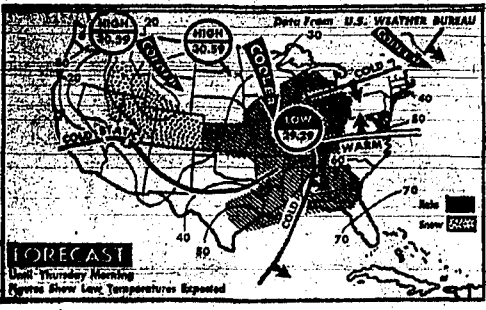

WALLA WALLA, Nov. 15 (AP)—Army engineers reported Tuesday they will shut off the entire flow of the big Snake river for 14 hours starting Nov. 27 as a way in filling the Ice Harbor reservoir. They don't expect any loss of fish or inconvenience in navigation. The effect of the cutoff will be limited because the lake behind McNary dam on the Columbia, 25 miles below the mouth of the Snake, backs water clear to the Ice Harbor dam. And more water will let through upstream Columbia river dams to compensate for the halt during the Ice Harbor cutoff.

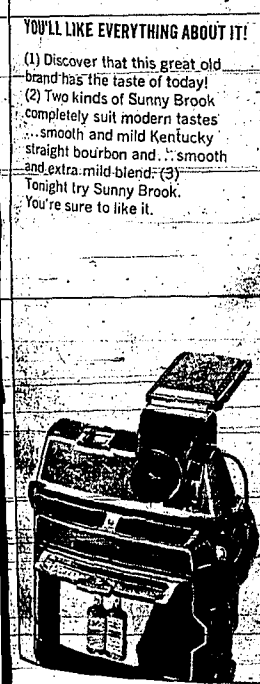

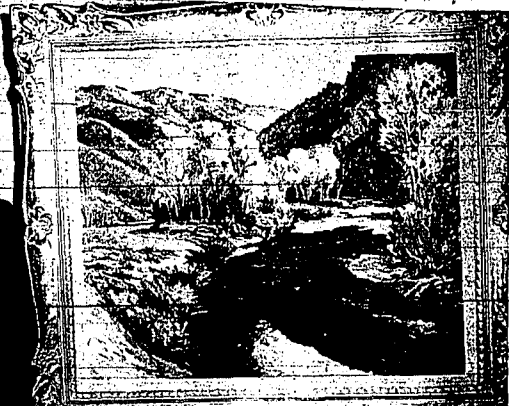

Famed Wives Disagreed on Peace Moves

WASHINGTON, Nov. 15—Mrs. John F. Kennedy and Mrs. Lyndon B. Johnson agreed that women should exert their influence for peace.

But, like their husbands, they differed on how to go about achieving peace. Each echoed her husband in earlier replies to the women's "quest for peace" launched here last week.

The letters were received Monday by Mrs. Dagmar Wilson, a Washington mother of three who was one of the organizers of the movement.

Mrs. Kennedy mentioned that her husband knows the first lady and that she is confident she will do everything in his power to aid him.

She also made a pitch for Kennedy's policy—"I know that you agree with me that the only way to peace for us is strength and therefore join in support of the president's administration, in which are dedicated toward that end."

Mrs. Johnson said that she "has been made to destroy our trust, to kill our husbands, to take us from our children."

Among those she said were being such threats she listed the name of an American name—Margaret Smith.

The reference was to Sen. Margaret M. Smith, R.-Mo., whose demand that U. S. defense should avoid nuclear power had angered Khrushchev.

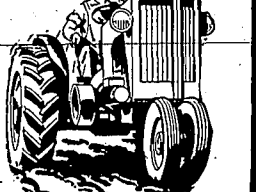

Leftist Congo Chief Defies U.N.'s Orders

LEOPOLDVILLE, the Congo, Nov. 18 (AP)—Antoine Gizenga, the leftist heir of former Premier Patrice Lumumba, has emerged into open and forceful defiance of the United Nations and the central Congo government, diplomatic informants said today.

Gizenga, said the sources, is directing the mutiny of more than 10,000 Congolese troops against the central government authority in Kinshasa, the Katanga province north of the secessionist province of Katanga.

Other mutineers were reported to have created serious disorders in the north Katanga city of Albertville.

A U. N. spokesman said it intends to put down lawlessness in the two towns by force if necessary.

Diplomatic sources said the leftwing politician set himself up in Kinshasa Saturday, leaving his former stronghold at Stanleyville in Oriental province—once-time allies who now adhere to the Leopoldville government.

Truman Predicts No Nuclear War

KANSAS CITY, Mo., Nov. 18 (AP)—President Harry S. Truman said Monday that he does not believe there will be an atomic war.

Answering questions put to him by high-ranking educators attending the centennial session of the American Association of Land-Grant Colleges, Truman recalled an incident when he was a Jackson county judge—the equivalent of a county commissioner.

At that time, he said, there was a railroad underpass between here and Independence where "the road came in and formed two right angles."

"I called in the county engineer and asked him what could be done about it and he told me, 'why, you don't need to do anything about that; it's so damned dangerous, it's safe.'"

Economist Urges Student Wages

KANSAS CITY, Mo., Nov. 18 (AP)—A University of Chicago economist suggested Tuesday that students should be paid to go to college.

Prof. H. W. Schultz said that such a practice would be one way of ending the waste of student time and bringing about basic reforms in higher education.

Schultz told the American Association of Land Grant Colleges and State Universities that colleges and universities seriously underestimate the value of the time students spend at college.

"I would like to see one explain the wastage of the time of the student!"

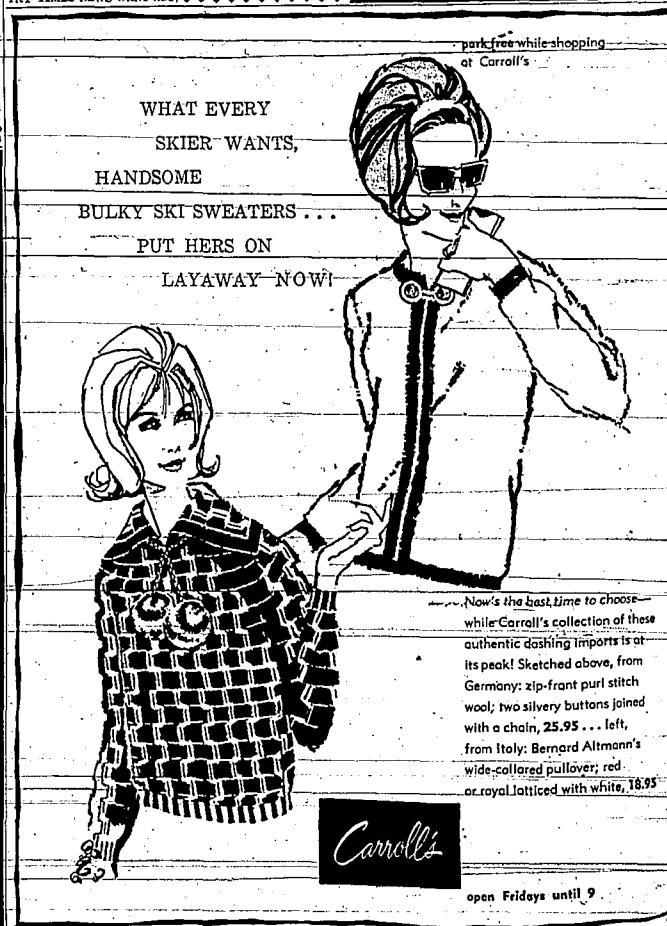

Sportsmen Will Sit in on Stream Pollution Meeting

Members of the Southern Idaho Fish and Game association approved representation at a state public health meeting in Twin Falls Thursday to present the wildlife side in the matter of stream pollution.

Dr. Luther Thompson, director of the Southcentral district health department, said the state will conduct a public meeting at 3 p. m. Thursday at the Idaho Power company auditorium. The board will review other statewide matters from 10 a. m. to 3 p. m., at which time the pollution of Snake river will become the main topic.

Sportsmen expressed fear the health department will drop the matter after the health hazard has been removed while fish life still will be endangered.

The dumping of raw potatoes from industrial plants in the Burley-Rupert area, combined with sewage wastes, has made the Snake river "dead water." Oxidation of the organic wastes is drawing all the oxygen from the water, killing all marine life. Dr. Thompson said the potato wastes do not constitute a hazard to humans but they provide culture beds for bacteria found in sewage.

For that reason, the sportsmen felt the health department may stop action once sewage treatment plants end the dumping of raw human wastes into the stream.

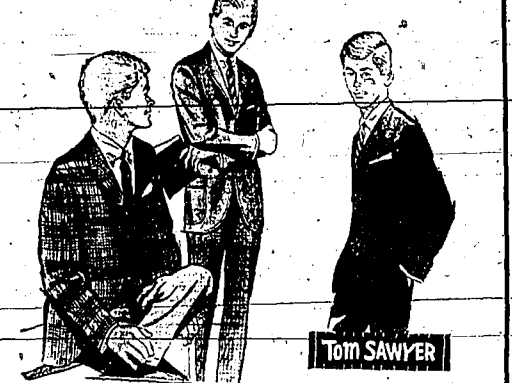

Buffalo Win Nets "Coach of Week" Award for Nagel

SALT LAKE CITY, Nov. 15 (UPI)—Four years ago a young man completing his studies for a law degree testified in his own behalf before a special committee as a candidate for the University of Utah coaching job. The articulate, ambitious prospective lawyer made a good impression and won his case by being named Utah's youngest head coach in history.

Last week the confident 24-year-old coach who set aside his law books gained the biggest victory in his brief coaching career when his team upset nationally ranked Colorado University.

It's Ray Nagel, this week's selection as United Press International "coach of the week." The business-like coach won the honor for his team's 21-12 upset over Colorado.

Nagel, who holds a business and law degree from UCLA, began the 1957 season faced with Utah's toughest schedule in history. Many figured the team would be a "fish" with a 5-5 record. With only Saturday's big game with Utah State in the Utes are 9-3 for the season.
