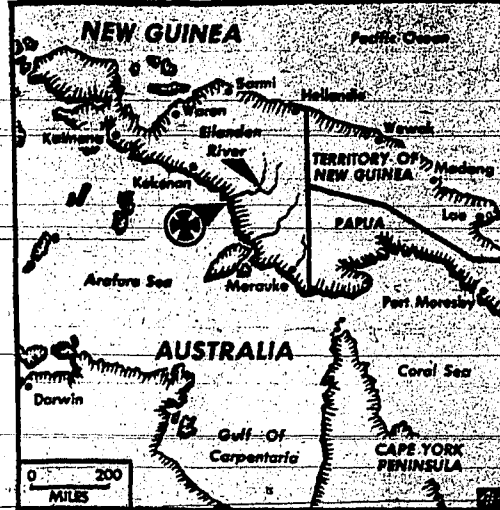

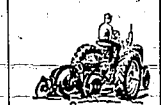

WASHINGTON, Nov. 20.—As an aftermath of Speaker Sam Rayburn's death, house Democrats may be caught up in a contest over who will become floor leader.

The possibility of a fight was raised Sunday by the disclosure that Rep. Richard Bolling of Missouri will seek the post left open when Rep. John W. McCormack of Massachusetts steps up as expected to the speakership.

While Bolling himself was not available for comment, it was learned on the best authority he will challenge Rep. Carl Albert of Oklahoma for the floor leadership.

Bolling had been the only name mentioned as a likely opponent of McCormack for the speakership. His decision to run for the number two post in the house high command made it almost certain McCormack would succeed Rayburn.

McCormack became acting speaker when Albert forced Rayburn to leave the capitol last August.

Bolling was designated acting floor leader by McCormack and his formal election had been taken for granted until Bolling decided to make it a contest. Albert made his own entrance official Sunday night, when he formally announced at his McLeister, Okla., home that he would seek the post.

A caucus of House Democrats will select the new speaker and floor leader shortly before the house reconvenes Jan. 10. Unless Bolling or Albert withdraws before the caucus, the contest will develop into a knock-down party-splitting affair that could jeopardize the administration's legislative program, already in trouble in the house.

Bolling, 46, has long been identified with the liberal group in the house, although he calls himself a moderate. He has been one of the powerful rules committee spokesmen.

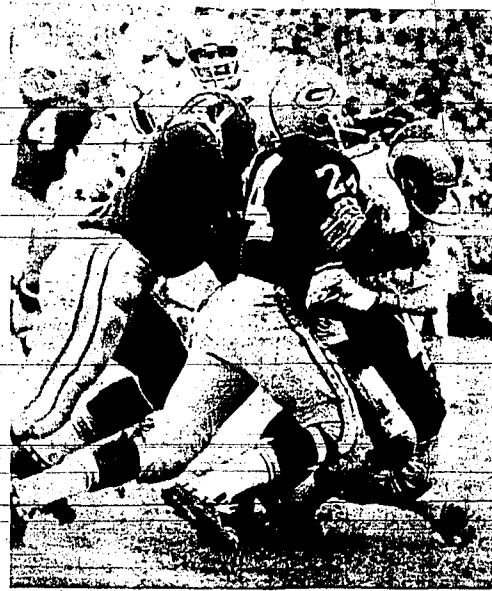

### Senator Says Reds Getting U.S. Supplies

WASHINGTON, Nov. 20 (AP)—Sen. James Buckley, R-N.Y., said today that the United States is providing military supplies to the Chinese Reds in the form of military equipment.

Buckley called for a legislative body governing exports to the communist bloc.

"We are sending out billions of dollars worth of military supplies to the Reds," he said.

He said in 1960 the "total value of American exports to the Reds" exceeded four million dollars and we're still sending goods there.

Buckley noted that among the items sent are steel sheets, industrial chemicals and machinery.

"We are not repeating the error that our own scrap metal is being fired back at us," he declared.

The New York Republican acknowledged that "a large part of the problem is the free alliance between the Reds and the Chinese."

He also said a close look should be taken of the activities of American subsidiaries of American companies.

"We are shipping strategic materials which the parent companies are reluctant to ship by American flag," he said.

## Mountain Search and Rescue Unit for Idaho Was Organized by 2 Boise Men

BOISE, Nov. 20 (AP)—The idea of a specialized search unit designed to cope with Idaho's rugged mountain country and heavy snow conditions was conceived last year by two Boise men.

"Their idea has resulted in the formation of the Idaho Mountain Search and Rescue unit."

Already, the privately financed volunteer group has shown its effectiveness and created interest in other areas.

"The organization is headed by a 35-year-old native of Switzerland—Fred B. Weber, a mechanical engineer with the Idaho highway department."

Weber and another Boise enthusiast, David Salvis, conceived the idea of the Idaho unit on the way home from the Squaw Valley Winter Olympics last year, where they were part of the Olympic Ski patrol.

Moves toward mountain rescue units have been going on for 20 years in the Mount Everest area in Washington and Mount Hood area in Oregon, Weber said. Those two states now have extensive mountain rescue units, he said, and the idea has spread to other states.

In Europe, he said, rescue units were formed on the chamber of commerce level. "In Switzerland and Austria," he said, "they feel that as long as people come to spend money there, they should have some kind of rescue service."

"We decided we should have something like that here," Weber said.

The unit was still in the formative stage when two youths, including a Bogus basin near Boise last year, failed to return, Weber said.

The sheriff's office contacted Salvis.

Weber said to call the Bogus basin ski patrol," Weber said. "It took us a long time to get organized. Only five guys showed up and we forgot half our equipment."

"It is not our part or the part of others to go into any county except under direction of the proper authority," he said.

Sometimes it may not be practical to wait in an emergency," he said. "But somebody tries to get hold of the sheriff 'on a negative-control type of approach."

"The unit is recognized, he said, and has a working understanding with the U. S. Air force, the Idaho national guard, the U. S. forest service, Idaho state police, fish and game department, civil air patrol, Idaho department of highways, civil defense, amateur radio organizations, sheriff's office and others."

"It is a volunteer organization that makes no charge for any of its efforts. Members give their time as a humanitarian service, he said."

### Miller Hits Farm Policy Of Kennedy

WASHINGTON, Nov. 20 (AP)—Republican National Chairman William E. Miller yesterday attacked what he called the "new Frontier farm scandals" and said President Kennedy had failed to fulfill campaign pledges to farmers.

His statement coincided with a more general GOP attack charging the President with additional failures to carry out campaign promises.

Miller said the GOP Midwestern Regional conference at Minneapolis, Minn., Nov. 20, and 21 would provide "a full exposé of the New Frontier farm scandals" and show "the sorry state of agriculture under the Kennedy administration."

He said Kennedy had made campaign promises to cut federal farm outlays by two billion dollars below the Eisenhower program. Instead, he said, the cost of the federal farm program had risen by one billion dollars without any major cut in crop production.

Despite the increase in federal spending on agriculture, Miller said, average prices received by farmers are lower than last year and prices paid by farmers are higher.

The Minneapolis meeting will be the last of four regional conferences held by Republicans this fall in preparation for the 1954 election campaign. A southern conference was held this week-end at Atlanta, Ga.

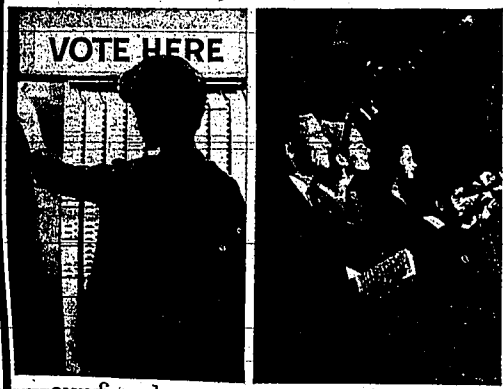
