Carver Says Pakistani Camel Driver to Be Famous on Visit to U.S.

LEWISTON, Oct. 10—Opponents of the wilderness bill appear to be opposing a bill that doesn't exist, John A. Carver, assistant secretary of the Interior, said in an interview here yesterday.

"Those who contend the bill will stifle resource development and withdraw extensive public lands are opposing a different bill and not the one that passed the Senate recently," he said.

"Some earlier versions had objectionable features," he said.

"The bill, if approved by the house next year, would start the national wilderness preservation system with nearly seven million acres in 44 national forest areas already classified as primitive or wild."

What the bill does, said Carver, is take the existing system and add some congressional control to it. "The constitutional aspect is the key to it."

"The bill doesn't add new areas," he said. "It merely expands the system's management under agencies already having the responsibility," he said.

"The only thing really new in congress taking the veto power from the executive branch," Carver said.

Pakistani Camel Driver to Be Famous on Visit to U.S.

WASHINGTON, Oct. 10—Bashir Ahmad is about to become the world's most famous camel-ride driver.

The unshaven, bare-footed Pakistani is to fame started last May 29 when Vice President Lyndon B. Johnson hopped out of a limousine in Karachi and started shaking hands with people along the road from the airport.

Bashir was one of thousands who were started by Johnson's direct, Texas-style diplomacy at every stop along his Asian tour. But Bashir's case was special. Johnson invited him to "come and visit my country," he said.

Then diplomatic and personal complications developed, delaying the trip.

Today Johnson's office reported that the visit is on, probably starting next week-end.

The vice president will greet Bashir, show him about the capital and probably take him to the Johnson ranch in Texas.

Cities and civic groups have flooded Johnson's office with offers to help show Bashir America.

Private donations through the "people-to-people" friendship program will pay his plane fare, hotel and other expenses.

The complete schedule will be worked out as soon as his arrival date here is confirmed.

Johnson's office is considering the program carefully to try to avoid any publicity that might detract from the good-will gesture.

"We don't want this to turn into a publicity circus," an aide said. "This is a genuine effort of friendship between the vice president and a very nice man who extended his own friendship to America."

Appeal Set for Man Sentenced To Hang Soon

BOISE, Oct. 10—The Idaho board of pardons will hear a clemency appeal next week for 51-year-old Robert Clowey, Boise, who is scheduled to hang Nov. 1.

Chairman of the board, Warden L. E. Clapp, said Clowey's attorney asked for an appointment for Oct. 20.

Clowey was convicted of killing a California woman in Boise two years ago.

The board is scheduled to hear a clemency appeal from Paul D. Matovich, 25-year-old former University of Idaho student, serving a 25-year sentence for second degree murder. Matovich was convicted of setting a fire five years ago at the university which took the lives of three students.

Aviatrix Batters Another Record

EDWARDS AIR FORCE BASE, Calif., Oct. 10—Jacqueline Cochran, already the world's most outstanding aviatrix, bettered her 8-year-old 100-mile-per-hour, 121-mile-an-hour, 101-mile-per-hour record yesterday.

Northrop corporation, which provided the 738 jet trainer in which Miss Cochran has set all her recent records, announced that she flew the 100-mile-per-hour closed course at an average speed of 194.37 miles per hour.

Her old record, set in 1953 in a Canadian-built P86 fighter, was 192.52 miles per hour.

Miss Cochran holds every major woman's international air speed record and since late August has set seven new speed marks.

Conservative Target Might Be Fulbright

WASHINGTON, Oct. 10.—A king-sized effort apparently is going to be made by conservatives to unseat Sen. J. William Fulbright, D. Ark., in next year's Arkansas senatorial primary.

Fulbright, who heads the Senate foreign relations committee, is the target of this yesterday-announced effort. It is a candidate for reelection "unless it is obvious the people of Arkansas no longer want me to represent them."

Fulbright added that he was aware of some dissatisfaction among state voters because of his involvement with foreign affairs.

Because he is outspoken in his views, Fulbright has raised some state department eyebrows with recent comments. His statement in London last week that the state bears heavy responsibilities for the situation in Berlin disturbed Kennedy administration leaders.

Back in this country, Fulbright called an airport news conference to say that his remarks were not "deliberate military tactics" employed by western leaders in 1944 and 1945 and not at current talks about Berlin.

This may have left the Arkansas senator in a sort of half-shirt classification, so far as the administration is concerned. But few politicians thought it disturbed the Arkansas voters materially.

Much more important from a state standpoint, perhaps, may have been Fulbright's memorandum to Secretary of Defense Robert S. McNamara in which the senator complained about military sponsorship of "extremist" forums about alleged communist infiltration in schools, churches and government.

In the opinion of the alleged muxing of military leaders, Sen. Strom Thurmond, D. S.C., has won an inquiry by a sponsor of subcommittee into the situation.

Rep. Dale Alford, D. Ark., who has aligned himself with several conservative groups, has given every sign that he intends to contest Fulbright for the nomination. In the background is Gov. Orval Faubus who might decide to go after the senatorial nomination.

License Granted to Produce Second Type Polio Vaccine

WASHINGTON, Oct. 10.—The public health service granted a license for manufacture of the second of three new oral polio vaccines being developed for general use in this country.

This is the type of the easy-to-take Sabin vaccine. Type one was approved Aug. 17. The health service said type three was not expected to be available for some months. Each protects against a different type of polio.

Surgeon General Luther L. Terry, emphasized the desirability of those not immunized to be vaccinated—by needle—with Salk vaccine. It is the only available vaccine that protects against all three types of polio.

The type two oral vaccine, as it comes from the manufacturer, has no taste or color, a health service spokesman said.

However, it is a liquid that can be given by being dropped on a sugar cube or mixed with a sugar syrup and with certain approved colors to make it more palatable to youngsters.

The newly licensed vaccine will be manufactured in Sandwich, England, by Pfizer, Ltd., which also received the type one license. In announcing issuance of the new license, Terry said the service has ordered 1.8-million doses of the new vaccine to add to the scientific stocks maintained at the service's headquarters.

Navy Doesn't Believe Russ A-Sub Claim

WASHINGTON, Oct. 10 (AP)—"We don't believe it" was the reaction today of a top navy anti-submarine warfare authority to a Soviet claim that the Soviet fleet has the world's fastest fleet of nuclear submarines.

The authority, who did not want to be quoted by name, said the navy thinks the Soviets have a small fleet of nuclear submarines.

But he added: "If they have a submarine up to the state of the Nautilus we'd be surprised."

The Nautilus was the first nuclear submarine. It was commissioned about seven years ago and the navy since has evolved more advanced models.

The U. S. fleet now has 15 nuclear attack submarines. A 15th will be commissioned shortly.

Thirteen others are in various stages of construction. Even the fleet is a 500-mile-range Regulus guided missile.

An increasingly important element of U. S. striking power is the Soviet submarine, capable of firing atomic-tipped rockets over 1,200 miles. Six of these are in combat readiness. The navy has more either being launched or are being built.

The navy has conceded the Soviets the capability to detect and identify submarines, but has not reported sighting any.

One authority estimated the Soviets are behind the United States—in what he called a rudimentary state of the art.

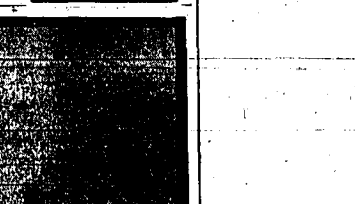
Firefighters said if the tank had exploded the flames probably would have spread to all the 20-odd tanks in the area.

BOISE, Oct. 18 (AP)—The national director of the farmers home administration said here today that recent congressional action will enable many rural areas residents to improve homes and domestic water systems.

FHA Administrator Howard Berlach said the water supply systems of many small rural communities are badly in need of repair and enlargement.

"We have had quite a bit of success in helping farm families develop water systems," said Berlach. "Now we can also help their neighbors in town."

State FHA Administrator Max Hanson augmented on the national administrator's remarks by pointing out urban and farm recent assistance taken to strengthen farm income.

Hanson said farmers who need supervised credit will find it easier to obtain the tractors, combine, milking machines and other equipment essential to modern-day farming.

Hanson also said families living in small town and rural areas and on farms now can have housing comparable to that of city families with the recently enacted federal housing act of 1961.

Idaho state staff officials are meeting here with Idaho credit specialists of the farmers home administration to discuss the broad-scale expansion of the agricultural credit system brought about by recent congressional action.

The FHA officials listed three measures taken within recent months to strengthen agriculture.

First a complete over-hauling and modernization of the supervised agricultural credit system has been called for.

Second, there is need for a greatly expanded rural housing program and this program is being carried out.

And last, a new rural areas development program that will bring funds and technical skills to help depressed rural communities regain their economic strength has been instituted.

Murder Hinted in 1959 U. N. Death

WASHINGTON, Oct. 18 (AP)—The Senate Internal Security subcommittee has suggested that U. N. diplomat Eugene Jensen's death in 1959 may have been murder instead of suicide as police ruled.

The Senate group said last night that Eugene Jensen, assistant secretary of the U. N. investigation of the 1957 Hungarian revolt, may have been the victim of "political murder" by the Soviet "secret apparatus."

In a report on an inquiry headed by Sen. Thomas J. Dodd, D. Conn., the subcommittee said:

"There are too many solid arguments against suicide, too many unanswered questions, too many serious reasons for suspecting Soviet motivation and the possibility of Soviet implication."

Track Coach at University Compiling Data on Early Era of Latin America

UNIVERSITY OF IDAHO, Oct. 18 (AP)—Mosquito means a nuisance to insect to most people, and Zambo connotes bowlegs or knock-knees to a Spaniard, but to University of Idaho track coach William Sorby the combination of Zambo-Mosquito means one thing—the possibility of two advanced degrees in history.

Actually, Zambo-Mosquito means nothing to do with insect or poor physique, as the handsome, 37-year-old physical education instructor explains it. They are hybrid natives who have supplied an interesting episode in Latin American history.

Sorby, who majored in history for his bachelor's degree at the University of Oregon prior to his appointment at Idaho, is compiling a master's thesis on the Negro-Indians.

He first became aware of this little-known native tribe while visiting in Costa Rica. Sorby has since decided to write his master's thesis about their development.

To gain information on the obscure origin of the tribe, Sorby spent his summer months searching the national archives of Costa Rica translating early government letters concerning armed attacks by the Zambo-Mosquito. Other research was done in the library of the University of Costa Rica and the National Library in San Jose, Costa Rica.

Looking as much at home in a dinner jacket as a track suit, Sorby has the tenacity of a historian enabling him to spend a

month in a library when necessary translating Spanish documents. From what he learned that the half-breed race came into being over 300 years ago when a Portuguese slave ship broke up off the coast of Nicaragua.

"The slaves were able to escape the wreckage and beach on the north coast about an hour's flight from the Nicaraguan capital, Managua," said Sorby. "Upon landing, the slaves came into contact with the inhabiting Mosquito Indians. After a series of attacks, the slaves took over the area."

"From 1599 to 1786, the Zambo-Mosquito carried on almost incessant war with Spanish settlements along the coast. They eventually became recognized by the English government as a kingdom, organizing their own kings, courts and flag."

At the present, descendants of this violent-tribe origin are citizens of Nicaragua, Costa Rica, Guatemala, and Honduras. Many of them, as a result of their varied background, can speak four languages.

"Soon after I arrived in Costa Rica, I went into a store in the coastal town of Puerto Viejo and found a small group of the natives taking. I listened to their loud discussion for some time attempting to identify the language. I thought of every tongue I could recognize but without success. Then I heard one mention 'Mickey Mantle' and 'home run.' It was English.

"Their English has a musical rhythm and it's hard for an American to understand," said Sorby. "Sometimes they read all four languages together. My favorite phrase obtained in conversation is, 'Whatta-matta-you-man?'"

Stressing the Zambo's in Costa Rica in his thesis, Sorby has found a great store of material in the Latin American archives and libraries that has never been touched. He will continue his study throughout the year while teaching track and acting as state coordinator-chairman of track and field projects for the government-sponsored "Operation, Fitness-U.S.A."

He hopes to finish his master's thesis in December, then continue the Zambo-Mosquito study in Managua toward a doctor's degree.

He will meet a fellow physical education teacher in Heidelberg, Germany, next summer to tour Northern European track meets in Germany, Finland, Sweden, Norway and Denmark.
