NATIONAL WERLIG

WASHINGTON, Nov. 15—President Kennedy is now doing one of the things he criticized President Eisenhower for doing about 1953: Making political use of the Pentagon.
During last year's election campaign, Mr. Kennedy and other lower appointees in the defense department went out and snared the services of the military and the Republicans. The Democrats said they were going to do this in 1953 and in 1952, and they deplored this mixing of national defense and party politics.

Dangerous Plan

The National Potato Council may have averted a showdown battle over potato acreage controls and other methods of handling the potato crop.
The means of avoiding a fight carries a real threat to Idaho. Some 200 delegates agreed without a record vote, to turn the whole problem over to a national advisory committee. At the same time, the danger to Idaho of the potato industry.

Inasmuch as the compromise action was approved by the council meeting, members of the council apparently have bound themselves to follow whatever action is recommended by a national advisory group.
The committee is to establish an advisory committee to formulate a comprehensive industry program. And if that doesn't put the whole potato industry into the hands of the politicians, nothing ever will.

You can count on your fingers the number of real, workable solutions to agricultural problems that have come from the office of the secretary of agriculture, regardless of who happened to have the title. And politicians have brought terrific pressure to bear on the secretary. As a matter of fact, the secretary himself is a political appointee.

It's not difficult to see the pattern that will develop now for potato growers. Some sort of plan will be suggested and potato growers will get a chance to vote on it. If votes are weighted according to the tonnage of potatoes produced, Idaho will have a fairly good voice in the proceedings. But the usual procedure is to permit each grower one vote, disregarding production. Or, and it looks like Idaho farmers face a threat of some sort of controls they have approved by a lopsided margin.

Whenever any problem is pushed into politics, Idaho is handicapped. Because of smallness and relatively small population, Idaho has no real voice in the political field. The disadvantage for Idaho potato growers was carried into the National Potato Council election with the top officers coming from North Carolina, Colorado, Wisconsin and California. Idaho, the largest in the nation, isn't represented among council officers. For the record, Idaho produces roughly twice as many potatoes as the four states represented by council officers.

Idaho has built an enviable reputation for its potatoes and has consistently marketed spots at premium prices in the face of some rather hot competition. Now Idaho must use every possible means to keep the politicians from interfering with Idaho potatoes.

STILL PLAYING

Three Jerome youths faced charges of reckless driving after an incident that involved an accident in Jerome and resulting auto chase to Wendell. None of them is likely to appreciate the fact that one was killed, although the whole thing roughly paralleled a situation in Twin Falls last summer in which a young man died.

It was just about the same story all over again, substituting a different locale. Teen-agers in a car, apparently looking for some excitement, provoked teen-agers in another car and a third auto joined in "just for fun." During the "game" that resulted, two cars crashed, one youngster jumped onto the side of a car and hung on for about half a block while the auto roared down the street. He was lucky, his counterpart in the Twin Falls incident last summer was killed.

It's rather discouraging to read about the repeat performance. Although youngsters can't be expected to remember it forever, the Twin Falls example should have been a rather forceful illustration that it's dangerous to use cars as toys.

The lesson from the Jerome accident and chase seems to be that more such incidents will occur and that there are still some youths who do not realize the danger hanging over their heads every instant they are misusing automobiles.

Cars serve their basic purpose rather well in that they provide a means of transportation over a rather lavish network of highways and roads. But every one should bear in mind that automobiles are not toys and the highways and streets were not designed for use as playgrounds.

So long as autos are misused as they were in both the Twin Falls and Jerome incidents, the public can expect more of such senseless antics with the ever-present possibility of another tragedy.

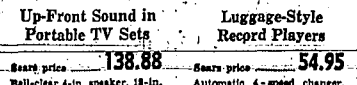

New Program For Military Lectures Set

WASHINGTON, Nov. 16 (AP)— Pentagon officials hope to have ready in a few weeks a new three-year program for indoctrinating U.S. troops on such matters as democracy, communism and citizenship.

It is expected to be in shape for hearings by a Senate subcommittee on defense department policies in this field and related lectures from Thursday, D. C. The hearings, which could be lengthy, are scheduled to begin Nov. 27.

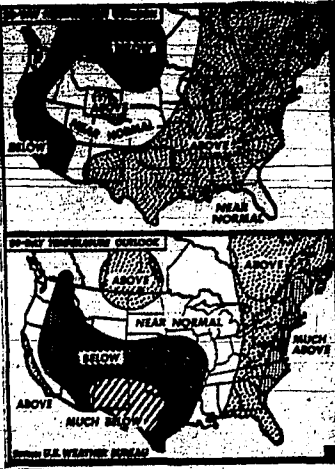
From all indications, the new plan will not be a radical departure from the present armed forces information and education program.

Mainly, it will aim at a more coordinated use of films, pamphlets, military posters and radio and television to get ideas across. Planners said another important feature is that for the first time the information and education program will be based on more than a year-to-year basis, giving field commanders more lead time to train their own local programs.

Officials acknowledged that local commanders will not be required to stay within the limits of the Pentagon-supplied material.

Thus, the new program will look at itself as a radical departure from the present program, the incident which recently led to Maj. Gen. Edward A. Walker's resignation from the army.

BOISE, Nov. 16 (AP)—The leader of a movement to legalize gambling in Idaho, and Wednesday the attention given a controversial wilderness bill is detracting from his efforts.

"Ever since this wilderness dispute started," said Vernon K. Smith, Boise attorney, "nobody says a bad thing about us. We're beginning to feel neglected."

Smith is president of Tourists for Idaho, Unlimited, an organization which says its aim is to elect a governor, lieutenant governor and legislators who are favorable to gambling. Smith has indicated he may run for the Democratic nomination for governor on such a platform.

Couple Has \$500 "Day in Court"

LOUISVILLE, Ky., Nov. 16 (AP)—When the government offered a Hardinburg couple \$17,500 for about 30 acres of their land, they went to court. It cost them \$500.

A federal district court jury Wednesday awarded Mrs. Jerry Harboe \$17,000 for the land, needed by the federal government for use in construction of the Rough river reservoir flood control project.

Best Air Service Possible Favored by T. F. Chamber

The Twin Falls Chamber of Commerce favors the most adequate air service available here, declares William O. Koch, president.

The statement came in the wake of meetings here with officials of Bonanza airlines which are seeking certification for flight to Boise.

He adds that the chamber feels Twin Falls has a strong community of interest with Nevada towns and should be on a direct route to Elko, Ely and Las Vegas.

Bids Sought for Work at College

BOISE, Nov. 16 (AP)—The state department of public works called Wednesday for bids, to be opened Nov. 30, on re-roofing of five apartment buildings, six classroom buildings and one storage building on the Magic Valley Christian college campus in Albion.

The campus is owned by the state but is leased for private operation of the school.

The 1961 legislature appropriated about \$50,000 for maintenance work on the campus.

Psychologist Is Heard by Rotary Club

SALT LAKE CITY, Nov. 16 (AP)—Despite an undefeated 8-0-1 record, one of the nation's top ground and total defense clubs and a 41-point per game scoring average, the nagging doubt persists: Just how good is Utah State? An estimated 31,000 fans are expected to jam the stadium here Saturday when Utah State, all the stakes of a thrilling season ride on the outcome of the traditional Utah State-Idaho football rivalry. Although three-beaten Utah is a two-touchdown underdog, the Redskins showed they can play with the best last week-end when they bumped Colorado from the unbeaten ranks 21-12 on the passing arm of sophomore Gary Breece.

Top Skyline Runner, Passer Will Collide

DENVER, Nov. 16 (AP)—The Skyline conference's best runner and its top passer will collide in a head-on collision at Salt Lake City Saturday when unbeaten Utah State tangles with Utah's giant killers in their season finale. The Utags can gain a share of the conference championship with a victory, but the individual duel offers a fine side attraction.

Three Teams Dominate U.S. Grid Offense

NEW YORK, Nov. 16 (AP)—Texas' top-ranked Longhorns and Mississippi's Rebels, who could wind up the season in a Cotton-bowl test of "strength," dominate major college football's offensive attack along with unranked Utah State.

Once-beaten Ole Miss, sixth-ranked in the nation, is the top offensive eleven in the country with an average of 424.4 yards gained on the ground and 210.0 yards in the air each game. Texas is the runner-up at 412.4 with Utah State third at 399.2, according to NCAA service bureau figures released today.

Texas, however, is No. 1 in rushing and the only team over 300 yards per game with a per game average of 318.0. Utah State is second with a 292.3 mark while Ole Miss follows on a 272.3 pickup every outing.

In passing, Texas and Utah State are out of it, but Mississippi is second behind leading Detroit. The Titans have compiled a 206.6 average passing to Mississippi's 178.8 with Holy Cross third at 171.9.

The point tri-lakes over again in scoring with Utah State grabbing the No. 1 spot by averaging over 41.1 points a game, Texas holding the runner-up position with 39 and Mississippi tied for third with New Mexico State at 33.1.

LSU Overlooks Race in Bowl Bid

Voices in the Nov. 7 election were canvassed, showing 945 in favor to 844 against, which is 52.4 per cent. A new election was necessary.

The election in the second year, voter approval of the \$1.1 million increase to provide funds for needed expansion of school buildings.

Moore's report that election last June also failed by a slim margin.

The board instructed the superintendent to curtail all except emergency expenditures essential to the basic operation of the schools in Cassia county. It was pointed out that less than seven additional rooms will be needed for elementary students next fall.

To enable providing the recognized program—resulting from the increased enrollment, the board discontinued all transportation to ball games, music clinics and festivals outside the county limits, with the exception of activities involved, effective Jan. 1.

Scheduled replacement of old school equipment will be continued until requirements for the additional students have been met, including school buses, typewriters, music instruments, athletic equipment, science equipment and audio visual equipment. The scheduled purchase or replacement of texts will be postponed. New references and supplementary texts are not to be ordered.

The board also requested a new survey of all means of increasing the present capacity of the school plant, with estimated cost of adapting such space to classrooms. School bus routes will be examined to determine if changes may be necessary to assure full utilization of all rooms to an equalized maximum capacity.

The board voiced its appreciation to those who supported the election and regretted curtailment of the program is necessary but believes such action is necessary to provide minimum requirements for the anticipated enrollment.

Turkey, Pork Are Bargains For Shoppers

By The Associated Press
 Housewives who want to get an early start on their family's Thanksgiving dinner will find turkeys available at bargain-basement prices at many supermarkets and neighborhood groceries this week-end.

Turkey prices are as much as 10 cents a pound under a year ago. Chargin roasts are 20 to 25 cents a pound for 10 to 15-pound turkeys in the Chicago area and 25 cents for 18 pounds-plus around New York.

For this week-end, pork in a wide variety of cuts offers the greatest number of bargains.

Smoked hams seem to be the most popular item. Regional offerings include loin roast in the Northeast; chop, spare ribs and smoked butts in the Midwest; and picnic, sausage and bacon in the Southeast.

Beef specials are scattered, although round, sirloin and porterhouse steaks are featured in the Midwest and chuck-and-shoulder roasts in the Southeast.

Broiler-fryers are marked down in the Midwest and Southwest, while other poultry specials include baking hens in the Southeast and duck in the Southwest. Fryers are marked up 3 to 2 cents a pound in California, but this is partly offset by 3-cent cuts in veal and calf in the Los Angeles area.

Eggs are 1 to 5 cents a dozen higher in the West and 2 to 4 cents higher in the East. Even so, they're 12 to 18 cents a dozen less expensive than a year ago in the New York area.

Cranberries and processed cranberry products are plentiful. Raisins, cauliflower, cabbage, corn, onions, potatoes, turnips, spinach, squash, celery, lettuce, sweet potatoes and tomatoes.
