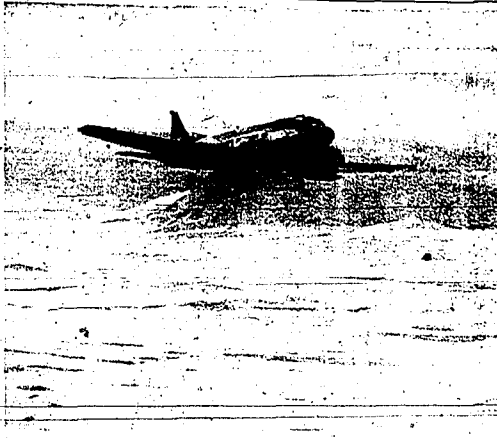

Servatius, a Cologne lawyer, said he plans to go to Lausanne to discuss with Eichmann the defense plea before the court delivers its sentence.

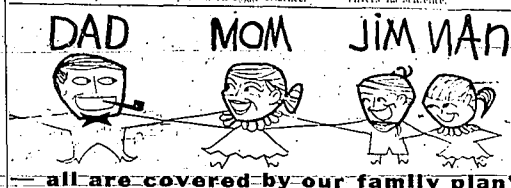

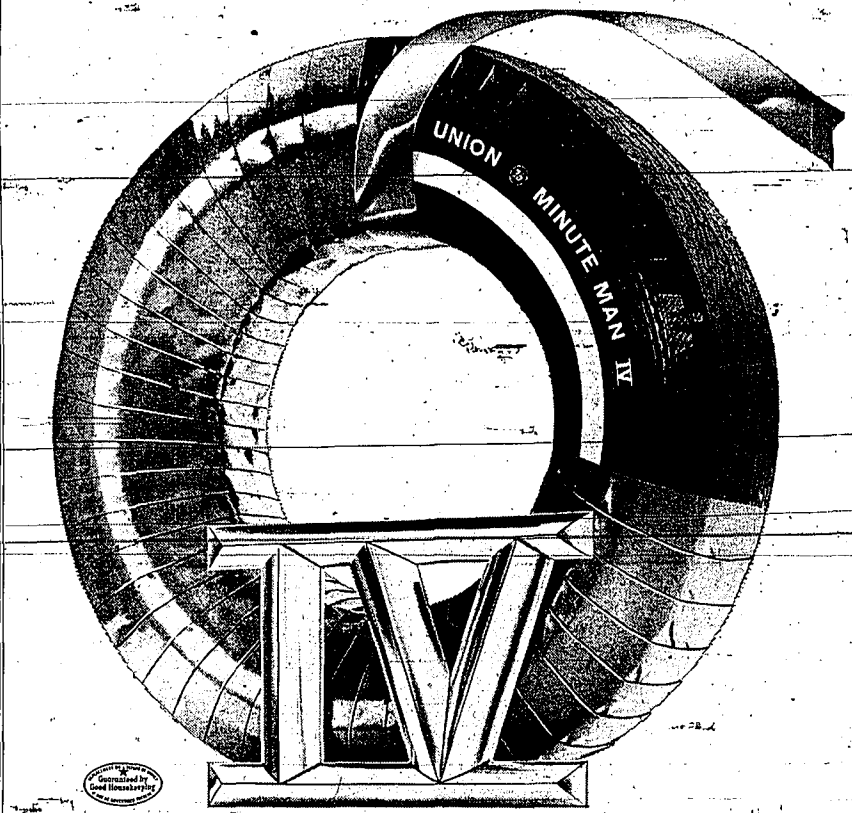

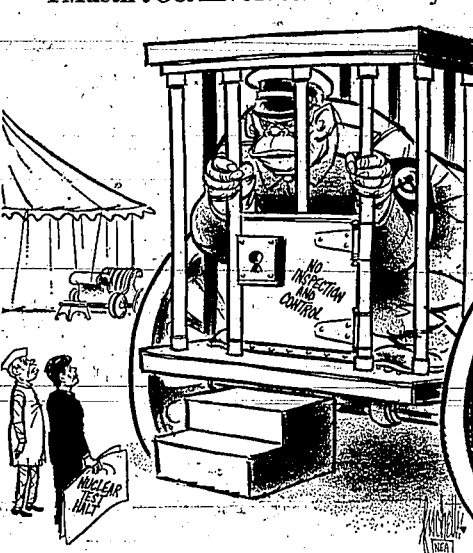

WASHINGTON, Nov. 28 (AP)—The air force has been evacuating its radar warning towers in the Atlantic ocean whenever a forecast warns of winds of about 27 miles an hour or more.

The policy is believed to stem from the collapse of one of the towers last January, although Air Force sources did not say so.

Standing in open sea, off New Jersey, the three-legged Texas Tower buckled during a violent storm and collapsed, dragging 28 men to their deaths.

The towers, part of the air-raid warning system, are designed to withstand winds up to 125 m.p.h. and 35-foot waves.

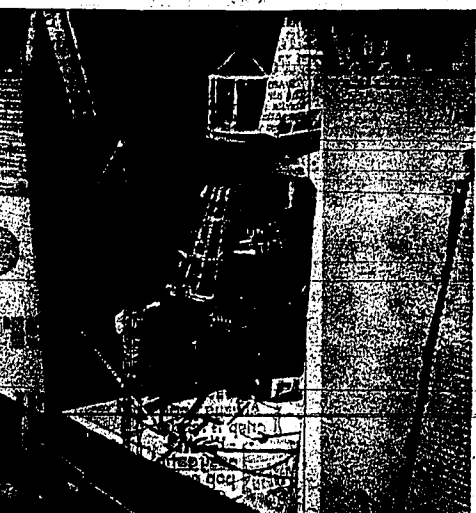

### Rockets Are Readied for Pacific Test

POINT MUGU, Calif., Nov. 28 (AP)—Rockets to be used as targets for the U. S. Nike Zeus anti-missile missile system were being loaded today in the Southwest Pacific this army announcement.

Officials said test firings which have been underway several weeks "will be a dual purpose—to check Nike Zeus radar installations on Kwajalein island, the largest land mass in the Southwest Pacific, and to track down targets in future tests for the Nike Zeus anti-missile system."

One of the rockets, a two-stage unguided missile, was fired successfully Nov. 15, from Fort Sumner Island, the army announced yesterday.

Nike Zeus missiles, known as the "missile killer," have been tested at this Pacific coast missile range base. It is designed to operate automatically in hunting down its target.

Officials said in future tests, large nose cones would be launched from Vandenberg air force base north of here and Nike Zeus missiles would be launched from Kwajalein to track down and destroy the nose cones.

### County's Poor Fund Figures To Be Sent to Congressmen

Twin Falls County Commissioner Russell C. (Bud) Larsen will submit poor fund figures to Idaho congressmen in support of his position for federal aid to the aged.

Larsen, a Democrat, said Monday he has had summaries of Twin Falls county expenses compiled and will send them to U.S. Rep. Ralph E. Harbo and Sen. Frank Church, both Idaho Democrats.

Church recently conducted hearings on problems of the aged in Boise, Pocatello and Spokane. Larsen testified at the Nov. 13 Pocatello proceedings.

"This is in addition to state funds," Larsen explained, "for old age assistance, aid to dependent children, the blind and totally disabled, and federal social security checks."

Larsen estimated total funds spent in Twin Falls county at two million dollars annually, of which the county spends roughly 25 per cent. (The total county poor fund is budgeted at \$214,700.)

Although Larsen went on record at the Pocatello hearings in favor of federal old age assistance, he insists it should be administered by the county.

"The commissioner draws a parallel between state school aid and suggested federal old age assistance. 'The problems differ in every county in the country,' he said, 'and it should be done just like school funds.'"

State school aid is distributed to each school board to be spent as the school board sees fit, the commissioner said.

Larsen's figures, compiled from county records, show medical expenses of \$150,054, or 71 1/2 per cent, and indigent expenses of \$33,013 or 18 1/2 per cent, of the \$187,326 expended by the poor fund during the first 10 months of this year.

The official estimated "most of this" was spent on aid to the aged—between 50 and 60 per cent of the total budget. County Commissioner H. & Coderholm, a Republican, agrees with Larsen's estimates.

For the final two months of 1961, \$21,700 remains of the allotted \$214,700 appropriation, or just under 10 per cent. Commissioner Chairman Henry Crow has pledged not to exceed this budget. The monthly average outlay has been \$19,220.

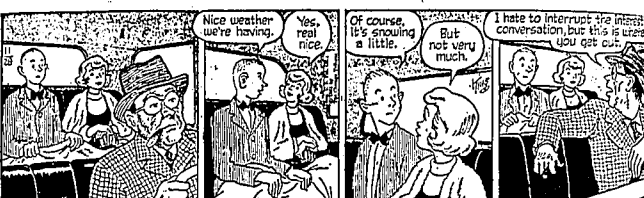

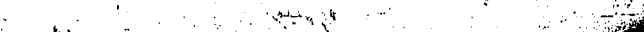

### Curacao Plans Hijack Trial For 5 Youths

CURACAO, Nov. 28 (AP)—Five pro-Castro youths who hijacked a Venezuelan airplane and were arrested here at airport here today, are to be tried in a court here on the Dutch West Indian island.

Authorities here were planning to invoke stern new anti-hijack laws passed as a result of a similar Venezuelan airplane theft some months ago.

The youths, armed with tommy guns and automatic pistols, were hustled away under guard on their arrival here yesterday. It was not immediately certain where they were being held.

The plane was allowed to continue its journey to the Venezuelan port of Maracaibo, its destination when it took off from Caracas yesterday. None of its passengers, including American citizen Henry Ross of New York and Walter Lambert of San Francisco, was notified by the hijackers.

The youths, armed with tommy guns and automatic pistols, were hustled away under guard on their arrival here yesterday. It was not immediately certain where they were being held.

Then they ordered the pilot to fly to Havana, but settled for Curacao when he said he did not have enough fuel to reach Fidel Castro's capital.

### Crackdown

SAN FRANCISCO, Nov. 28 (AP)—The Kennedy administration plans to take action against racketeers in the future, according to a top defense department official.

Walter J. Heller, assistant secretary of defense for civil defense, told western state government leaders here yesterday the administration has conferred with the federal justice department on the matter.

He said the government was considering the establishment of "minimal specifications" for a series of private home shelters. Visher added that a set of "improved" low cost private shelter plans should be available by Dec. 1.

### Colorado Gov. McNichols Asked to Halt Range War

SAN LUIS, Colo., Nov. 28 (AP)—Sheriff Reuben Navarro said Monday he would ask the governor to help him put an end to the long range war in southern Colorado's thinly populated Costilla county.

The sheriff conferred with Gov. Steve McNichols Monday. McNichols promised an immediate investigation.

"If something isn't done soon," the sheriff said, "people are going to be hurt, perhaps killed."

But one man already was in the hospital and three others were in jail following the latest outbreak in the long-summering feud over grazing and timber rights on a sprawling 75,000-acre ranch near the New Mexico border. Spanish-American land owners in the county have been at odds with the ranch's various owners off and on for years.

John W. Taylor, a former North Carolinian, bought the ranch a year ago for nearly a half-million dollars. The 36-year-old Taylor and two of his ranch hands, foreman Pervis Riley and Al Randall, were jailed after the latest renewal of the range war. The three were charged with kidnaping, robbery and assault.

The son of a nearby rancher, Gilbert Medina, 20, was hospitalized.

District Attorney John Smith said Gilbert, his 25-year-old brother, Eddie Medina, and another, Spanish-American, cowboy, Tom Rael, 20, accused Taylor's two ranch hands of pistol whipping the last Tuesday.

They also said Taylor later beat them with a wooden stake and that one of Taylor's men fired two warning shots at Eddie and said that "the next one will be right between your eyes."

Taylor said his men tracked the three after discovering a \$24,000 trailer stolen and a bulldozer shot full of holes on the ranch. The Medinas claim they were searching for a lost heifer.

But the dispute dates back as far as a Spanish land grant when Spaully still held the land. The grant permitted nearby settlers to graze sheep and gather wood on the site, known as the Sangre de Cristo land grant.

"People here always have considered they have rights to access on Taylor's land," the sheriff said. "But Taylor doesn't seem to think so. Personally, I am in the middle with the local people thinking I am pro-Taylor and with Taylor believing I harass him."

Taylor said he had never objected to people coming in to land to collect firewood or to hunt and fish.

"But there never has been free grazing," he said. "Some people here claim because they have grazed the land before they still have the right without paying for it."

Taylor said he wants to fence the entire ranch.

### Rocket Society Reports Success

TOPEKA, Kan., Nov. 28 (AP)—The Topeka Rocket Society—all teen-agers—successfully fired a white mouse an estimated 2,500 feet in the air Sunday and brought it back safely.

The firing was from an abandoned quarry west of Topeka with a rocket designed by Ned Nuz, 16. The ejection capsule opened on schedule and the mouse was parachuted to the ground. Winds carried it about half a mile from the launching site.

### World Council Communion Attracts Diversified Group

NEW DELHI, India, Nov. 28 (AP)—Some were barefooted. Some were in alien finery. There were New Zealand biologists, preachers from Togo and Switzerland, women in pink hats from Ohio. Slowly and solemnly, rank on rank they moved to a carpet spread on the ground before a holy cross and there they knelt and partook of a hallowed repast.

The words spoken were old but the atmosphere was new, as the most diversified congregation of Christians ever assembled joined Sunday in the Lord's Supper.

It was held according to Anglican rites and witnessed by most other branches of faith—Baptist, Presbyterian, Old Catholic, Reformed Lutheran, Methodist and others—took part.

The unusual service bringing various kinds of Christians together in their central act of worship was held as part of the general assembly of the World Council of Churches.

Officials said that while inter-denominational communions had been celebrated before at council gatherings never before had such a body of Christians from such a range of traditions and customs participated.

It also was the first time an Anglican communion open to all baptized members of the various churches was held in connection with the general assembly.

The service was conducted in a giant tent with chairs for pews. On hand for the event, either serving in the improvised chapel or filling forward to receive the bread and wine, were many of the ranking officials and prelates of the churches.
