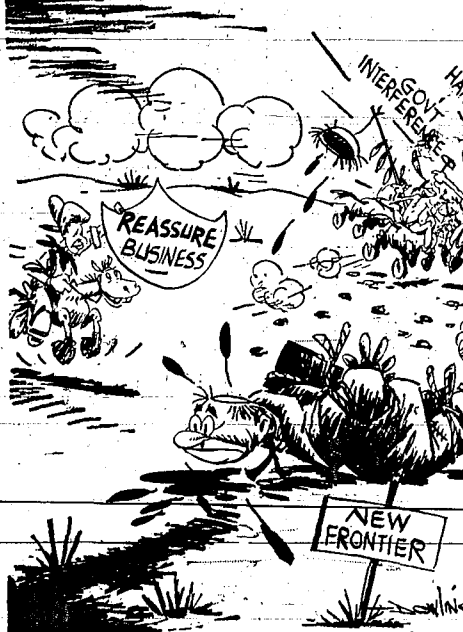

Navy Missile Is Fired for Tuneup Test

CAPE CANAVERAL, Oct. 5 (AP)—A navy test rocket fired a 1,600-mile-a-hour cruise missile yesterday in an important tune-up for the first firing from a submerged submarine.

The Elhan Altair, first nuclear submarine built to accommodate the longer range missiles, is scheduled to arrive here this week for a series of launches later in the month.

Officials had been concerned that the missile would not be ready for the submarine because of three straight shipboard launch failures. But Lockheed Aircraft, which makes the rocket, deciphered the trouble as cracking diaphragms in the first-stage engine, and yesterday's success indicated the problem may be fixed.

Hawk Sports 'Continental' Styling Flair

The 1962 Studebaker "Gran Turismo" Hawk features a distinctive new family sports car styling with a continental flair along the lines of European road cars.

Individual front bucket seats are standard. The Hawk has an instrument panel featuring dials styled as in private airplanes.

All 1962 Hawks have as standard equipment accurate vinyl headlamps, folding center arm rests on the rear seat, two-tone safety-conscious steering wheels with horn bars, wheel discs, front and rear side-arm rests, cigarette lighters, back-up lights and two-speed electric windshield wipers.

Optional features, exclusive with the Hawk in the Studebaker line are tachometer, clock, lid radio antennas and auxiliary heaters. Also available are reclining seats with individual cushions and backs. Both front and rear seats have foam cushioning.

Engineering features include a 180-cubic-inch-V8 engine. Developing 210 horsepower at 4,500 revolutions per minute, it has a torque output of 300 at 2,800 r.p.m. The standard compression ratio is 8.5 to 1.

A four-barrel carburetor also is available. This optional power plant is capable of developing 225 horsepower at 4,800 r.p.m. with a torque rating of 325 at 3,000 r.p.m.

Three-speed conventional, over-drive and automatic transmissions are offered. A special option is a four-speed transmission with floor shift. Dual exhausts are standard.

Over-all length of the Hawk body is 204 inches, with a 120.2 inch wheelbase. Wheel spacing is 34 inches when loaded, is 35.5 inches.

The Hawk has exclusive variable-rate front coil springs and anti-dive bar, with asymmetrically mounted rear springs. It has self-centering, self-emerging brakes with fused drums and bonded linings.

In the body, floors are level with the door sills. Both anchors, front and rear, are attached to the floor pan. Optional equipment includes a power steering, power brakes, twin traction "limited slip" differential, the Studebaker "hot holder" (for extra hot weather) with over-drive transmission and air conditioning.

Outstanding Hawk styling features is its "warmie" forward-slanting body panels between the roof and the fenders, panels on each side. They display the Hawk insignia and wide chrome moldings around the fenders and serve to protect the fenders, recessed rear window.

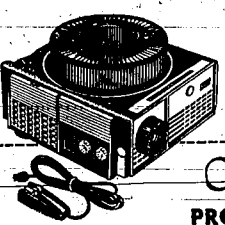

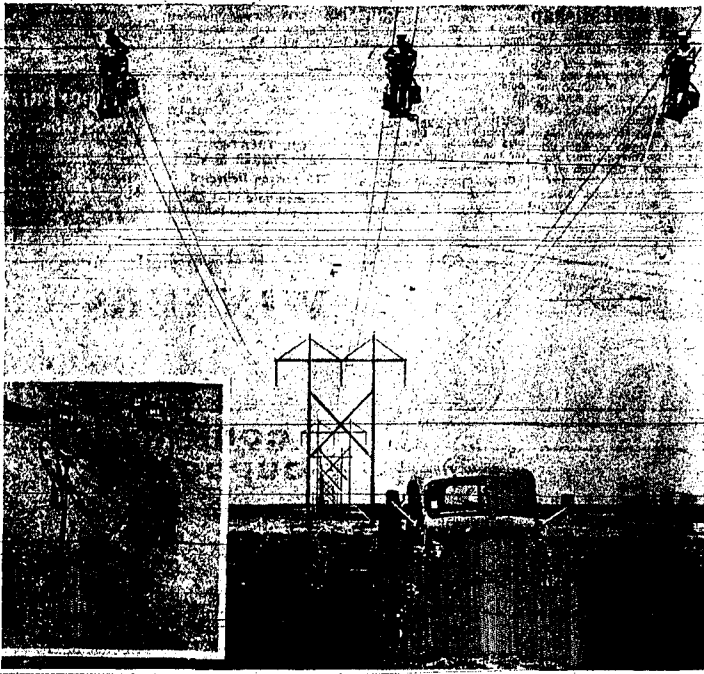

New Process Gives Water Pure as Air

EUGENE, Ore., Oct. 5 (Special)—A revolutionary new water purification process, said to be the greatest advance in water filtration since 1895, is producing water "cleaner than air" for the city of Eugene.

The Hayden Bridge water filtration plant of the Eugene water and electric board has become the first plant in the world to operate completely under the new process. In addition to producing better quality water, according to the Eugene board, it has further advantages of lower installation and operating costs and greatly increased capacity over conventional sand filtration systems.

The Eugene installation, designed by the engineering firm of Cornell, Howland, Hayes and Merrillfield of Corvallis, Seattle and Boise, has attracted wide attention, and has brought visitors from as far away as Pennsylvania. Several other installations of the process are pending. The firm has been retained as consulting engineers for Twin Falls, Ida., among other cities.
