

U.N. Votes Immediate East-West Resumption Of Nuclear Tests Talks

UNITED NATIONS, N. Y., Nov. 6 (AP)—The main U. N. political committee today approved a 11-8 British resolution calling for immediate resumption of East-West negotiations on a treaty to ban nuclear bomb testing. The vote in the 103-member committee was 66-11 with 16 abstaining. The Soviet bloc, Mongolia and Cuba cast the negative votes. But the proposed talks appeared doomed in advance.

Jerome Boy Killed By Beet Harvester

JEROME, Nov. 6—Johnny A. Sirucek, 11-year-old son of Mr. and Mrs. Harry Sirucek, was killed Sunday afternoon when he was run over by a beet harvester on the Sirucek farm 11 miles east and one mile south of Jerome. His father was driving the harvester and the boy was playing around it with his brother and sisters. Dr. Loren Neher, Jerome county coroner, reported no injuries were seen. The cause of death is believed to be a skull fracture.

Fire Razes Portions of Spud Plant

TURLEY, Nov. 6—Fire destroyed the main section of the Shelby potato processing plant, 615 West Ninth street, here, shortly after midnight. Wallace Carrier, plant manager, said the cause of the fire was not known until Tuesday morning after adjusters have inspected the damage. However, he reported the fire was confined to the main building and apparently black buildings, room vacated and Carrier said there was no smoke damage throughout the plant.

Fire chief Otis Williams said fire sprang from the drier section of the building to the room, where it was hard to combat. Eighteen firemen, using 12½-inch hoses, fought the blaze for about five hours.

Carrier said that about 100 persons will be out of work for about 30 to 60 days, but he indicated the company would try to have the drier section of the plant back in operation in 30 days.

About 40 persons were working in the main section of the plant when the fire broke out. Dried mashed potatoes were processed in the burned section.

Berlin Fence Down Under Gas Barrages

BERLIN, Nov. 6.—West Berlin police successfully defended the city against a series of gas barrages fired from an elevated track in West Berlin. It was reported that the gas was fired from the East Berlin side.

Four West Berlin policemen were injured in the attack on the fence in West Berlin territory. With them went 12 West Berlin police and a French army officer.

Border guards on the communist side were expected to return the gas. They refused.

The East Berliners began the gas barrages on Tuesday night. Each side hurled about an equal number.

The practice of dumping of dead animals, garbage, cans, tires and debris on the public land on undesignated dump sites creates both a health and nuisance problem, Fallini notes. Unsanitary trash along an important highway and scenic Snake river canyon rim is a disgrace to the state and local communities, he added.

Recently the Jerome county commissioners and the BLM joined in a project to remove trash and clean the area. Signs were posted warning of dumping. Some instances local residents have failed to respect the position of the BLM. The BLM has continued. Frequent patrolling of the area is made by the BLM. The signs are being replaced. The checks received in apprehension of three violators who have been served notices of trespass.

Fallini pointed out that BLM is doing its job and cooperative efforts of local citizens and organizations in the campaign to clean up the dumpsites.

Local residents are urged by BLM to dump any dead animals, tires, cans, etc., in designated areas and to cooperate with BLM and county officials in the campaign to prevent unauthorized dumping.

BRUSSELS, Nov. 6 (AP)—The six European common market charter members have failed to agree on the copy of the British membership application, reliable diplomatic sources said today.

Ministers of the six—France, West Germany, Italy, Belgium, the Netherlands and Luxembourg—met here Wednesday and Thursday with Edward Heath, top prime minister of Britain, to discuss European affairs expert in the British government.

Indian, U. S. Leaders Will Discuss Bomb

NEWPORT, R. I., Nov. 6 (AP)—President Kennedy and Prime Minister Nehru will meet today to begin discussions of problems the world over, with heavy emphasis expected to be put on nuclear tests.

Nehru has called the "intest" of Soviet nuclear tests "the evil thing."

Kennedy last week set in motion preparations for U. S. tests in the atmosphere. He said the country will conduct explosions in the air if an evaluation of the Soviet Union's tests indicates that U. S. tests are necessary for the security of this country and the free world.

Nehru is expected to press Kennedy for a moratorium on nuclear tests.

Kennedy last night reiterated his position that the important thing is to stop all tests now without prejudice.

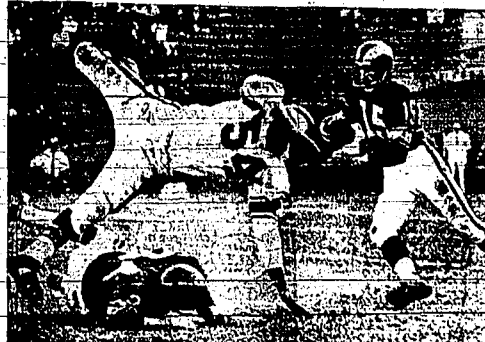
